Greetings from the Pastor.....

If you would ask people what their favorite season of the church year is, my guess is that most people would name Christmas or Easter. And why not? They are, after all, the high festivals of the church. They are the times when the church is filled with people – when choir anthems and special music fill the air – when we sing some of our favorite hymns or carols - when you see folks you haven't run into for a while because everyone comes out for Christmas and Easter.

If you asked me which season is my favorite, I would probably answer the Lenten season. Now that may not make sense to you because during Lent at Hope we have two additional worship services during the week and the planning and extra services during Holy Week – what pastor wants more work?!! Yet, there is something so spiritually important about taking the time and energy to focus on our relationship with God and Jesus. I know we should be doing that all the year through but the reality is that many of us don't and so Lent offers us that gift.

It is no coincidence that Lent usually begins in the dead of the winter when we long for the light and the warmth of the sun. We are tired of the short days and long nights, the barrenness of the trees and the persistent cold. Yet, when you think about it, it is during winter that nature takes the time to rest a bit and begin to nurture itself for new growth in spring.

What a wonderful image for our spiritual lives – to have a season where we step back a bit from the harried pace of the world and allow time for us to nurture our lives for new growth! And we don't have to do it alone. Because we have additional services we have the chance to nurture ourselves and grow with other people who are on the same journey – praying and worshiping and learning and opening ourselves up to the possibilities of the Spirit in our lives.

So this Lent, don't pass on this opportunity this Lenten season. Make it a priority in YOUR life to find time for mid-week

Lenten services. Make a commitment to yourself that you will walk through Holy Week being mindful of Jesus journey to the cross as you attend Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services. Sign up for a time to be present in the church during the prayer vigil which begins on Good Friday evening and extends through Easter Sunday morning. And give thanks that God continually seeks us in all aspects of our lives as we wait for our SON to shine on Easter morning.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Stewarding God's Gift of Time

Probably one of the finest lessons taught to me about time came from a wise and learned friend from Tanzania. As a part of our growing congregational partnership, we were able to spend time together as ordinary people learning from one another and listening deeply to what the other had to share. "You see, Pastor Tim" he would say, "in America you have watches, but in Tanzania we have time!" Implicit in his message was a critique of what he was seeing here in America—busy people with busy looking calendars, living very busy lives. Also found in his words was a call for a new look at life and the measuring of our days—time to live, laugh, mourn, dream, slow down and time to be. In that very moment, as I was basking in the glory of time standing still, I was equally convicted and blessed by my friend's words.

The Bible offers us a helpful distinction when considering the gift of time. In Greek, "chronos" time is quantitative, and has to do with framing the world in terms of minutes and seconds (a very American notion, I would say). "Kairos" time, however, is more qualitative in nature, framing the world in terms of events, special experiences and relationships—a much different way of keeping

time. After thinking on such things, I could not help but see how time is truly a gift from God. How will I, and other Christian parents, steward this gift with our children and teens?

Mark Matlock, executive director of <u>Youth Specialties</u> recently offered a workshop at a Recharge training event in the Twin Cities, in which he highlighted the term "timenomics" as the pressing issue for teens and family today. In short, time is the scarcest of teenagers' resources today, and so helping them understand time as a gift to be understood (e.g. chronos time vs. kairos time), valued and stewarded well, might be the best place for us to start as their mentors in communities of faith.

The late Herb Brokering once spoke of the family calendar as the "paper cross" that families are laying themselves down on every night. Although this expression may seem extreme, one look at the average family's calendar will have even the brightest mathematicians scratching their heads. As families today, in an avalanche of constant demands and a sea of endless information, how might we begin to steward God's gift of time well?

BECOME A FAIR HOUSING TESTER

The Fair Housing Council of Suburban Philadelphia (FHCSP) is in need of Fair Housing Testers to assist in uncovering housing discrimination in the Eastern PA region. FHCSP is a private non-profit organization that educates consumers and providers about Fair Housing laws and investigates complaints of housing discrimination in the City of Philadelphia and Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lehigh, Northampton, and Montgomery Counties.

Trained testers pose as home seekers and visit housing providers to collect information to assist with regional monitoring and investigations. Testers document their experiences objectively – attention to details and excellent writing skills are required. FHCSP

relies on fax and/or email to notify testers, set up scenarios, and submit tests. Qualified applicants will have access to a reliable form of transportation. Accepted applicants must attend a 3-4 hour training, permit FHCSP to conduct a PA state criminal background check, and complete a paid practice test. Testers are paid a small stipend (\$20.00 - \$90.00) for their efforts and are reimbursed for mileage, tolls, and postage.

HELPING VETERANS FIND JOBS

As it is everywhere in the country right now, the unemployment rate for veterans in the Lehigh Valley is significantly higher than it is for non-veterans. Project JOVE (Job One – Veterans Employment) has been created to help address this inequity. Project JOVE is a volunteer-run program designed to provide training for military veterans, especially recent ones, in every aspect of finding a job. The program consists of nine sessions, each dealing with a different aspect of the job-search, with time to address and practice each skill. Classes will include translating military job-skills into civilian ones, writing resumes and cover letters, interviewing successfully, and, most importantly, networking for life.

Project JOVE is an outreach of the Veterans Affairs Committee of the Lehigh Valley Military Affairs Council (LVMAC), and is reaching out to the community to help identify veterans who would benefit from attending these classes. There is no cost – JOVE is a service of the community in gratitude to our country's best. FEBRUARY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

- Council selected Bartush Sign company to create the new sign for our front lawn. Next steps are to approach the township for approval and make final decisions on the sign design.
- ❖ Pastor Mraz has begun a CD ministry to our homebound members. Copies of worship services are being sent to them on a regular basis to keep them involved in church although they can no longer attend. Council supports this ministry with the additional funding that may be necessary for CDs and postage.

The Press group of community papers reaches 64,000 people in Northampton, Bethlehem, Parkland, Catasauqua, Whitehall, East Penn, Northwestern, and Salisbury areas.
- Council approved a nut roll fundraiser for the Youth Group which will continue to assist them to earn funds to attend the National youth Gathering in New Orleans this July.


Celebrating Our Faith Through the Arts: the Psalms






