GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

Summer is on the way and I love this season of the year. Already I am thinking of all the things I want to do as the weather offers us more daylight hours and opportunities for outside activities. I think about what I'd like to do in my free time and what gives me joy. I think about vacations, visiting our son in Washington DC, spending time with our grandchildren. And then I think... where am I going to find time to do all of the things I'm thinking about??!! How can I possibly fit all this into my already over-crowded schedule? It's all about managing our time.

Read the following statements and check the ones that are true in your life.

- I often feel confused and scattered
- I have too much to do and too little time in which to do it.
- I think of myself as contented.
- I enjoy my family.
- I have a daily quiet time.
- I sometimes take a nap.
- I enjoy regular exercise.
- I spend most of my time on urgent things instead of the important things.
- I often feel guilty for taking time to relax.
- I have prayerfully set life goals.

Here's a hard truth for many of us – time management is a dreaded and often ignored spiritual discipline. One any given day we choose where to invest our time – carefully planning everything from work-related meetings and lunch appointments to play dates and trips to the grocery store – but fail to schedule the most important activity of all – spending time with God.

I am convinced that much of our frustration in life comes from doing things we were never intended to do. Temptation happily dances across our overcrowded schedules. Here is the reality... our minutes, hours and days are precious commodities, gifts from God that can be unwrapped only once. So often we become so busy meeting the needs of others that we destroy ourselves in the process. Being intentional about our time and our lives can help. I am, by no means, an expert in the area of time management – but I do want to share some simple ideas to which I have been exposed.

- **Prepare:** Just as we budget our money, we must budget our time. Every day, we are presented with twenty-four hours, and every day we must choose to either spend those hours or invest them.
- **Prioritize:** If we don't set priorities others will. Time thieves will steal the hours and days as we allow them to impose their plans and demands on us.
- Eliminate: Learn to leave the "lesser" things undone. (This lesson is especially hard for me because I actually believe I can do it all. My trusty "Superwoman" cape is never far away!)
- **Delegate:** Remind everyone around you that they are an important part of this team then use them to help
- Simplify: Give up on perfection it won't happen all the time anyway. Learn to say "this is sufficient."
- Spend time with God: Whenever you can. Wherever you can. However you can. Spending time with God keeps us centered, focused, intentional about the way we are spending the precious gift of time God offers.

Good time management skills for many of us do not come naturally or easily. And while we will falter in our attempts to manage our time well – we can always begin again. Join me today in a new commitment to cultivate, apply and relish the time we have.

Stroke Awareness Month - FAST Facts about Stroke

Before you are done reading this article, at least one person in the United States will suffer a stroke. Stroke is the 5th leading cause of death in the United States: every 40 seconds someone has a stroke and every 4 minutes someone dies from stroke. Stroke happens when a blood vessel that carries blood and oxygen to the brain becomes blocked by a clot or bursts. When this happens, part of the brain cannot get the blood and oxygen it needs causing brain cells to die. These factors



increase your risk of stroke: age, heredity, African American race, male gender, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, cigarette smoking, diabetes, atrial fibrillation, heart disease, previous TIA, stroke or heart attack, and carotid, peripheral or other artery disease. Stroke is an emergency!! Stroke victims could potentially receive a clot-busting medication. This clot-busting medicine must be given within three hours of the onset of symptoms. If you or someone you're with experiences stroke symptoms it is important that you act **FAST** and call 911 immediately. **Face** – Ask the person to smile. Does the face look uneven? **Arm** – Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift down? **Speech** – Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase like "the sky is blue". Does his or her speech sound strange? **Time** – If you observe any of these signs, note the time the symptoms started and call 9-1-1. Learn the signs of stroke and act FAST! - Shannon Heffner RN, BSN

Beginning May 8th and continuing the second Sunday of the month, a member of the Wellness Team will be available between services and after the second service for blood pressure screening. Also on May 8th, a member of the team will be available for stroke screening (non-invasive) for anyone interested.

We will have another opportunity for persons to donate blood. Sunday July 17th, at Hope, from 8:00 AM until 12 Noon. Watch for sign-ups.




2016 SYNOD ASSEMBLY
