# **DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME**



# FROM THE PASTORAL ASSISTANT

As this newsletter was being prepared, fall 2009 quietly arrived. How do you feel about the coming of fall? I know some persons who sink into a dark mood as the days shrink in length with darkness coming earlier each day. Someone recently said to me, "when fall comes, I feel like death is closing in on me."



Meanwhile, others seem to take the change of seasons in stride. I have to admit that I welcome fall as a season of spectacular sights, sounds that capture my attention, and miraculous changes.

Fall gets a "bad rap" as it is often thought of as a time of death in nature. A time when the earth becomes lifeless and dormant. That has never been my view of the fall season. I've spent the past several days in the mountains of North central Pennsylvania. There I was privileged to walk and sit quietly while observing and listening to the arrival of fall. I sat on a tree stump and listened to the chatter of several squirrels as they scampered noisily from tree to tree. In the distance, I heard the scream of a red fox and pictured it in my mind, pouncing on a small rodent in the grass. Hawks were gliding so gracefully, effortlessly it seemed, high above me. As I got up from my perch and began walking again crows called to announce my presence to all the animals. Then, as I broke out of the trees and into an open grass field, three deer snorted and bounded away. Energy and life was everywhere!

Nature is alive! "God is everywhere," I said aloud. How could anyone think that fall is a dead season?
