# Greetings from the Pastor.....

As I sit writing this article we have only two more mid-week Lenten services and then we will be rushing headlong into Holy Week. Starting with Palm Sunday and moving into the Triduum (the three days) which include Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday we walk our way through Lent to Easter Sunday morning. I really do love this season – it is filled with so many images, stories and good news!

Over the years I have noticed that lots of people don't take advantage of the wonderful opportunities for spiritual growth that Holy Week offers. So many folks I know come to church on Palm Sunday and symbolically wave their palms in praise of Jesus our Lord and go back to their daily lives forgetting that the greatest story ever told is being retold throughout Holy Week. And those same folks show up on Easter Sunday to celebrate Jesus resurrection without ever recognizing that Jesus had to have died in order to be resurrected. They skip right over the painful moments of his disciples betrayal, his trail, his beating and his death. And I wonder why that happens.

Maybe we don't intentionally make the time to hear the story again. Maybe we don't want to hear the painful parts. Maybe we just want to experience the high points of the Christian life and pass over the difficult ones.

But if you are one of those folks I mentioned above here's what you're missing....

- Jesus last supper with his disciples and the "first-ever communion"
- Jesus washing the feet of the disciples
- Jesus struggle in the Garden of Gethsemane where he wonders if this is the way it has to unfold
- Jesus arrest and trial and flogging


- Peter's denial of Jesus just as Jesus predicted
- Jesus journey to Golgatha to be hung on a cross
- Jesus death, the earthquake and the rending of the curtain in the temple
- Jesus' body being placed in a tomb and sealed

And how does this get celebrated during Holy week????

- Holy Communion and reenactment of foot washing on Maundy Thursday
- Stripping of the altar and covering the chancel in black
- Retelling of the story of Jesus death during Tenebrae (service of the shadows) on Good Friday
- Prayer vigil during the time Jesus laid in the tomb from Good Friday to Easter morning

So, you are invited to not just walk through Holy Week but to *LIVE* through Holy Week. You are invited to hear the stories, share the meal, experience the darkness and be stilled by the silence so that when you arrive on Easter Sunday morning the joy of the resurrection is even more joyful because you lived through it all.

# **STEWARSHIP CORNER**

# *Open Hands* Dwight Zscheile

What does it mean to live with open hands, rather than clenched fists? It is a simple gesture, isn't it? Open hands are ready to receive or to give. They are relaxed, but also vulnerable. Clenched fists are closed. You can hide things in them. They can be a formidable weapon. Clenching your fists requires energy and strain.

There is a story about a man who comes to Jesus with a big question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" He's a righteous man, a leader, an upstanding member of the community who has faithfully kept the commandments. Jesus looks at him and gives him an answer that he doesn't want to hear - go and redistribute your possessions to the poor.

Now, this is a challenging text on many levels. It makes me, for one, uncomfortable. Jesus seems to be suggesting here that following the rules of righteous behavior, epitomized by the Ten Commandments, is not enough. The Kingdom of God is about something deeper. It's about a reordering of relationships. As long as the rich man's things separate him from God and other people, they're a problem. Jesus is inviting him into a new kind of relationship with God and others. Now material things are not in themselves bad, of course. They're part of God's good creation. But following Jesus means holding worldly things lightly - not because they are evil, but because they aren't ours anyway. God entrusts them to us to manage.

The point at which the rich man stumbled, and where we often stumble too, is basing his identity upon his wealth and social status. When our identities are caught up in what we have, we mistake a deeper reality, that reality of being children of God within a household of generosity. We are created by the God of the universe to live generous lives. God lives with open hands. God gives freely to us, creating and sustaining everything that is, providing all that is necessary for human flourishing. God's hands are open in vulnerability to us, the vulnerability of an embrace that we do not always return, but sometimes reject. These are the open hands of the cross.

We are created in God's image to be givers. We are to live with open hands, receiving and giving, rather than closing off our hearts and hands from one another out of fear and scarcity. Jesus invites the rich man to accept a reality that will befall him anyway—you can't take your wealth with you into eternity. When you die, it all goes back in the box. We might as well start sharing it now so as to draw closer to our fellow humans in need.

How can we live into our identities as givers, as those who participate in God's generosity? Money and possessions, like anything else in our lives, are opportunities for spiritual growth - not things to be excluded from our spirituality.

How does this work? Over the years, giving has become one of the most important spiritual disciplines in my life. Like going to the gym or praying, there are some days in which I really don't feel like doing it. I get worried about money and have the impulse to clench my fist. But this is a practice I've committed to in response to God's generosity to me. I have not given away all my money and possessions; but giving away at least 10 percent of my income each year keeps me in closer relationship with God and those in need.

God has come to us in Jesus with open hands, wide open hands. May we open our hands and hearts in turn.

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




