(A summary of what I said to the congregation on Sunday, April 20th)

Last week, I spoke to the Congregational Council and mailed a letter to all active households announcing my retirement as of August 31, 2008. At hearing the news, some have asked about my health. It is good...at least that's what I feel and my doctor agrees.

So why retire? "It's time."

It's time.... after nearly 37 years as an ordained pastor...22 years here at Hope church...<u>and</u> admittedly some "weariness" at the often 50 + hour-weeks...*it's time*.

-Time ...to spend more time with my family who has been patient with me over these many years as I have gone off in the morning only to return from the church at 9-10 pm at night.

-Time to spend some time with my hobbies of sailing, reading, tennis and running (*OK*, so the running is shorter and slower these days!) *-Time* to have more control over the hours spent in "pastoring", supply preaching, teaching or other types of "part-time" work. *-Time*.... 




