GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

Last Friday, the city of Paris was hit with tremendous violence. Terrorists shot and bombed areas of the city – causing many to die and many others to be injured. And, like so many of you, I watched in horror and wondered how people can do these terrible things to each other. What are we – people who believe in Jesus – "good Christians" – to do in the face of such devastation? How can we find a sense of peace in this world? Who is going to lead us out of these turbulent times and into a time that looks more like Jesus' definition of the kingdom of God?



And that got me to thinking... we can sit around waiting for the second coming of Jesus – who will put the world right again – or we can begin to act. Now I'm not talking about running for Miss America and supporting world peace. And I'm not talking about running for the presidency or any other political office to try to change the world. I am talking about each and every one of us simply "doing the right thing."

So just what is the right thing? For Jewish people it is following the Law of Moses. For devout Muslims it is following the five pillars of their faith. For Christians it is following the teachings of Jesus. Sounds simple but boy, is it hard sometimes to step outside our comfort zone and do the right thing. Sometimes it seems like we're stepping out into the middle of a crowd with no support – with no defense – and we risk making ourselves look ridiculous by demanding social change – or demanding improvement in our society. But one person can have power... as long as that person is following his or her conscience and doing things for reasons that are pure and true. In other words, they are doing things not for personal gain, but because the person knows in his or her heart that what is being done is needed. As followers of Jesus, we know what the right thing is – Jesus talked about it all the time. And Jesus recognized the power that comes from doing just that – the right thing – because Jesus knew that all of us, in our own way, have influence over others.

Jack Kemp once said, "The power of one man or one woman doing the right thing for the right reason, and at the right time, is the greatest influence in our society." We may never see the results of our influence. We may never even believe that we've had any influence at all. But that's not important – the important thing is in doing – in facing our fears and going out there and doing something that we feel will benefit others. The truth is... it's not the senators or representatives or the other politicians or businessmen who have the greatest influence on our society – they simply keep things moving, hopefully in positive directions. The greatest influence comes from people who are following their faith and their hearts and their spirits and trying to do what they know to be right.

Our world needs leaders – and not just the elected or appointed kind. We all have the potential to lead others through the power of our convictions, and our dedication to what we believe to be right. And, whether you know it or not, you don't have to be a "person of influence" to be influential. Some of the most influential people in my life are probably not even aware of the things they've taught me. We cannot necessarily change the world as an individual. But what might happen if collectively we – that means all of us – would start by simply doing the right thing? It could be just the revolution for which the world is waiting.

- Blood is perishable red blood cells have a usable lifespan of 42 days and platelets must be used within 5 days of donation.
- Approximately 450 donors are needed every day to meet the transfusion needs of our community hospitals.

Our Wellness Team is offering you an opportunity to give this free gift at our January Blood Drive. Why January you ask? *Because there is traditionally a shortage of donated blood in the winter months.* So the Wellness Team will be hosting a Miller Memorial Blood Drive here at Hope on Sunday, January 10th from 8:00 AM through 1:00 PM in Kuntz Hall. We are making it conveniently easy for you to donate before or after church – without leaving the building!

Wellness Team members will be setting appointments for blood donations on Sunday, **December 20th, 27th and January 3rd** before and after worship services. Crayons, markers, coloring books, sketch pads, clay, paints, brushes, pajamas, socks, underwear, scarves, hats, mittens, red sweatshirts and pants (L, XL, XXL), shower gels, shampoo, deodorant, flavored lip balm, scented lotions, gift cards (all kinds – book stores, tunes, movie theaters, Target, K-Mart, etc.), personal diaries (no wire bound).

Recap of 2016 Budget portion of the Congregational Meeting – November 8, 2015 – by Doug Daniel and Tim Lockard

To our members,

First and most important, we wish to express our sincere thanks and gratitude for the many years Dale Newhardt has provided his financial insight and guidance to our congregation. It will be a tall order to fill your shoes Dale, but please know we will do our very best to maintain the fiscal soundness of Hope Lutheran Church.

Given our limited ability to master the paper and pencil as competently as Dale, the finance team opted to rely on a good ole fashioned computer power to analyze our church finances. The intent of our mission was to determine where we stand today with church finances and lay the groundwork for the 2016 budget. We chose to dig deep and look into the past to review how the basic accounting elements of income and expense have tracked over time. We assume by now that most have reviewed the proposed and/or final 2016 budget. The presentation of charts below will show some of the analysis we used to achieve our goals for the 2016 budget and provide insight and critical information regarding our income relative to expense.

In Chart 1 below, you will see a history of Pledge Giving from 2004 to 2015. This relates to envelope giving only. Here are the definitions of each column:

- 1. Year
- 2. Number of Pledges This the total number of pledge cards turned in on consecration Sunday
- 3. Amount Pledged The amount pledged from the pledge cards turned in
- 4. Amount Given Of the Amount Pledged, this is the actual amount given for the year
- 5. Difference The difference between Amount Pledged vs Amount Given expressed as a percentage
- 6. Non-Pledged Giving This column represents the envelope giving by those who did not turn in a pledge card for that year.

To explain Chart 1 let's use the year 2013. In 2013 there were 185 pledge cards (Number of Pledges) turned in for a total pledge of \$293,194.00 (Amount Pledged). To be clear, if a person turned in a pledge card, pledged using their assigned envelope or pledged using a blank envelope that could be related back to their envelope number, credit was given for that donation towards their pledge. In the 2013 Amount Given column, you will see the total amount given was \$214,722.00. The difference between the Amount Pledged and the Amount Given is -27% or \$78,472.

For our current year 2015, the Amount Pledged is \$235,881.00. The highlighted cells in year 2015 represent data as of 10/31/2015. That indicates there is still \$55,600.00 in donations we will need to collect in November and December to meet the amount pledged. We hope that by the time you read this we are well on our way to achieving the full amount pledged for 2015.

To further analyze our income, we took a look back at Total Envelope Giving from 2012-2015. Total Envelope Giving includes pledged and non-pledged envelope donations received. In Chart 2 below you will see envelope income by month, totaled by quarter for each year. Also, you will see the percentage for a particular month's envelope receipts as part of that total year. Chart 2 shows data collected through October 2015. The highlighted cells for the last months of 2015 represent *estimated* envelope giving for November and December, based on the historical contributions for those months in prior years. The highlighted cells in larger bold print indicate a trend we should all be concerned about as it shows relatively flat envelope income, especially in years 2013-2015.

Finally we must point out that over the past three years we have pulled money from our reserves to settle the year end deficit. The projection for year end 2015 will also be very tight. A simple thing as another snow storm that interferes with Christmas services and adds snow removal cost will most likely leave us with another year-end deficit.

The aforementioned data and research brings light to a very concerning situation...

- Pledge commitments are typically not met
- Envelope giving over the last three years is flat
- We have drawn from our reserves the past three years.

Given the cost of almost everything increases year to year, all this makes it very challenging to bring a reasonable new budget to the congregation each year.

So why did the finance committee decide to bring this information forward to you at this time? Very simply, to provide advance notice and raise awareness of a trend in contributions that may result in a reduction of our ability to provide Christian services to our congregation and support to our community. Unfortunately, that is the business side of our faith-based initiatives at Hope Lutheran Church.

Hope Lutheran is an awesome congregation – serving our members and people in our community – striving to be the hands of feet of our Lord Jesus Christ – working to be the people of God we are called to be. Let us all work together to keep our church functioning as we all want it and need it to be.
