

GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

From Pastor Jami Possinger

I'm usually someone who is willing to try something new – except for new foods that is! I think it is fun to see new places, meet new people and have new experiences. When it comes to the church, it is really important to be open to new things to which God might be calling us. Certainly that is how groups and events like the Women of Faith, Hope Yard Sale, Soup Group, St. Stephens Outreach Ministry, HopeFest, Centering Prayer, the Nativity Display and POW (Youth Group's "Pizza on Wednesday") got their start.



In a Stewardship Committee meeting a few months ago, we discussed trying something new. It is called "Generosity Sunday." Essentially it is an invitation to generosity – to try to give one week's tithe (ten percent of household weekly income) on ONE particular Sunday. The purpose is to experience the abundance of God's blessings in our lives and to witness the possibilities for ministry and mission. As we witness the resources available through being grateful and generous givers, we become excited about what God can accomplish through us. So... we decided to try this new thing. Let me explain...

I know that your first thought might be, "the church is always asking for money." But this event is not asking for money – it's asking for your generosity. Giving generously is really about putting God and God's kingdom first in our lives. It's humanly understandable of course, that we would hedge our bets – pay our bills first and satisfy our wants – then with whatever is left over, give to God. But God invites us to try a different approach to our giving. "Seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness and all things will be yours as well."

Not convinced yet? Remember when you first learned to ride a bike or blow bubbles with chewing gum? I do. You try and try and try — and want to give up. You couldn't do it, or so you thought. But you kept at it. Eventually you accomplished the seemingly impossible and learned how to blow big bubbles with Bazooka gum, and how to ride a bike — with no hands —Wow! What seemed impossible was actually quite simple. You just needed to TRY. Just think, if you had never tried, what you would have missed out on.

So the Stewardship Committee is inviting YOU to give it a try. Try a tithe for just one Sunday. Calculate your income in an average week, multiply it by ten percent and give that amount in the Sunday offering plate on October 2nd – "Generosity Sunday." This is simply and invitation to try. "Yeah, but what if I can't do it?" you ask. God calls us to give what we can – not what we can't. If you are unemployed, underemployed, in school, under the financial care of someone else, then you may have no available income to tithe. God's challenge is for each of us to become a generous giver. And so – tithing becomes less an issue of the wallet, and more an issue of faith and trust. Nothing ventured, nothing gained! What have you got to lose?

I'm ready to try this new thing we are calling "Generosity Sunday on October 2nd!" I think it will be fun and eye-opening. Are you willing and ready to go out on a limb with me – that's where the fruit is after all – and give it a TRY? Remember, a turtle travels only when it sticks out its neck.

Did you watch the Olympics? It always amazes me to watch such incredible athletes compete in track and field, gymnastics, swimming, and other great games. Some of the more unknown sports like handball, race walking, or trampoline jumping are fun to watch too! Living legends like Michael Phelps and Usain Bolt show us they've still got it and new Olympians like Simone Biles become superstars overnight.

The best thing about the Olympics for me though, is that it is an event that brings the entire world together. FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

SENIOR CHOIR begins on Thursday, September 8 at 7 PM in the sanctuary. Rehearsals are weekly for 90 minutes with the option to sing at either service. The Senior Choir is the adult choir of the congregation and is open to anyone in high school and older. This is an SATB (Soprano, Alto, Tenor, Bass) vocal choir singing sacred repertoire from multiple periods and genres.

The last few years, this has been a female vocal ensemble but is open to both genders. You are the safety net underneath your kids, but who and what are the safety nets underneath YOU? I've got a checklist ready to help you assess your own safety net and guide you through your own family action plan.

Nobody plans to slip on ice, fall off a ladder, or get in a car accident – but you CAN plan to make sure your paychecks/finances don't skip a beat in the event of an accident. Learn about disability protection, the three critical components of a disability policy, how to determine if you have enough to cover minor and major impacts to your ability to work, and – YIKES! – making sure you don't have the dreaded coverage gap. Bring your disability benefits coverage paperwork from work and you could really discover a lot!

WELLNESS TEAM NATIONAL OVARIAN CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

In women ages 35-74, ovarian cancer is the fifth leading cause of cancer-related deaths. An estimated one woman in 75 will develop ovarian cancer during her life-time. The American Cancer Society estimates that there will be over 22,280 new cases of ovarian cancer diagnosed this year and that more than 14,240 women will die from

ovarian cancer this year.

When one is diagnosed and treated in the earliest stages, the five-year survival rate is over 90 percent. Due to ovarian cancer's non-specific symptoms and lack of early detection tests, about 20 percent of all cases are found early, meaning in stage I or II. If caught in stage III or higher, the survival rate can be as low as 28 percent. Due to the nature of the disease, each woman diagnosed with ovarian cancer has a different profile and it is impossible to provide a general prognosis.
