

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR... From Pastor Jami Possinger



It started even before Halloween this year – before the costumes and the jack o'lanterns and the trick or treat candy. It started before Thanksgiving – before the turkey and the cranberry sauce

and the pumpkin pie. Every year we seem to see it coming earlier and earlier. What is it? It is the visible preparations for Christmas.

At the rate we are going it won't be long before we never even take down the Christmas decorations because we'll be getting ready for Christmas in January! I know that we, who work for the church, often bash the secular preparations for Christmas – seeming like Scrooges in the midst of joyful shopping frenzies. And I also know that whatever we say, we will not change what is happening outside the church when it comes to Christmas. But I do know that we have something to say anyway. Because the world needs to hear the Christmas story – and we need to prepare to tell it. That is why Advent is such an important time of the church year.

The word Advent derives from a Latin word for "coming." These four weeks, which actually begin the Church year, are set aside to prepare for both the birth of Jesus and also for his final coming in power and glory. Although Advent is not a mini-Lent, it is a time for self-examination and setting aright those things that call us away from following Jesus. We are particularly called to focus on receiving the Christmas gift in humility and wonder.

In Isaiah 40:3 we read, "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." In Isaiah's era, the coming of a king was announced ahead of time and people literally leveled the road on which the king would travel, getting the rocks out of the way and smoothing the path where it was not level. Notice that Isaiah says to do this in the wilderness and in the desert – in all the places of our lives, not just the ones frequently traveled. Preparing for the coming of our King means dusting out and opening up our entire lives to receive him. We spiffy up the church during December to prepare for those who will visit on Christmas Eve. But how do we prepare ourselves - our souls and bodies - to receive the gift of the Christ-child? Are you ready for some suggestions? This year.....

- Take time to worship Midweek services will be held on Wednesday evenings, December 4, 11 and 18 at 7:00 PM, Sunday mornings at 8:00 and 10:30 AM and Christmas Eve at 4:00, 6:00, 8:30 and 11:00 PM
- Take time with family The best gift you can give each other is your time and your selves. The rest can be bought at a store and isn't anywhere near as meaningful!
- Take time for prayer God wants to hear from you and you need to hear from God.
- Take time to serve others This doesn't have to take all your free time. A batch of cookies for a lonely neighbor, a bag of groceries for the local food bank, a letter to a service person, a blanket for the homeless. Set the example for your children or grandchildren by including them too!
- Tell the Christmas story Don't let the story become lost in the glitter and the lights. Be the light that shines in the darkness by sharing the incredible tale of a God who wants so much for us to know what he is like that he came among us to show us – to guide us – to save us!

This year... celebrate Advent before you celebrate **it** – Christmas I mean!

Advent entered our lives so suddenly this year. Maybe, it's because it

begins so soon after Thanksgiving (which is later than usual this year). It could also be that the weather seems too warm to be thinking about the shorter days and longer periods of darkness which signals to us that winter is coming. So, Advent has arrived suddenly and now we are expected to wait. In Advent we are called to wait for the coming of God and God's kingdom. Advent also reminds me that most people are not very good about waiting. We live in a world of immediacy: instant messaging, instant gratification, instant replay. I once found an article on developing patience so we can become better at waiting. It was entitled, "Give me patience, but hurry it up."

Waiting is often hard for me. One place I've learned about waiting, though, is in my garden.

I dig the ground. I fertilize it. I plant the seeds and water them. Then, I have to wait. I have no choice. No amount of impatience will make the plants grow faster. And, you have to be prepared for anything: too much rain, not enough rain, insects, rabbits and deer, weeds, the neighbor's cat.

I wait and hope for a harvest that I can neither see nor control.

Maybe, that's why Jesus often talked about the harvest and being ready to be gathered with it at the end times. Jesus knew that farming and gardening required waiting – and hoping that the harvest would be plentiful. It required flexibility – and persistence – and willingness to work – and having faith that the harvest will be abundant.

Advent. The waiting time before the coming of the Christ child. Lord God, help us to keep awake and be ready for your birth in our world and in our hearts. Grant us patience in our waiting. Shower us with your peace. Amen.

Light one candle to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness. He shall bring salvation to Israel, God fulfills the promise. – from ELW 240

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - NOVEMBER 2013

- ✓ Council reviewed the budget presented by Dale Newhart, Finance Committee representative, and sent it to the congregation for its review at the November 10th congregation meeting.

