Greetings from the Pastor...

The 2011 Annual Report is completed and is available to our membership. Copies of it are located on the table in the hallway by the large bulletin board. Which brings me to the point of this article...a few weeks ago one of our members asked me a question about that report – a question I was happy to answer. Here's what she asked: "How is it that we took in so many new members last year and yet our total membership declined in 2011?" Great question!

And here's the answer. Constitutionally our leadership is required annually to review the membership status of every member of the congregation to determine which members will continue as active members on the rolls and which members will be classified as inactive members. According to the constitution an active/voting member is someone who, during the current or preceding calendar year, has communed and has made a contribution of record to our congregation.

One of the jobs of the pastor is to make sure the congregation keeps accurate records of membership. Typically, on an annual basis, the pastor culls through the list of persons who have not met the constitutional requirements listed above and sends a letter to inform the person about his or her status. If a person has not communed and contributed for more than two years — and has no extraordinary circumstances (homebound members, for example) - that person is considered an inactive member of the congregation and moved to inactive status.

During the interim period after Pastor Kuntz left and I assumed the pastorate at Hope Lutheran, very few members were moved to inactive status. This means that since 2008 a number of people had not met the constitutional requirements of communing and contributing annually. At the end of 2011 we reviewed the list of

those persons and sent letters *only* to those who did not commune and contribute in 2008 and 2009. A letter was sent to those individuals that included this wording: "Our review of the congregation's records indicate that for the past two years you have not fulfilled the constitution's requirement to commune at least annually and to make a contribution of record – we do not have a record of communion and a contribution of record for you since 2008. This means that we will be moving your membership to our inactive rolls. If this record is in error, please help us to correct it by calling the church office or by emailing us at office@hopecherryville.org."

The number of people moved to inactive status because they had not communed and contributed since 2008 totaled 85 people. Add to that the people who transferred out of the congregation, and those who were deceased and the members moved to inactive status totaled 134. So although we received 78 people that number was offset by those who became inactive for one reason or another.

This same process will happen at the end of this year as we "catch up" with amending our membership rolls to accurately reflect our real numbers. This is one of the reasons it is very important to check the "Communed today" block of the Hope Hospitality Pads and make sure you either use your offering envelope or record your envelope number on the check or pew envelope when you make a contribution. So thank you for asking the question because it gave me the opportunity to explain this process more thoroughly to our members!

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Could've, should've, and would've ... but didn't Nikole Jackson

It is a depressing day when your day doesn't actually begin until somebody, anybody, takes the initiative to speak to you—or, at the least, notice your presence. Imagine what it would be like to be completely invisible: unseen, ignored and entirely disregarded. Personally, I don't know what this feeling is like—I have only observed it.

I have seen people turn their noses down at the people that need us the most: the helpless and the sick—many of whom are categorized as "the homeless." Are they homeless because of the decisions and mistakes they have made? Maybe. But who are we to add to their punishment? And what if they are homeless because they are sick? Or what if they were that child who was born into a bad family, never having a chance and never knowing how to rise above?

While they are in front of the grocery story, on the side of the freeway, on the bus or even in a fast food restaurant trying to stay warm, I have never stopped to ask these questions. I never thought about all the reasons why they are in the situation they are in—until recently.

Could've, should've, and would've ... but I didn't. It was a rainy day (of course) and I was sitting in the car watching a blind old man trying to cross the street. He couldn't feel the edge of the sidewalk with his white cane, and he had no idea that the walk sign was on.

He stood there; totally clueless that he could cross. I said to myself, "Somebody should help him," so why wasn't I that somebody? I easily could have helped him, and I would've ... but I just didn't. Could've, should've, and would've ... but I didn't.

On another day, I was at KFC with my grandma for at least an hour and a half just talking ... and eating. The whole time I was there, there was another old man with the worst cough. I felt really bad for him as I watched him cough and cough, and order free water again and again in order to stay inside and warm for just a little longer. I said to myself, "I should offer to buy him a hamburger or something." So why didn't I? I had the money, I had the idea, so I could have helped him, and I would have ... but I just didn't.

As we were leaving I went back up to get a drink holder. I saw the old man getting up so I thought he was just ordering another water cup; I was wrong. He came up to me, shook my hand and then wished me a happy new year. After I wished him the same, he smiled the kindest smile and went out into the cold. In a novel by Deb Caletti, she wrote, "I thought I might cry, the way you do when someone gives you some kindness when you most need it but when it seems the most surprising thing." That is how I felt, but I didn't really need the kindness. He did.

Both of those men are real people, with real lives and real stories that I could have been a part of. Every time I am at that intersection I think of the blind old man and every time I am at KFC I think of that sick old man. I completely disregarded their helplessness, even though their neediness was so obvious. What are the chances I will ever see them again or get a second chance at helping them?

