

Greetings from the Pastor.....



When I was a young child, two Lutheran congregations in my home town came together to offer Vacation Bible School. One of the members of the congregation ran a bus company and he would drive

his bus around and pick up all the kids who could not walk to VBS. I lived pretty far from the church and so I rode the Bible School bus for many years. It brings back such fond memories whenever I think about it and I realize now how much of an impact the program and the people had on my life.

Well, we just finished up a week of Vacation Bible School here at Hope. It was a jammed-packed, funfilled, faith-forming week for everyone who attended and everyone who helped! We hosted 227 children and had over 100 volunteers present to make the program flow smoothly. During the week we collected over 1700 pounds of food for the Northampton Food Bank and over \$700.00 to assist the 1 ½ year old great-granddaughter of one of our members who is undergoing chemotherapy for leukemia. And...almost ½ of the children who attended were not members but came from the surrounding community! Many, many thanks to Kathy Ziegler and Jen Ventura who coordinated this wonderful ministry.

All this got me to thinking how precious these children who attended VBS are to us and to God. As I went through the week I couldn't help but think how children are works in progress--works of art, if we allow them to be so and help them to be so. Spending time with them – REALLY listening to them – sharing our faith with them is so important.

It is remarkable how much effect our sharing of positive energy can have on others. It's amazing to see how another human being can feel so much better when they receive positive input from us. The way that we treat children is part of our contribution to the world – so I try to keep in mind that my encouragement and praise can have a much broader effect than just making a child feel good for the moment--it can add a sense of confidence and self-respect to that child's emotional development that can never be taken away.

So thank you, members of Hope Lutheran Church, for seeing the need and the impact that a wonderfully creative VBS can have on a community. I am convinced that when we give sincerely out of love--unconditionally, without expectations of return--then we can truly contribute great things to our community and to the lives of young people in our midst!

Finding items for a different food group each day was surely a challenge. The daily totals were, 344 pounds of bread/cereals, grains; 426 pounds of fruit items; 479 pounds of vegetable items; 224 pounds of dairy items; and 258 pounds of protein/meat items for a grand total of 1731 pounds. That's an average of almost 8 pounds of food per child who attended vacation bible school! A tremendous thank you to everyone that made this possible. Those families who are served by the Northampton Area Food Bank are very grateful for your thoughtfulness and giving spirit.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS FOR JULY 2012

- Council approved the updated job description for the Treasurer.
- The Memorial Garden Committee will be meeting with the Lehigh Township Board of Supervisors on Tuesday, July 17th in a public hearing regarding the appeal to construct the Memorial Garden.
- A "Work Day" has been scheduled for Saturday, August 11th from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM to complete outside yard work – shrub trimming, cleaning up the beds, weeding, etc. Anyone who can help for any portion of that time period is encouraged to come.
- The congregational trip to view the Dead Sea Scrolls at the Franklin Institute has been scheduled for Saturday, September 8, 2012. The cost will be \$50.00 for adults and \$45.00 for children under 12 and will include the cost of the bus, entrance into the Franklin Institute and snacks. Lunch will be on your own. The tentative schedule is departure from Hope parking lot at 8:30 AM and returning around 5:30 PM. The sign-up sheet in on the bulletin board in the hallway near the church office.
- Council approved the recommendation from property to repaint and re-carpet Hanson Hall.
- The HVAC unit in Kuntz Hall was replaced in July. The old unit failed again and the decision was

made to replace rather than to repair it. The cost for the project was approximately \$15,000. The money came from the building fund. Council encourages members to remember to use the section of their envelopes labeled "Building Fund" to make contributions to this area of ministry.

- The call committee continues to move forward in our process to call an Assistant Pastor for our congregation.
- Social Ministry Committee will hold the annual "Senior Birthday Party" on Saturday, August 18th at 11:30 AM. Lunch and entertainment are provided to all who attend.
- Although finances continue to be in the black, council reminds members that we often hit a "summer slump" when people are vacationing and not in worship. Please remember to send your envelope when you are away or double up the next week! And many thanks to the congregation for their financial support.

SUMMARY:

Expenses exceeded income in the Regular Fund for the month of June by \$5,175.05, and for the year 2012, income exceeded expenses by \$17,216.72, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$68,822.76. Last year the net income for the same period was \$6,385.33 with a balance of \$13,306.02.

Budget Comparison--Total Regular Fund Budget for 2012 is \$373,622.00. 26/52 of that figure is \$186,811.00. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the six months were \$174,314.41. So, we are behind budget by \$12,496.59.


