
### MEMORIAL BLOOD DRIVE

# FINANCES FOR JAN-FEB. 2008 REGULAR FUND: TH Income: \$46,001.32 Expenses: \$56.537.99 Balance (-5,897.63)

*Comment:* Overall regular Income is up by \$834.01 over last year or about 2%. Envelope giving is up by \$3,179.55 over last year or about 8%. Again, this looks good. BUT... our budget calls for an <u>overall</u> increase of 7.6%.

We are encouraged to not only grow toward a tithe (10% or better) in our regular envelope giving <u>but also redirect</u> a share of our previous building gift to the regular fund for <u>increased</u> <u>ministries</u>. Please consider giving a portion of those 2007 Building Fund Gifts to our regular fund this year. *Pastor Fisher said it so well at the mortgage burning service in November... "the building is paid...SO WHAT!?" We have a wonderful building...now we must continue to "grow" the ministries for the glory of Christ and HIS church.* 

We must also commit a portion of the Building Fund gifts of 2007 to the Building Fund in 2008. Major improvements and repairs are a continual concern...like the \$13,000+ heat pump we replaced during this winter season!

As always, your partnership is appreciated as we proclaim the Good News of Christ through the many activities and ministries at Hope Church!!




