

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR... From Pastor Jami Possinger



Lent – a simple, four letter word. The season of "lent," however, is packed with an incredible story, a sacred journey and the opportunity for spiritual renewal. As I have been thinking about Lent for our congregation this year, I have been reflecting on mid-week worship, liturgical arts, preaching and teaching. And the word "lent" just kept coming back to me. I continued to ask myself two questions: How do we help our members understand just how important this season is? And how do we encourage them to really get into the Lenten season? Those questions led me to an acrostic for the word LENT. So let me share it with

you....

Let God be God. So often we try to do it all and be everything to all people. Lent is a season when we are reminded that God is God and we are not! Letting God be God frees us to be human – frees us to make mistakes and be forgiven – frees us to pray and let God do the worrying – frees us to place ourselves into the loving arms of a God who wants to love us!

Experience the season. We spend our days rushing about and before we know it a week has gone by and we can't even remember what we did, who we saw or where we went. SLOW DOWN in this season of Lent – this season of reflection and rest. Take time to revive your soul and your life. Make room for God - by attending midweek and Sunday services, reading pieces of scripture and losing yourself in prayer. You never know – they may even become experiences worth continuing!

<u>Never forget the story</u>. During Lent we focus on the life and ministry of Jesus leading up to his last week on earth. It's an incredible story of loyalty and betrayal, faith and faithlessness, fear and joy, life and death, defeat and victory. But most of all it is the story of our being saved by a God who will go to any length to be in relationship with YOU and me. What are you doing this Lent to remember the story in your life?

<u>**T**</u>urn away from the things that are NOT life-giving</u>. Because Lent is a time to renew our relationship with God, the church talks about repentance. Repent comes from a Greek word, $\mu \epsilon \tau \dot{\alpha} voi\alpha$ – metanoia, which literally means to make a 180 degree turn. What does that look like? Imagine you are tempted to shoplift something even though you know it's wrong. As you are moving toward the item you, literally, turn the other way and keep walking away. Metanoia – repentance – means turning away from things that draw you from God and God's will for your life and turning you toward God, and how God would have you live and be! Are there people or situations or decisions in your life that you need to turn *from* so that you can turn *toward* God?

That's my acrostic. I hope and pray that it helps to light your path as you enter the Lenten season.

ASSISTANT PASTOR'S WORD...

So – I'm sitting here at my desk waiting for yet another snow storm. When are we going to see some signs of Spring? Give us some signs, God!

Wait a minute – isn't that what the people of Israel called out to God whenever they felt distant from God and their faith wavered? "Give us a sign," they cried. When Abram was promised an heir and a land, he asked God, "How will I know your promise is sure?" So, God appeared to Abram in a dream and offered the sign of a covenant.

Some of my favorite readings about God's faithfulness are found in the readings for the Vigil of Easter – the church season between Good Friday and Easter dawn. These are readings full of signs from God about God's faithful presence with us. In the story of the Flood, for instance, God set a sign in the sky – a rainbow – to seal the covenant of God's faithfulness with all living creatures of the earth. I often see rainbows in the sky – even in winter.

When reading the story of the Creation in Genesis 1, we can feel the rhythm of a wind from God, God's Spirit, breathing life into the universe. "And there was evening and there was morning, the first day. ... And there was evening and there was morning, the second day. ..." The rhythm of God. A sign of God's presence with us. I like to look out the window – even in the winter – to watch the wind of God breathing new life into the world. Sometimes, it's a strong wind reminding us that we occasionally need to be pushed and cajoled to where God wants us to go. Sometimes, it's gentle and rhythmic, telling us to slow down and take time to breathe – take time to listen to the silent assurance of God's presence with us.

During the season of Lent, as we journey with Jesus to Jerusalem - and the cross – take time to look for the signs of God's presence with you in the simple things – in the waters of the melting snow, reminding of us the baptismal water that began our relationship with God – in the motion of the air around us, reminding us of the God's Holy Spirit present with us – in the lengthening of daylight and the changes in the seasons, reminding us of the rhythms of life. All of these are strong reassurances of God's constancy – of God's faithfulness – and of God's never-ending love.

- Council members spent time talking about congregational communication and how they can help to make it better. Some considerations are being discussed and reviewed.

