

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

As I write this, I find myself recovering from a week of Vacation Bible School that was simultaneously exhilarating and exhausting! Over 200 young people and 100 adult leaders joined us to share in discovering God's word through biblical stories such as: Noah and the Ark, Jonah and the Whale, Peter walking on water, the disciples fishing for an enormous catch and the story of Paul's first journey spreading God's word. The energy was high, the laughter of the children was genuine and the love that was shared throughout the week was a gift



from God. If you have never been a part of this yearly ministry you are missing a great opportunity to learn, to grow, to give and to be blessed!

Every morning from 9 AM until 12 noon, children and leaders moved through various stations – Bible Story Time, Crafts, Games, Pastor Time, Music and Games – which reinforced the story of the day. At the end of the morning all participants gathered in the sanctuary to sing, pray and have lots of fun hearing about the winners of the daily donation and the coin toss. Each day children brought items to support a local ministry or organization and volunteers took those donations to the Northampton Food Bank, Forgotten Felines, the 6th Street Shelter, St. Stephen's Outreach Ministry and Lehigh Valley Pediatric and Cancer hospitals.

Children also brought loose change for a competition between the boys and the girls in which they tossed the coins into goldfish bowls – seeing who would accumulate the most each day. The money – \$550.00 for the week – was donated to the Miracle League of Northampton County, an organization whose mission is to "create positive experiences for those with intellectual and physical disabilities and their families through baseball." Additionally, through a Thrivent Action Team grant, we purchased six "beeper balls" for the Miracle League which are used to help blind or sight impaired children to play baseball.

The lives we touch in a week will never be the same. The lessons that are learned will walk with these children for life. The faith we nurture will sustain them in good and bad times. The songs they sing will be cherished childhood memories. The friendships they make will be lasting. The example we set of giving and sharing our blessings become models of service and compassion. The adults who help will be changed – and will forever be able to see what it means to share God's word. And we get the opportunity to do this every year!

I tell you all of this because YOU make this happen through your weekly offering. Vacation Bible School is probably the largest outreach event into our community that we do. Our VBS is so popular that we often have to turn children away when we reach our maximum enrollment. We do not advertise beyond the newsletter and bulletins because - simply through word-of-mouth - we have all the registrations we can handle. Over half of the children who attend are not members. Many do not have a church home or family. Many of those parents find themselves drawn into helping for the week. We are making a "Jesus-kind of" difference in the lives of children, adults and our community!

So thank you for your support of the ministry we do in the name of Jesus. And many, many thanks to Kathy Ziegler and Jen Ventura who have headed up this incredible endeavor for many years. Their dedication, attention to detail, love of children and amazing creativity combine to make Hope's VBS an awesome experience for all who participate



National Immunization Awareness Month

 Each year in the United States, one million people get shingles and some will have severe pain that can continue even long after their rash clears up (called postherpetic neuralgia) or they may suffer from other painful complications that could persist for years.




- Each year, on average, more than 200,000 people are hospitalized due to influenza and between 3,000 and 49,000 people die of influenza and its complications, the majority among adults.
- About 900,000 people get pneumococcal pneumonia every year, leading to as many as 400,000 hospitalizations and 19,000 deaths.
- 700,000 to 1.4 million people suffer from chronic hepatitis B, with complications such as liver cancer.
- HPV causes over 27,000 cancers in women and men each year. About 4,000 women die each year from cervical cancer.

Why Vaccines are Important for You: In the United States, vaccines have greatly reduced or eliminated many infectious diseases that once routinely killed or harmed many infants, children, and adults. However, the viruses and bacteria that cause vaccine-preventable diseases and death still exist and can be passed on to people who are not protected by vaccines. Vaccines are tested and monitored. Side effects are usually mild and go away in a few days. Vaccines are the safest way to protect your health. Getting your recommended vaccines can give you the pace of mind that you have the best possible protection available against a number of serious diseases. 


