FROM THE PASTORAL ASSISTANT...

The Journey of Shame

Have you ever been thoroughly humiliated? I don't mean slightly embarrassed - I mean humiliated! Are you familiar with the play by Lorraine Hansberry, *A Raisin in the Sun*? It is about an African American family on Chicago's Southside. The father dies and leaves a small legacy in the form of an insurance policy worth several thousand dollars. The mother has had a life-long dream of buying a little bungalow for the family - a nice place they can finally call their own. That insurance policy represents the realization of her modest dream.

The son in the family has a dream of his own. He wants to take the money and start a business. After all, he has never had a decent job - not even an opportunity for one. Now, a friend has agreed to let him in on a deal, a "deal that can't fail". The son pleads with the mother to give him this one chance, the chance he has never had. You have probably already guessed how the story turns out. The mother gives in, although reluctantly. What mother would have done differently? His happiness is more important to her than her own, and so she gives him the money. He gives it to his friend, and his friend promptly skips town.

Now the young man is left alone with his family. His shoulders are slumped, his head is bowed low as he tells them that his friend and his money are both gone. His sister, Benatha, immediately rips into him. She screams at him and calls him names. In every way possible, she lets loose on him with contempt and scorn. When she finishes her tirade, the mother speaks: "I thought I taught you to love him."

Benatha shouted back, "Love him? There is nothing left to love!"

That must have been how the disciples and the friends of Jesus felt following his terrible beating and total humiliation. The disciples had forgotten Jesus' promise that he would come back to them. All they knew was that their Lord had been mocked, humiliated, and beaten like no one they had ever known before. And now, he was dead. There was nothing left to love.

But, Jesus could say the same thing about each of us. He has watched us travel our own journey of shame and humiliation. He understands our situation and is willing to lift us out of the darkness of shame into the light of eternal life. Thanks be to God!




