From Pastor Jami Possinger

2017 is fast approaching and with it the beginning of a new year! But 2017 is also a critical year in the life of our church as well – because, whether you know it or not, 2017 happens to be the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. On 1517 Martin Luther publically posted his 95 Theses on the door of the Castel Church in Wittenberg, Germany. His desire was



to begin a debate about what Luther thought were issues and injustices in the Catholic Church of his day. What resulted was a firestorm of writings, accusations, intrigue, revolts and – eventually – the formation of the Lutheran Church. It's pretty interesting stuff!

Here at Hope we are planning on spending the year focusing on the Reformation – its ramifications, themes, music and the changes in theology it brought about. Throughout the course of 2017 we will offer some video series, book clubs, "500 challenges", special worship services and other interesting, educational and FUN events to help us better understand our Lutheran roots and who we are today.

Our Worship committee has put together a "Reformation Team" which is working on these events. If a team like this is interesting to you please let me know and I'll be glad to give you the date of our next meeting – no experience necessary!

Our first endeavor will be a "500 Challenge." Throughout the month of January – beginning on January 1st we would like our members to record 500 acts of kindness and post them on a Reformation 2017 bulletin board. Here's how you can participate. Keep track of any acts of kindness you do throughout the week. On Sunday morning – or whenever you are in the church – write down your act of kindness on the slips of paper by the bulletin board in the narthex. Pin it to the "kindness wall" and watch our kindnesses blossom! We'll pull a few each week and share them in the bulletins and newsletters so that everyone can see how the people of Hope are living out Jesus' mission to love others.

Additionally – watch for more information about the courses and other events we will be offering in 2017. Participate in as many or as few as you choose – but please participate. We want that "re-formation" spirit to infuse us in 2017 and encourage us as we seek to do God's will in our church and in the wider community!

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS – DECEMBER 2016

- Council welcomed new members, Kim Belletti and Allison Lockard, whose terms begin in January 2017.
- Council recognized the two outgoing council members, Linda Mery and Bob Small. Both served two threeyear terms and were ineligible for re-election. During her tenure Linda also served as council president and vice president. Many thanks to both Bob and Linda for sharing their organizational expertise and leadership capabilities.
- The next Coffee with the Council is scheduled for Sunday, January 15th at 9:15 AM in Kuntz Hall. The chair of the Finance Committee will take some time during this informal gathering to review information on "other" funds that are not included in the 2017 budget. If you are interested to hear about these funds please be sure to attend. Additionally, council will be available to answer questions, review other financial matters and receive suggestions.
- The Women of Faith's request to collect items for Keystone Military Families in January/February was approved. Details will appear in future newsletters and bulletins.
- Hope will host a Blood Drive for Miller Memorial Blood Bank on Sunday, January 22nd from 7:00 AM 1:00 PM in Kuntz Hall. The drive is in memory of Megan Duarte, Pastor Jerry's granddaughter, who died suddenly this year from SCAD (Sudden Coronary Artery Dissection) and needed multiple blood transfusions. Sadly, Megan left behind a husband and two small children. Members can book an appointment to donate blood on Sunday mornings beginning January 1st.
- The Youth Group will hold its annual Valentine Dinner on Saturday, February 11th (snow date will be Sunday, February 12th). Look for Youth Group representatives selling tickets in the narthex in January.
- Council reviewed the results of the Congregation Vitality Survey that was disseminated to the congregation in the fall. The results will help staff and council look at ways to address the future programming at Hope.



PASTOR BRIAN'S PREPONDERANT BUSINESS



Happy New Year! Hopefully this Christmas you had the chance to spend time with loved ones and deepen your own spirit of Christmas. Amidst the chaos of shopping and consumerism that always seem to have hacked this sacred season, I hope you were able to experience the mystery, peace, and joy of our Savior's birth.