Stewardship New Year's Resolutions:

New Ways of Thinking By Molly Brown



I must admit that I am never one to make New Year's resolutions. So instead of thinking about New Year's resolutions for our congregations and ourselves around stewardship, let's look at new ways of thinking about stewardship this year. Here are four new ways of thinking about stewardship for ourselves and our congregations:

The first new thinking is this: **To know and understand that God cares about our entire life and this includes our financial spending, goals and worries.** God cares about our financial well-being. God cares about our financial worries as much as we do. God cares how we spend our money on daily needs and how we give of our money to show our love to God and others. It's easy to forget that God loves and cares about our entire lives, including how we are doing with our finances.

The second new way of thinking: **Stewardship is a way of life, not a yearly campaign for the church to ask for money.** I understand and am in a congregation that survives on pledges and a yearly budget but somehow I think that our congregations get the impression that this is what we care about most, meeting the budget at the end of the year and/or having everyone pledge. While as a pastor, I do care about these things, I care more about people being good stewards. God cares more about our entire lives than our church budgets as well!

The third new way of thinking: **Stewardship is NOT just about money but it does include money.** God cares about what we do with our money but also what we do with our time and talents! God cares about what we do at our jobs, how we give of our time to serve others, and how we take care of our families and ourselves by eating well, spending time together, and resting.

The fourth new way of thinking: To live everyday with the question: **How does what I do with my time, talent, and treasure affect my relationship with God?** Stewardship is first and foremost about a relationship; our relationship with God. How does our stewardship or management of God's stuff affect our relationship with God? Does it? Have you ever stopped to think about the question? When we start to think about our relationship with our stuff as our relationship with God, we start to care for things differently, we start to become good stewards of all that God has given us: time, talent, and treasure.



LENTEN BOOK STUDY: HELP, THANKS, WOW! BY ANNE LAMOTT

If you've ever read anything by Anne Lamott, you'll know that she has a gift for writing about her faith questions in a funny, yet insightful way. This year, as a way to add Lenten discipline to your weekly routine, we will be offering a "Dinner Table Discussion" book study series based on Anne Lamott's book *"Help, Thanks, Wow! – the three Essentials of Prayer."*



The group will meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:00-7:15 PM in Hanson Hall, from March 11 through April 15. It will begin with a simple meal – soup, salad, and bread (no dessert – it's Lent). Then, Pastor Paulette will lead a discussion of this easy to read, humorous book that can help us get through the day by learning to ask for assistance, noticing the good that we witness daily, and feeling awe at the world in front of us – all because of God in our lives. Everybody will be asked at the first session if they are willing/able to contribute for the series - and everybody will be asked to help with cleanup as we leave refreshed and ready to face the week that lies ahead. After the loss of a loved one, we often sit by ourselves and remember the events of how it all happened. We might find ourselves telling and retelling the story to family and friends around us. At first, everyone wants to know the details and, through the tears and the sadness, you tell them. However, as time passes, others might not be so interested in hearing the story again. Yet, telling the story is part of the healing process after any traumatic event. It is the way we try to make sense of everything that has happened. It helps the mind catch up to the pain that lingers within your heart. Telling the story helps to dispel the pain.

According to David Kessler, who partnered with Dr. Elisabeth Kubler-Ross to write her last book, grief must be witnessed to be healed. He writes, "Grief shared is grief abated." Thus, support and bereavement groups are important, not only because they allow you to be with others who have experienced loss, but because they also provide us with an opportunity for talking about the devastating events that shattered your world. It really does help to take the inner thought of your mind and speak them out loud as a way to put things in order once again.

So, here at Hope Church we will begin offering a grief support group so people have the opportunity to help one another through the grieving process. The group will begin meeting on Wednesday, April 23, beginning at 7 PM. We will plan on meeting for 12 weeks and use materials from the *Grief Sharing* series. It will be open to people from Hope Church and from the community at large. A sign-up sheet will be available on the bulletin board in the Narthex. We hope you will consider joining us – and encouraging family members or friends to take advantage of this opportunity. Please feel free to contact me if you have questions or desire more information.

Many of our stories contain an enormous amount of pain, sometimes too much for one person to handle by themselves. When we share our stories, we disperse the pain little by little, and it helps us to figure things out. So, we ask, "What is it that you want to know? How can we help you see things differently? What would your loved one want to tell you now?" Here is your invitation to explore your feelings of grief at a new level.

To fashion an inner story of our pain carries us into the heart of it, which is where rebirth inevitably occurs. – Sue Monk Kidd, as quoted in Healing after Loss: Daily Meditations for Working through Grief.

Profit at the Spring Socials is divided between The Northampton Area Food Bank and Hope Church's Good Samaritan Fund.


