SUMMARY:						

Expenses exceeded income in the Regular Fund for the month of September by \$5,602.93, and for the year 2014, expenses exceeded income by \$31,869.34, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$45,287.68. Last year the net income for the same period was \$(39,880.56) with a balance of \$49,911.33.

Budget Comparison--Total Regular Fund Budget for 2014 is \$416,769.00. 39/52 of that figure is \$312,576.75. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the nine months were \$273,051.02. So, we are behind in income by \$39,525.73.

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

From Pastor Jami Possinger

For about 25 years, my family has been hosting our annual Thanksgiving feast. I remember I have to start thinking about it sometime around Halloween – and quickly lose track of time. Before I know it, there is one week to go and I have yet to order my turkey from Mr. Bill's Poultry stand in the Farmer's Market.



I love our Thanksgiving gatherings! We usually have between 20 and 30 people for dinner – always making sure to invite those we know do not have a special place to be on that day. My younger sister and I plan the meal – which never seems to change much – and those who join us often bring a dish. Sometimes, after dinner, we "roast" someone with a song or skit. Other times, we just sit around and catch up with one another. And always we have a (yucky) creamed onion in honor of my mother – who loved them – it's a tradition of remembrance, I suppose. Throughout the day, I am so thankful for the people in my life.

I need Thanksgiving – because sometimes I simply get too distracted to be appreciative. I may be very busy when someone does something that's helpful, and I may hardly notice it because my mind is on so many other things. I may have a lot of worries about money or relationships or work, and they may keep me from feeling appreciation for many of the things I have – such as a place to live, heat in the winter, food on the table. And I may be too deep in thought or conversation to fully appreciate the song of the bird in the trees on my walk.

The other day I came across this quote by Dave McIntyre: "Appreciation is like an insurance policy. It has to be renewed every now and then." Obviously, we don't **have** to renew our appreciation – but when we do, we're the ones who benefit. The kind word or advice of a friend, the helpfulness of someone we know, the many gifts we enjoy each day – they all mean more to us when we receive them in a spirit of appreciation and gratitude.

So how do we renew our appreciation of all that we have? I suppose it's mostly a question of reminding ourselves just how special life is – and just how fortunate we are to be blessed in our lives. If there's one thing that I don't want to lose, it's appreciation for those things that are good in my life – my family, my work, my church, my friends, my health. Because there are a lot of other things that aren't so good – and the good things are the things that keep me going.

Thanksgiving is an appropriate time to reflect on this idea of appreciation. But it can't happen just one day or on season out of the year. I hope you take a few moments every day to count your blessings – give thanks for them – allow yourself to relish the experience of prosperity and abundance you already have. I guarantee that it will change your attitude about your life that day!

VIDEOTAPING WORSHIP SERVICES



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS – OCTOBER 2014

- ♣ Rachel Holencik was hired as our Confirmation Coordinator for the 2014 2015 confirmation year. Her position is part time 10 hours per week and she will oversee the administration of the Confirmation Program in consultation with the Pastor.
- Rev. Louise Williams is joining our staff as a temporary, part-time Visitation Pastor 16 to 20 hours per week. Pastor Williams will be doing visitations in the hospital and to our homebound members. She began her ministry on October 17th and will join us for worship in November to meet the people at Hope.
- ➡ Hope's Helping Hands H3 sent four people to Tuscaloosa, Alabama in October. The members who participated are Kim and Dan Belletti and Doris and Pete Zellers.
- The Christian Education Committee has purchased a new, more experiential curriculum to be used in all classes from Kindergarten through 6th grade of our Sunday School program.
- The Property Committee is currently seeking bids from vendors to replace our furnace/boiler system. The current system is original to the building and is 40 years old. Last year the system failed on a few Sunday mornings as well a couple of weekdays leaving us with no heat and the fear of pipes freezing.
- Korpics Contracting is currently painting the narthex and main hallway.
- Several Audio-Visual Committee members visited other local churches to their research video and projection technology to better inform the committee on options, strengths and weaknesses and cost.
- ▲ An Eagle Scout project adding a new flagpole to the area by the pavilion is proceeding. Lighting will be added when the scout has finished his work around the base of the flagpole.
- The next Coffee with the Council is scheduled for Sunday, January 11, 2015 in Kuntz Hall. Members are encouraged to drop in for coffee and to share questions and comments about ministry at Hope. Council members will be available to answer questions, review finances and share information with attendees.




SENIOR CENTER VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Back in February of 2014, Pastor Paulette sensed there was a need for a group similar in focus to the long-established WELCA group here at Hope, but one that would instead meet in the evenings, to better suit the schedules of women who work during the day. She publicized this group and let the women develop the mission of the group. Kim Belletti and Deb Gardner have been with the group since its inception. Both asserted that their mission is social as well as service oriented.

The ladies created – and named – Women of Faith as an outreach group for women of all ages to share their faith while doing fun projects, hosting events and presenting speakers.

Next to join the group was Doris Zellers, Jane Tretiak and Janet Pauker, who brought their ideas for future events and service projects. Meanwhile, Pastor Paulette left Hope in August and Jane volunteered to chair the committee along with her sister Janet. Doris is their super creative crafts person. Regular faces in attendance include Jean Fritzinger, Georgia Mohrey, Nancy Creyer, Toni Snyder and Leslie Daniel.

Women of Faith meet the third Monday of the month at 6:30 PM in Hanson Hall. Their projects are always announced in the monthly newsletter and have so far been well attended and some are not just for women – the August butterfly talk was just such an event with over 30 people participating. Last Monday, 12 women brought home new handmade jewels, created while they shared fellowship. And in September, the ladies made 12 fleece throws that will be blessed and donated to Camp Noah.

Thus far, Women of Faith has been mostly self-funded, through donations and members' personal payments for craft supplies. Going forward, they have submitted a budget of \$200 for the fiscal year 2015.
