One of my delights in this life is children. I love their innocence – their spontaneity and their ability to make us keep things simple. Throughout my ministry I have made special efforts to welcome children in worship, invite them into my office to sample something from my candy jars and greet them as they walk through the hallways. I have found that, given the chance, it is often children who lead their parents to worship and to a more active life of faith.

Hope Lutheran is a unique family of faith because it includes such a large number youth. As a congregation we want to find ways to incorporate them fully into the life and ministry of the congregation. One way to do that is to have "family-friendly" worship that includes everyone in the family – children alike!

So...beginning September 12 we will be adding Children's Messages to our worship services. Our plan for now is to offer them at every service, which does not include communion. That means we will have a Children's Message every Sunday during the "Service of the Word." The Children's Message will occur after the readings and before the sermon and I hope that you will bring your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews up front to join Ernie or me for a lively discussion.

And I also hope that *you* join me in welcoming the children by helping them with worship books, offering them a smile of encouragement when they get antsy, singing the liturgy with them outside of church and being patient with



them – it takes time for them to feel comfortable in worship and be able to participate. I can't wait for September 12th!


BELL CHOIRS
