Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of June by \$5,103.65, and for the year 2015, expenses exceeded income by \$8,408.48, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$57,317.55. Last year the net income for the same period was \$(24,430.98) with a balance of \$53,204.04.					
Budget Comparison--Total Regular Fund Budget for 2015 is \$424,029.00. 26/52 of that figure is \$212,014.50. Our receipts in the Regular Fund for the six months were \$181,836.05. So, we are behind in income by \$30,178.45.

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

From Pastor Jami Possinger

I am writing this article on the last day of our trip to the ELCA Youth Gathering in Detroit, Michigan. It has been an exhausting week for all of us. We launched our days with a 7:00 AM bus ride into Downtown Detroit and never returned to our hotel until after midnight every night except one. We walked A LOT – some days as much as 10 miles and other days *only* 5. So whenever we had a few minutes to sit down, many of our youth would use the opportunity to take a quick nap (sometimes the leaders did as well – but don't tell the kids).



When we left Hope's parking lot, we still had some of our youth who were pretty quiet and didn't say much – did that change quickly? By the time we returned to Hope's parking lot, we couldn't shut anyone up! Over the course of the week we participated in service work, listened to great speakers, heard incredible music, joined 30,000 people in inspiring worship and shared our stories and our lives. No one came back unchanged by the experience.

Here are some of the things I learned...

- ⚓ It's *not* true what I often hear people say about the youth of today – our youth are hard-working, interested in serving others and can put their phones down for extended periods of time (no phones were allowed during our meals – except to take pictures of what we were eating!).
- ⚓ Never underestimate the power of kindness – our kids were so respectful, kind, compassionate and open with everyone they met.
- ⚓ When you get lemons... make lemonade – although all but one of our kids came home coughing, every one of them made the most of the week – and did it cheerfully.
- ⚓ Young people **do** want to make a difference in this world – when given the task to clean up a VERY overgrown and dirty alley, our youth met the challenge despite the heat and the grungy conditions.
- ⚓ People can be very different, but if we care enough about each other we create a community we never expected and friendships that will last.
- ⚓ All young people do not expect everything to be easy – Hope Lutheran Church has *amazing* youth who never complained – about the walking, the schedule delays, the heat, the long days, the lack of sleep.
- ⚓ Everyone has highs and lows – we shared ours every night and it makes a difference when you are vulnerable enough to let other people into your life.
- ⚓ We are on this earth to bear each other's burdens, build bridges among God's people, break the chains that bind us and bring **HOPE** to people and the world!

On Sunday, August 16th, the youth who participated in the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering will be taking part in both worship services and offering everyone a glimpse into what they experienced. I hope you will mark your calendars and be in church that day to see and hear some inspiring stories of faith and friendship from 18 young people whose lives you helped change by your support.

The process is moving along and there are some special dates coming up. As this newsletter went to print, a separate mailing was sent outlining the process. Please plan on attending!



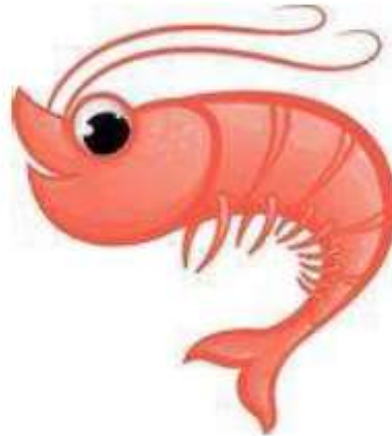
