

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR.....

From Pastor Jami Possinger



So...it's confession time. I don't watch a lot of TV but one of my favorite shows is "Dancing With the Stars." I got hooked on it the very first season. You could even say that I am an aficionado of the show. Now to be honest —

because of evening meetings I don't really get to see it every week – actually I don't see it most weeks. But when I do I am enthralled by these people, who are mostly celebrities of some sort, who learn how to do some of the most complex ballroom dances.

What is it about this show that captures my attention and time? It's people who move out of their comfort zone to try something that is demanding - both physically and emotionally – people who put themselves on the line to be cut because they are not the best of the best – and the way the whole cast seems to support everyone no matter their level of ability. But the thing I admire most is that these famous people, who so often are the leaders in their respective lives, become the followers of the professional dancers. In a dance couple, one person must lead and the other must follow – a difficult task for some!

And that makes me think of our lives as disciples and the church. Every one of us is called to be a disciple, a follower, of Jesus. Innately that means that Jesus is our leader and as we dance the discipleship dance with him – we follow his lead. And we are not the only ones dancing! There is a whole myriad of people who opt to join together as we serve in Jesus name.

Here's the thing though.....there are so many competing forces in our lives and in the world that are vying to lead the dance in place of Jesus. Money, fame, peer pressure, sports, family, friends, jobs, health, leisure time – they are just a few that are trying to cut Jesus out of the lead role. So how do we handle it – how do we keep Jesus as our dance partner?

I really watch the dancers in the show and here's what I notice....when they are in a hold – they hold on tightly to each other - allowing their bodies to move almost as one. And when they break their hold they are never far from each other and always move toward each other and into a dance hold again. Doesn't that sound like our relationship with Jesus? Don't we move in and out of holds with him - always coming back so that we can remember to move as one? Isn't that why the church is really vital to our faith lives? The church - Sunday morning worship, opportunities to serve, prayer chains, education, bible study – give us the chance to come together to experience Jesus – to allow Jesus to lead us - communally and individually - so that we can dance into the world in his name.

I will never appear on "Dancing With the Stars" but every day I am given the opportunity to dance with Jesus. So are you!

ASSISTANT PASTOR'S WORD..... From Pastor Paulette Obrecht



As I look out the window in my office, I am reminded that spring is a time of renewal. The grass has become green. There are buds on the trees and robins sitting on their branches.

Spring also reminds me that I need to take time for renewal myself and become better at practicing my spiritual disciplines. I have to admit that one of the habits I continually struggle with is setting aside time for devotions and prayer. In Luke, Jesus told his disciples to "pray always" and the apostle Paul advised that we should pray without ceasing.

I remember speaking with a classmate in one of my Seminary classes who is a Christian brother de la Salle. He talked about living in the brethren's house on the campus of LaSalle University in Philadelphia, where their day is divided according to worship and work times. They have several specific times each day that are devoted to personal and intercessory prayer. When we had a class together, he told all of us how the brothers prayed daily for each person in *Continued on Page 4...*

our class. I was amazed at that. It felt good to know that someone was praying for me, but I was envious that someone could find the time to do that – several times daily. But, Brother Tom said to me, "Well, that's what we do."

My friends have often heard me say that the place I seem to pray most frequently, other than in church, is in my car. At those times — on my way to and from appointments or work — my tiny car becomes my "prayer chamber" and I have great conversations with God. Sometimes, you'll see my lips moving and my hand gesturing, not because I'm crazy or on my cell phone, but because I'm talking — praying — with God. Sometimes, I'm not only focusing on my driving, but I'm also listening for what God might be telling me.

An article I once read said that unceasing prayer actually means having a constant consciousness of God's presence with us as we go about the tasks of our daily lives, our ordinary activities. The writer suggested that we get in the habit of noticing God's presence and using these opportunities to speak with God. For instance, in the shower, why not pray "Create in me a clean heart, O Lord." And as you're brushing your teeth in the morning, take time to ask God to help you speak kindly through the day. As you get ready for your important meeting at work, ask that the Holy Spirit be with you as you serve God through your vocation.

This year, May 2 is designated as a National Day of Prayer. Such a day is a good occasion to remember that God is present with us all the time – and that we can have profound or simple conversations with God wherever we are. It's always a good time to pray – without ceasing.

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." – I Thessalonians 5:16-18

Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of March by \$11,354.41, and for the year 2013, income exceeded expenses by \$478.05, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$89,168.66. Last year the net income for the same period was \$8,993.17 with a balance of \$60,584.21.

Budget Comparison—Total Regular Fund Budget for 2013 is \$413,068.00. 13/52 of that figure is \$103,267.00. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the three months were \$100,560.27. So, we are behind in income by \$2,706.73.

LEAVE A LEGACY

Have you given much thought about the Legacy you would like to leave after you join the Church Triumphant? Even with uncertainty about the future, you can and should make plans about your estate especially if you want charitable gifts to be part of your estate plan.

There are many ways to make a gift that does not jeopardize your financial wellbeing. For instance, the most used gifting method is a will. Eighty percent of the gifts received by congregations come from estates via a will. However, 60% of the people who die each year die without a will. Furthermore, less that 10% of the Lutherans who die each year remember their congregation in their will. The beauty of a will is that it does not require that you give up any of your assets while you are alive. The cost to write a will is minimal and a will is changeable if your charitable interests change. The place to start is by having a conversation with your pastor, an ELCA Charitable Gift Planner, and of course your attorney.

Another easy way to make an estate gift, which does not affect your current financial situation, is changing the beneficiary statement on an insurance policy, IRA, 401k, 403b, other retirement accounts and/or investment accounts. Simply call the plan administrator or account manager and ask for a change of beneficiary form. Generally, there is no cost to make this change. IRA, 401k, and 403b accounts create an ordinary tax liability for the inheritor of these accounts. So, using them to make charitable gifts can save on taxes for those who will benefit from your estate. For more details about how you can structure your estate to save your beneficiaries taxes, contact and ELCA Charitable Gift Planner for the details.

There are other ways to arrange your estate to make charitable gifts including gifts that may increase your income. It all depends on your financial situation, the assets you have, and the ministries you want to support. A good place to start is to have a conversation with an ELCA Charitable Gift Planner. ELCA Charitable Gift Planners are not advisors nor do they have anything to sell. However, they can provide you with information and the appropriate questions to ask your legal and financial advisor to help you support the ministry of your congregation or other ministries of the church.