Every day, we walk past tons of people and that could be our one and only chance to let them know that we see them—that they aren't invisible. It could be the only opportunity we have to get to hear their stories.

Caletti describes, "Cars all jammed up along the road and a light turns red and someone honks. In every one of those cars there is a story or a hundred stories. For every light on in all of those huge city buildings there is a story." We could, we should and we would ... but we just don't. We don't stop to talk to these people, to ask them about their day—even a simple smile can mean the most. We all make mistakes, so who am I—no, who are we—to discriminate against these less fortunate people when we have no clue what their stories are. Martin Luther King Jr. wanted equality: race, ethnicity, religion and age. So rich or poor, our story is no better than anyone else's.

My personal experiences have opened my eyes to an issue that has been concealed. Dr. Robert Anthony once said, "Waiting is a trap. There will always be reasons to wait. The truth is, there are only two things in life, reasons and results, and reasons simply don't count."

I am not waiting any longer. I had no reason not to help those old men and I could've, should've and would've ... but just didn't. They helped me. They helped me realize that saying "could've, should've, would've" is only stating our regrets. I will not allow myself to regret such situations again. So now I am saying, "I can, I must and I will go as far as I need to for them to know that they are seen."

SUNDAY WORSHIP AUDIO CD'S AND VIDEO DVD'S

"I was sick and you took care of me ..."

In the course of visiting the shut-in members of our congregation one of the things that I often hear is "Oh, how I miss going to Church." Coupled with that often is the statement "I haven't even heard our Pastor preach."

Those who are home bound or confined to Nursing Home care are often the very ones for whom the Church was an important part of their life. Attendance at worship on Sunday was a high-point of their week. Now, due to physical limitations imposed on them by age, illness or weakness of body, they are no longer able to be part of the worshiping community. To make them part of our Worship we have

our Eucharistic Visitors program in our congregation. The faithful and dedicated members of this team are the following: Kim Belletti, Larry and Kathleen Creyer, LeAnn Chandler, Linda Derr, Kris Doncsecz, Sharyn Kratzer, Betty Krupa, Jean Leibenguth, Helene Mery, Georgia Mohrey, Cathy Moore, Kay O'Donnell, Bruce Schnabel, Vicki Steiner, Loretta Weil, Margaret Zimmerman, and John S. Zmyewski. These persons give of their time to bring the Eucharist to our Shut-ins. Through this act they make it possible for the shut-ins to receive spiritual strengthening of the Eucharist and thus be part of our church at worship. For their ministry, all the rest of us, owe them our thanks. In our place, they fulfill the congregation's responsibility to do as the Lord expects of all of us do, as he says in Matthew 25:36: "... I was sick and you took care of me, ..."

We did try to make it possible for our home-bound to hear the worship through recorded audio tapes. For that work we extend our thanks to Barbara Tobisch who diligently recorded them on Sunday and then made a few copies for the home-bound.

Recently we have decided to expand this ministry even further. We are now making it possible for our Shut-ins and home bound to be part of worship by being able to not only listen to the Sunday Worship but also to be able to see the beauty of festive moments in our Church. We are now recording our Sunday Worship on Compact Audio Discs and video recording services like our recent Holy Week and Easter worship. Larry Creyer, Richard Saffron and Timothy Lockard, are those who do the work of this recording.

The majority of our homes now have the capability to listen to the audio and view the video recordings. And if they do not, then we can even provide the means by which the home-bound can at least listen to the audio recordings. This is now possible through a generous donation of playback equipment provided by of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes of Liberty High School in Bethlehem.

This donation was made possible through Cathy Moore. For this we extend our thanks to them and to Cathy. This is one of the ways that we make it possible for us to help the home-bound be a part of our Sunday Worship.

But each one of us can now benefit from this ministry to the homebound. As our members have learned of this ministry, I have had a number of them ask if it is possible for them to also obtain these recordings. The answer I was happy to give them is, "Yes, we can give you a copy of the audio or video recording." We have a donated high speed CD copier with which we can make as many copies as we need. All we need to know is which ones a person desires. To make it possible for any of our members to order copies, our Web Master, Tom Perry has set up an Email Order link. 

SUMMARY:

Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of March by \$2,259.18, and for the year 2012, income exceeded expenses by \$8,993.17, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$60,584.21. Last year the net income for the same period was \$7,327.65 with a balance of \$14,238.34.

Budget Comparison—Total Regular Fund Budget for 2012 is \$373,622.00. 13/53 of that figure is \$91,643.13. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the three months were \$87,315.60. So, we are behind budget by \$4,327.53.
