Greetings from the Pastor....

Just the other day my husband, Mitch, and I decided to take a hike on the newly created trails in the Lehigh –Trexler Game Preserve. It was a beautiful day - sunny with a nice breeze - and we were excited about setting off for the first time. The first thing we did was to grab a trail map so we could track our journey. I noticed right away that this was not going to be easy. There are 13 different trails listed and other icons on the map key that should help with orienting oneself - but it was extremely complicated at first glance to discern which route to take and where we would end up.

We decided to just start hiking and turn around and follow the trail back if we couldn't figure it out as we went along. With map in hand we ventured forth! About ½ hour into our trek we realized that even with the map the trails wound around, intersected and sometimes came to a dead end. Looking for familiar landmarks we kept moving along – trusting that we would find our way – and eventually getting off the trails completely and taking a road we knew would lead us back to our car. We didn't do very well with the trail map as our guide!

As we walked and walked I couldn't help thinking how this little hike reminded me a lot of our lives. We have, in our minds, the map of our lives and we use that to set our course. The problem is that lots of things get in the way and we veer off course – we lose the right path – we need to be redirected – we wander and wander without getting anywhere. And, to be honest, most times we rely on ourselves to do all this – trusting that we will figure it out.

There is another way to approach the map of our lives though. Instead of thinking we have to decipher the map key ourselves - instead of relying on our own map-reading abilities - instead of trying to figure it all out on our own — it would be most helpful to have God as a part of the mix. This is not to say that we'll never

have bumps in the road or walk into dead ends. But with God as our guide we have someone to walk the journey with us. We have someone who will guide us and redirect us when we get lost. We have someone in whom we can place our trust – knowing that God's desire for us is to live lives that are full and abundant. Truth is...if there is one compass we need it is not the one we carry in pockets – it is God. With God as our "true north" we know we are always headed in the right direction.

So next time you hike be sure to look at the map if you have one and carry a compass. Next time you do some life-planning be sure to look to God for wisdom, discernment and direction because God is the only compass you'll need!

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Following Jesus

Matthew 6:25-33 Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life...But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches the crowds and his disciples about their relationship with God and their discipleship in the world. In these verses, Jesus speaks about how God provides for our every need and how undue concern for our possessions can get in the way of our living as his disciples.

These words speak to us today as we wrestle with the daily realities of our lives. We often find ourselves over-scheduled, over-extended, and over-drawn. Our lives are cluttered with too many commitments, too many possessions. We can be consumed by it all—we wonder "Will I have enough?" We fear not wearing the right clothes, not driving the right car, not having the latest electronic toy,

not living in the right house. Too often our things define who we are. Jesus comes to us in the midst of our fears and announces—
"Do not worry! God has provided for all of your needs!" What does it mean for us to live in relationship with Jesus? How might our daily discipleship help us to live more simply, trusting in God's abundance?



in case of a problem, and will save valuable time should a need arise when personal information is needed. To ensure a child's safety, law enforcement officers highly recommend that children carry child ID cards. Take advantage of the opportunity on June 9 for the "free" Child ID.

SUMMARY:

Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of April by \$17,516.08, and for the year 2012, income exceeded expenses by \$26,509.25, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$78,100.29. Last year the net income for the same period was \$18,993.56 with a balance of \$25,904.25.

Budget Comparison—Total Regular Fund Budget for 2012 is \$373,622.00. 18/53 of that figure is \$126,890.49. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the four months were \$129,919.33. So, we are ahead of budget by \$3,028.84.

- Council discussed progress on two of the emphases that came out of the 2011 visioning event Confirmation ministry and Young Adult involvement. Both areas are places that will need continued support and development
- Mutual Ministry committee presented a job description for another full-time pastor which was reviewed and approved.
- The synod has given Hope the name of a potential Assistant Pastor candidate. Council worked on developing a list of names to be contacted for a call committee to begin the interview process with this candidate.
- The new church sign will be installed by the week of May 21st.
- Property committee is currently receiving bids for new carpet and painting in Hanson Hall.
- The youth group held a successful Mother's Day buffet. The proceeds from it will be used to fund the trip to the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans this July. Many thanks to the people who volunteered and those who supported the buffet by purchasing tickets. There is one more fundraiser scheduled before the trip.
- Usual Summer worship hours will begin on June 10th and run through Labor Day weekend. Worship hours will be 8:00 AM and 9:30 AM during that time.
- The performance date and times for our musical "Godspell" Sunday June 3rd at 10:30 AM and 2:00 PM at the Roxy Theater. Tickets are needed but there is no charge for them.

Special Gifts Make a Difference

In February the Synod Council wrestled with the realization that the synod faces a \$200,000 shortfall in our income this year. This meant an



immediate cut in our support of ministries of the wider church and the prospect of staff cuts in the near

The synod council and Bishop Zeiser both wrote to rostered leaders and congregations about this situation. The response has been wide-spread and supportive. At meetings of rostered leaders across the synod, concern was expressed that the ministry of the synod needed to be

Special gifts have arrived at the synod office, over and above the mission support commitments already made. One congregation reflected on the words they had just read from Acts: "Everything they owned was held in common . . . it was distributed to each as any had need." That congregation sent an immediate gift and pledged a special offering. Another wrote, "We value highly the work we do together in the name of the Lord, and it is painful for us to know that many of our vital shared ministries are in jeopardy." Yet another donation was accompanied with the prayer "that our important work of Christ may continue with



vigor and spirit, and that our gift may help make a small difference to the witness and service of the

These gifts have totaled over \$7,000. Of course, that doesn't solve the problem, but it does

encourage us. We give thanks for all of the rostered leaders. congregations, and individual members who are the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, who make our ministry together possible, and who help us discern what matters

most and what God is calling us to do.