- ➡ The Disaster Response Team held a very successful breakfast on Sunday, November 3rd to raise funds for the group traveling to Tuscaloosa, Alabama the week of November 18th. Enough was raised to cover their costs!
- ➡ Council reviewed the procedures for the congregation meeting and assigned ballot counters for the voting process.
- ➡ The Consecration Sunday Luncheon and Time and Talent Auction was a big hit! Over 150 members attended and bid on the auction items. It was interesting to see the varied talents and gifts people in our congregation have to offer. Proceeds of over \$1,400.00 from the auction were designated for the general fund.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Some Truths about Financial Development Programs



From the Preface to Second Edition of A Manual for Stewardship Development Programs in

the Congregation The Rev. J. Hugh Magers

- The first place to look for money is in the heart, not the wallet. In my experience, about 75% of the annual income of the typical congregation comes from 12 to 15% of the members. These folks also do most of the ministry of the church. They usually can talk about the ways that they have known God in their lives. The amount of giving is not connected to the amount of money that they have. There are rich and poor, stingy people. Generous people come in all economic categories.
- Most people find it hard to talk about God and money. God and money are both wonderful and powerful. Most people are so afraid of them that they can't talk about them. So we need to create arenas where it is safe to do so... unless this conversation takes place, there will be no basic change in giving patterns.
- We aren't saved because we give money to God. Salvation is a gift from God's grace that comes through faith (itself a gift from God). We enter life in grace through our Baptisms and our claiming of Jesus as Savior and our submission to his Lordship. We grow in grace through steady participation in worship and ministry. Giving will not affect your salvation. Salvation will definitely affect your giving.
- Everyone is already doing the very best they can.
 Everyone is already giving everything they can,

given their spiritual health. In fact, your giving rate is a pretty good indicator of your spiritual health. Whatever you give, give it with joy.

- Yes, we really do need to sign pledge cards. At one level, a pledge card is merely an act of kindness to the vestry and treasurer since it enables them to plan a budget. But at a deeper level, people who pledge feel like they belong to the Church. So pledging is an identity or community statement. At the deepest level, a pledge card is the only document that most of us sign every year saying that we claim Jesus as Savior and submit our lives to his Lordship.
- If you are not smiling when you sign your pledge card, you have filled in the wrong amount. You have pledged too much or too little. Give a happy amount!

As we approach a major holiday season, loss and depression is a tough subject to address, but depression – deep sadness – is one of the stages of loss that needs to be talked about. Our society, however, almost seems to be involved in a "stamp out depression" campaign. Sometimes intervention is vital, but many times, we don't allow the normal depression that comes with grief be explored and worked through.

In her book *Praying Our Grief*, Linda Perrone Rooney writes that, in simple terms, depression is anger turned inward and often occurs when we aren't able to control our environment. It can take a mild form, like feeling "down in the dumps," or it may be more severe and cause us to isolate ourselves from others. In any form, it causes us to look at our world from a negative viewpoint, including being down on ourselves.

When you enter this stage of grieving, it is a good time to talk about what bothers you and to share your experience and feelings with others as a way to take the edge off the depression so it does not become more severe. It helps to let the inner gloom out into the light where it can heal and place you on a more positive course. If it does become severe, don't be afraid to seek medical treatment to help you through this tough stage of grieving.

As difficult as it is to endure, our depression has elements that can be helpful in grief. It slows us down and allows us to take stock of the loss. According to Dr. Elisabeth Kubler-Ross, it makes us rebuild ourselves from the ground up – and clears the deck for growth. It takes us to a deeper place in our soul that we might not normally explore. It is the stage of grief that helps us to move on to a state of acceptance – next month's topic.

"Dear Jesus, when you wept in the garden, were you experiencing depression? Did you feel the same desolation and emptiness I feel? You used prayer, and pouring out your heart to your Father, and then you found peace... Help me to pray in confidence for the strength to meet life's challenges, to surround myself with others who will support me, and to seek help when I need it. Be my light whenever darkness threatens to overcome me. Amen." – Linda Perrone Rooney

SUMMARY:

Expenses exceeded income in the Regular Fund for the month of October by \$4,538.54, and for the year 2013, expenses exceeded income by \$44,419.10, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$45,381.79. Last year the net income for the same period was \$15,347.10 with a balance of \$67,273.14.

Budget Comparison--Total Regular Fund Budget for 2013 is \$413,068.00. 43/52 of that figure is \$341,575.46. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the ten months were \$289,779.94. So, we are behind in income by \$51,795.52.
