

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

Woodrow Wilson once said, "You are not here merely to make a living. You are here to

enable the world to live more amply, with greater vision, and with a finer spirit of hope and achievement. You are here to enrich the world. You impoverish yourself if you forget this errand."



I love this kind of thinking. You are here to enrich the world. It's true – isn't it? Our mere presence provides the potential for the world's enrichment, but is our mere presence

enough? I think not. And that gets me to thinking about our May 1^{st} event – "The Church Has Left the Building." Next, pick the project that fits your skills and interests and join that team for the day. Then join us for lunch after church on May 1st after which we will launch ourselves for service. We'll be out and about until 3 PM when we will return to the church for an ice cream social and a time to share our experiences.

The truth is that making a living is fairly easy for most of us - enriching the world takes that extra step or two. And it really isn't necessary to try to affect the world on a global level - we've been put where we are and given what we have because that's where we can do good today. Right now. So sign up to help with "The Church Has Left the Building!" By making an effort to enrich the world - contributing in positive ways to people - we contribute to ourselves and enrich our own lives, also.

PASTOR BRIAN'S PREPONDERANT BUSINESS

A very blessed Easter season to you all! As I write this we are preparing for Holy Week and I am very excited to experience my first Holy Week at Hope. Ever since I was young I've always thought Good Friday was the holiest day of the year, worthy of the greatest devotion. It's a day for fasting, prayer, and contemplation. It's a serious time to meditate on Christ's death, its universal implications, and its meaning for our lives. It is also a day to dwell with our own mortality, to rest comfortably or uncomfortably with the fact that we will all one day face the inevitable. It's not a time to focus on the promise of resurrection; but a time of sackcloth and ashes, a time to face the absolute certainty of death and feel its tremendous effect on the human psyche. Then, only after we have thoroughly submerged ourselves in the darkness of Good Friday, are we ready to encounter an unexpected surprise...

Christ is risen we shout and sing! Death no longer has its string! The tomb is empty and Jesus is free—the tomb is empty and we are free! Death no longer holds Christ bound, and death no longer holds us bound. We are free to live our lives to the fullest and to participate in eternal life both now and forever. Easter is a time of celebration, of joy and peace and love. Easter is the season that reminds us that no matter how bad life may look now, life is truly about sharing in the life of God and all the joy that entails. We gain a glimpse of heaven this day, and are assured that this universe is not about death and darkness and suffering, but so much more about life, light, and love.

And then we wonder: What if it's all true? What if our deepest longings for a better world, for eternal life, for peace and hope and love is not just a pipe dream made up by wishful thinkers who wrote ancient books; but that our own hearts contain the very blueprints for God's plan for the world? What if these stories of Jesus Christ, the kind of God He tells of, and the life He invites us into, are what actually comprise the essence of reality? These are questions I've often wondered, and in this time of Easter I think it is essential we explore them together. And not just, what happens when we die, but how does Christ living in me change my life today, this very moment?!? As we celebrate the Easter season this coming month, I ask you to reflect on these questions. Contemplate the divine mysteries; don't seek to understand as much as *experience* them. Invite God more and more into your life and allow the Spirit to comfort you, inspire you, and change you. Surrender your being to God and blow through life as the wind moves a leaf through a bright spring day.



April is National Donation Month

Donate the Gift of Life – Why? 121,407 people are waiting for an organ 22 people will die each day waiting for an organ 1 organ donor can save up to 8 lives

Because you may save up to 8 lives through organ donation and enhance many others through tissue donation. Last year alone, organ donors made more than 28,000 transplants possible. Another one million people received corneas and other tissue transplants that helped them recover from trauma, bone damage, spinal injuries, burns, hearing impairment and vision loss. Unfortunately, thousands die every year waiting for a donor organ that never comes. You have the power to change that. For more information see the bulletin board for April's poster.

WELLNESS TEAM SURVEY RESULTS

Recently, the Wellness Team surveyed the congregation about what the members of Hope want to see offered by the Wellness Team. Historically, there have been Blood Pressure screenings, blood drives, wellness fairs, etc. While we will continue some of these offerings, here are the results of the latest survey about what you want. The survey was distributed over 2 consecutive Sundays in December. General service attendance was about 500 for the two weeks, and 59 members completed a survey (~10%). Here's a brief description of who filled out the survey.

- 93% were > 40 years of age (59%, 40-65 years old; 34% > 65 years old)
- 20% Have an elderly parent
- 30% have a chronic condition themselves, and 42% have a family member with a chronic condition.

Here are the top areas of interest (respondents could pick more than one):

- 1. Stress! (69%)
- 2. Fitness (64%)
- 3. Nutrition (59%)

Most respondents picked a weekday evening as the best time to have an event on wellness (58%), followed by weekend morning (27% - it was more of a 3-way tie with weekday morning/afternoon, 24% and 25% respectively).

What does this all mean? For starters, a 10% response rate is, well, not unexpected, but we'd love to hear from more of the congregation! (more on that, later). Second, the interests most chosen could reflect the demographic of the largest number of the respondents. We think we may have missed out on the under 40 members of the congregation, and especially the teen/young adult members, which could change what wellness interests are chosen. Still, 69% of all respondents choosing stress is a clear message that we feel needs to be addressed. So, we're working on a program that is stress relieving focused and will keep you posted about that!

In the meantime, we'll display the survey and the results on a poster in the narthex. Fill out a survey if you haven't already. We'll re-tally results once we hit 120 surveys and see if things change.


