The Northern Lehigh Valley Mission District has taken on the mission task of raising enough funds to build a house in Mississippi. Dean Gade has already sent a letter challenging each congregation to try to contribute \$1,000 towards the project.

UPDATE ON PASTORAL TRANSITION

It's been about two months since Pastor Kuntz announced his plans to retire at the end of August. The Congregational Council would like to give you some information about the process that will take place and what we have done so far.

The process to call a new pastor to Hope will take probably a year or more. During that time period Hope will have an interim pastor who, working with Ernie Siegfried, will continue to help us move forward with our mission as a Lutheran congregation.

In the fall, we will be looking for your help to complete a congregational survey which will help us with information about what you think the congregation's strengths and needs are and the type of pastor you believe will help to move us forward. This information will be gathered and given to the Synod Bishop's staff, which will put together a booklet for pastors who may be interested in a call to our congregation. Also, during this time period, a call committee will be appointed which will be charged with finding a candidate to present to the congregation for consideration as the next pastor.

Since Pastor Kuntz informed us of his decision, the Congregational Council has been meeting with Pastor Mary Gade, who is our Mission District Dean and is the synodical representative we will be working with through this process. We have also been in contact with the Synod staff, which will be working with us to assign an interim pastor. As of now, Council expects to interview an interim candidate sometime in July/August. Council would like the interim to begin at Hope in September and continue with us until the election of a full time pastor.

The members of Congregational Council appreciate the support we have received and ask for your prayers as we move forward in this very important process.
