MEMORIAL GARDEN

Planning of Memorial Garden moves ahead---On September 13th, the Memorial Garden Task Force met with the Congregational Council and presented the plans for the project. A report on the results of the congregational survey indicated the following:

I think Hope should plan for a Memorial Garden YES: 71 NO: 7 UNDECIDED: 5

I would consider using a Memorial Garden YES: 57 NO: 15 UNDECIDED: 8

Questions concerning location, cost and funding sources, cost for use of the garden, burial practices, feedback from local funeral directors and others were addressed. Many hours have been devoted to this work by the members of the task force and outside professionals.

Following the presentation and discussion, the council expressed their appreciation and approved continuation of work on final details. The final plan will be presented at a special congregational meeting; on a date to be announced, to seek its' approval for construction.

If approval is given, it is anticipated that work on the garden will begin in spring of 2011.

Greetings from the Pastor...

Two years ago at a Northeastern Pennsylvania Bishop's Conference the presenters challenged congregations to do three things: 1) Be who we are; 2) see what we have and 3) do what matters.

Who are we – Hope Lutheran Church? We are a group of believers in Jesus called to take the gospel into our world. What do we have? We are blessed with caring people who want to serve, a beautiful facility for people to use and a desire to do God's will. What matters? Responding in the name of Jesus to the needs of people and our community as we see them arise.

One of the aspects of Hope Lutheran Church that appealed to me when I was interviewing here is our congregation's interest in doing ministry with our community. So when the Carbon/Lehigh Intermediate Unit approached me about hosting some special needs young people for their "Job Work Experience Program" I knew this was just another way we could partner with our neighbors.

On Monday, September 20th two students arrived for their first morning of work at Hope. They spent the time washing tables in Kuntz Hall under the instruction of their aid, who supervises them while they are working. Each Monday the same two students will be at Hope learning to do some basic tasks that may later transfer into meaningful work for them. And it may not stop there – we may be asked to host other students as well! What a great opportunity for us!

Providing the space and work for students to train in a "real" environment is just one way we are a community of care and missionaries of grace to the small world around us!

<u>WHY DO WE HAVE WATER IN THE FONT DURING</u> <u>COMMUNION SERVICES?</u>

During our baptism – no matter how young or old we were – the pastor dipped his or her finger in oil and made the sign of the cross on our foreheads saying the words, "you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever." It was a sign communicating the presence of the Holy Spirit and uniting us with Jesus. Even though we may not be able to see it when we look in the mirror, that cross is a permanent, indelible and eternally durable sign that reminds us we are a child of God. By dipping our fingers in the water and making the sign of the cross on our foreheads we recall that act from our baptism and remember that as God's children we are called to live as children of God -bearing witness to the world. In remembrance of your baptism you may wish to dip your finger into the water and make the sign of the cross on your forehead as you come forward for communion.

YOUTH GROUP

On Friday September 17, twenty-one youth members gathered and were separated into tribes to compete in various challenges against each other. The youth did not mind how difficult the challenges were even if it was attaching a bucket to their head while trying to catch ping pong balls or trying to move an Oreo placed on their forehead to their mouths without using their hands. All that mattered to them was trying to work hard and together in order to complete the tasks successfully.

The challenges all focused on the topic of discussion for the evening which was "Difficult Tasks." We all agreed we face difficult tasks in life and the only way to successfully complete the challenges was to listen to what God asks of us and have faith in what he says. After a fun night filled with team building games from spelling words out of tribe members' bodies to baking cakes without a recipe (yikes!), it was time for bed to wake up early to pick potatoes.

At 8:00am, 18 youth members hopped into the Hope church van and other vehicles heading for Zion Moselem ELC in Kutztown, PA where Walt and Linda Zawaski's potato farm was located. The Zawaskis welcomed the youth with open arms and smiling faces. After giving instructions on how to pick and bag potatoes, the group was split into pickers and baggers.

Most youth began their shift by picking the potatoes. Each youth received a bucket and followed a tractor which stirred the dirt to loosen the potatoes making it easier for us to see and pick them. Walt Zawaski drove the tractor for the most part, but he did let youth member, Garrett Kunkel, try it out. One youth compared picking potatoes to an Easter egg hunt. Krista Koropchak wanted to know how to distinguish between a potato and a rock. Luckily she figured it out.

Once the potatoes were picked and loaded into the back of a truck, they were then shipped to the bagging station where they would be sorted by good, rotten, and mini potatoes.
