As we approach Holy Week worship I would like to share with you a simple story I heard some time ago...

On a particularly windy overcast early spring day, a little girl stood at a window. The tears on her face looked like raindrops rolling down the window. Out in the back yard, past the garden, her daddy and big brother were burying her best friend---a puppy that had died.

Her grandfather came and stood next to her.

Gently he took her by the hand and led her to the other side of the house, to another window that looked out over the front yard over mom's flower garden. Kneeling next to the little child, grandpa pointed to a small flower that was just starting to come up through the soil.

And he whispered, "Little one, you've been looking out the wrong window."

I recently received a card from a woman in a parish I served in Pine Grove many years ago. She lost her husband to a heart attack a few months ago. She is struggling as she looks out the "back window" and tears stream down her face like rain in her life.

Someone just knocked on my door as I write this article for the newsletter. The person just wanted to talk. It's a story that I hear often. "Pastor, I'm depressed. I'm not happy. I cry a lot. Sometimes I think I'm going crazy and I really don't want to live."

On Easter morning the disciples expected to find Jesus in the tomb, for they were looking out the "wrong window." Easter, the Resurrection of our Lord, changed everything. It reminds us that with God all things are possible. Even to bring new life out of death. Life in Christ means a new perspective.

May you be blessed this Easter with a renewed perspective of life knowing our Lord's forgiveness, mercy, compassion and the "freedom that will make you free indeed."

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

FINANCES FOR JAN. 2008 REGULAR FUND:

Income: \$22,709.95 Expenses: \$24,994.21 Balance (-2,284.26)

Comment: Income is up by \$1,404.40 over last year or 6.5%. Initially that looks good! BUT... our budget calls for an increase of about 7.6%. We are encouraged to not only grow toward a tithe (10% or better) in our regular envelope giving but also redirect a share of our previous building gift to regular for increased ministries. Please don't just stick those Building Gifts of 2007 in your pocket. Consider that at least a part of those Building Fund gifts could support other ministries in the name of Christ. Yes, the building is a paid...now does it belong to us OR to work and ministries of Jesus Christ? hmmm?

DAFFODIL SUNDAY



Eighth Annual Nativity Open House Display

The Evangelism Committee sponsored the eighth annual nativity display on December 1st and 2nd. This was another successful year for the display. We had 350 nativities and wall hangings this year; this was the largest display thus far. We had over 400 people attend. Sadly, the ice and snow of Sunday prevented many people from coming (but we have been fortunate as this was the first time in the eight years of doing this that the weather interfered with the display). In the offering plate there was \$259.00, which was divided equally between Hope's disaster relief fund and the Northampton Food Bank.

New this year to our display was a program presented by Nick and Diane Seyfried; they used carols and dramatic readings to enlighten us with "The truth about Christmas-as seen through the eyes of the Shepherd." This was presented on Saturday evening after the Advent worship and had 72 people in attendance. A donation was given to the Seyfrieds for their ministry. The wrote a thank you note to the Evangelism committee thanking Hope Church for the invitation to share their ministry and also for the monetary donation given to them. They further stated that the donation given to them was later given to a family with several children in an attempt to make Christmas a little brighter because the father/husband had been killed by a drunk driver.

Thank you to the members of the Evangelism committee for all your hard work that is put into the annual display. Many hours are spent organizing this beautiful display. But also the annual nativity open house could not and would not be successful without the help and support given by the Hope Church family and community.

WE NEED YOUR HELP

The church, like ever other organization to which we belong, has rules we must follow if we wish to maintain our membership. Those rules are found in the constitutions of both the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and Hope



Church. You and I, and all other Lutherans, are required to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion <u>and</u> make a contribution of record at least once in each calendar year.

For Hope Church to maintain accurate membership records, you must do the following:

- 1) Receive Holy Communion <u>and complete a communion</u> <u>card at least once a year</u>. If you can't remember if you've done it previously in that year, do it again.
- 2) Make a contribution <u>of record</u> at least once a year. "Of record" means you must place your contribution in your giving envelope (or at least use your envelope number so we can identify and credit it to you). We can't credit a contribution of loose cash placed in the offering plate.

Parents and guardians are reminded that young persons who have been confirmed are members of the congregation to whom these provisions also apply. Please encourage and assist them in maintaining their membership.

Please note, if you have not done <u>both</u> of these two requirements you have been placed on the Inactive status list as of January 1, 2008. If you do not fulfill these two requirements you will be removed from the rolls as of December 31, 2008. Please call the church office with any questions.
