GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

I don't think there is any one of us who haven't had to deal with the death of a loved one. For some of us that simply means that we have attended a funeral or memorial service. For others – we have been the one meeting with the Pastor and Funeral Director to actually plan a funeral or memorial service. Dealing with all the details can be overwhelming for family members – especially if the death was sudden or no pre-planning was done by our loved one.



The truth is no one likes to think about their death. But if we don't think about it now, someone else will have to think about it later. You and I can help those family members or friends who will be taking care of our funerals by making decisions about our preferences while we are still able. If we make our wishes known we can help others attend to them when we are gone, which will alleviate some of the stress that comes with the death of a loved one.

While it may sound odd, many people find it a very comforting conversation to have with their loved ones. To indicate why particular scripture passages are meaningful to you can open wide a door to your faith. To say why Holy Communion is important for you - or to share your favorite hymns, witnesses to what you believe and can be a great source of hope.

For this reason we have a **Personal Pre-Planning Funeral Form** available in the church office for you to complete for your loved ones. It includes the kinds of questions I would normally ask family members as we prepare for a funeral service. This form is also a gift to your family. In a time of grief, it is hard to remember the conversations of a lifetime. Survivors can be left feeling guilty that they don't know a loved one's favorite bible passages or hymns. These become "one more thing" that your family needs to worry about. Deciding, in advance, what you want included in your funeral service spares others that added burden.

I invite you to stop in the church office and request the **Personal Pre-Planning Funeral Form** for your personal use. (We can also email you a copy.) You might want to discuss it with those who will be responsible for your funeral planning — or you may want to fill it out on your own. When you have completed the form, drop a copy off for the Pastor to retain and give one to a family member who will be making your final arrangements.

There are other resources that you may also find helpful:

- Five Wishes (www.agingwithdignity.org) is a document that expresses your personal, emotional and spiritual needs as well as your medical wishes, as you consider serious illness or end of life issues. It covers many important and overlooked ways of being cared for in your last days and does so in a very respectful and dignified way.
- Financial advisors can help with estate planning helping you to financially support your loved ones and share with organizations and causes you have cared about during your life.
- Funeral homes often have booklets or guidelines that allow you to write down many pieces of information that your survivors will need for death certificates and other funeral preparations.

All of us, at some point in our lives, will be handling funeral arrangements for a loved one and no one wants to think about these things before they have to think about them. But pre-planning will be a gift to those you love and an asset as they try to fulfill your final wishes. And while the last day will come for each of us, we remain faithful with the words of Paul in his letter to the Romans: "If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord." (Romans 14:8).

FROM THE WELLNESS TEAM SKIN CANCER

Summer is upon us. Protect your skin.

Skin cancer – the abnormal growth of skin cells – most often develop on skin exposed to the sun. But this common form of skin cancer can also occur on areas of your skin not ordinarily exposed to sunlight. There are three major types of skin cancer – basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma and melanoma.



You can reduce your risk of skin cancer by limiting or avoiding exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation. Checking your skin for suspicious changes can help detect skin cancer at its earliest stages. Early detection of skin cancer gives you the greatest chance for successful skin cancer treatment.

Factors that may increase your risk include:

- Fair skin
- A family history of skin cancer
- A history of sunburns
- A personal history of skin cancer
- Excessive sun exposure
- A weakened immune system

- Sunny or high-altitude climates
- Exposure to radiation
- Moles
- Exposure to certain substances (such as arsenic)
- Precancerous skin lesions


