On Saturday, November 13th, youth from all over Northampton County have been asked to help with a Pancake Fundraiser being held at the Applebee's on Nazareth Pike in Bethlehem Township. The fundraiser is to help raise money for the Karsan family, a family who lives in Northampton County who lost many of their possessions in a house fire in March and recently learned their young son has liver cancer. Thrivent is attempting to gather youth to help greet and seat guests, serve food, and clean up. The breakfast runs from 8:00am until 10:00am. Applebee's is providing food and cooks. 
#### **MILITARY ADDRESSES**