As I reflect on the true meaning of Christmas some Christmas hymns come to mind. Particularly the classic Advent/Christmas hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" rings with truth for me this time of year. The first line "O come, O come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel" is powerful. And remembering the meaning of the word Emmanuel "God is with us" and Israel "one who struggles with God" makes it very personal. For those of who are in the midst of wrestling with God like Jacob did thousands of years ago when God renamed him Israel, we are encouraged by the hope offered to us by a savior who promises to be God with us. Next time you sing this hymn remember the meaning of these words and see if it brings even greater meaning to this glorious song.

Maybe my favorite Christmas hymn of all is "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" written by Charles Wesley. I remember watching the final scene from A Charlie Brown Christmas when I was a kid and ever since then it's been my favorite Christmas carol. There are so many powerful words and phrases in this song, but perhaps "born to raise each child of earth, born to give us second birth" is my favorite. Christ coming to raise us up, Christ being born for us is what Christmas is all about.

Finally, perhaps my favorite phrase in all Christmas songs comes from the fourth verse of "O Little Town of Bethlehem". These words seem not just to express the true meaning of Christmas, but the true meaning of the Incarnation and of Christianity in general: "O holy child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray; cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today". These words seem to encapsulate the whole Christian message, the entire spiritual journey in a single sentence. Christ wasn't just born 2016 years ago, but can be born in us each and every day of our lives. When we live into our calling to be little christs to the world, Jesus Christ is born anew. This Christmas season and in the year to come, may you pray that Christ cast out your sin and enter in, be born in you each day.

STEWARDSHIP

As we move into a new year we often make resolutions that have to do with our personal lives – we diet to lose weight, join a gym to get in shape, promise to eat healthier or spend more time with the family. The New Year is a good time to look at our attitudes about giving as well. So this year as you make your resolutions consider this article by Chick Lane called "Give First"...

I recently had two very interesting conversations on the same day. The first was with a pastor who asked, "Why has stewardship work gotten so much more difficult in recent years?" The second was with a different pastor who reported a conversation with a parishioner this way, "I was talking with a woman in the congregation recently, and she brought up her giving. She reported that their family was giving \$20 each week to the church and she felt this was about all they could afford to give. Their household income is well in excess of \$100,000, so they are giving less than one percent of their income, and they feel they are maxed out."

Obviously, these two conversations are connected. One reason stewardship work has gotten so much more difficult is that our culture of consumerism has enticed many people to make long term financial commitments that render generous giving almost impossible. For someone to report that giving less than one percent of their income has them maxed out, is, of course, absurd. What people should acknowledge is the choices they have made about the house(s) they will live in, the cars they will drive, the clothes they will wear, the lifestyle they will live. After all these choices have been made first, then there is nothing left to give to God's work in the world.

William T. Cavanaugh writes powerfully of this in "Being Consumed: Economics and Christian Desire". In two particularly powerful sentences, he writes, "Rather than turning away from material things and toward God, in consumer culture we plunge ever more deeply into the world of things ... One can always send a check to help feed the hungry, but one's charitable preferences will always be in competition with one's own endless desires."

When we think of Stewardship do we think about the importance of giving to God first, and living on the rest? In the face of our culture of consumerism, if people give what they have left after they have taken care of all their needs and wants, generous giving will simply never happen. The Bible speaks clearly of the importance of giving to God first. When Moses is on Mount Sinai (for the second trip), God says, "The best of the first fruits of your ground you shall bring to the house of the Lord your God." (Exodus 35:26) Just before the people enter the promised land, God says to the people, "When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground ... and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name." (Deuteronomy 26:1-2)



National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month

Origin of the term Alzheimer's disease dates back to 1906 when Dr. Alois Alzheimer, a German physician, presented a case history before a medical meeting of a 51-year-old woman who suffered from a rare brain disorder. A brain autopsy identified the plaques and tangles that today characterize Alzheimer's disease.



Alzheimer's disease is a progressive, degenerative disorder that attacks the brain's nerve cells, or neurons, resulting in loss of memory, thinking and language skills, and behavioral changes.

Alzheimer's disease is the most common cause of dementia, or loss of intellectual function, among people aged 65 and older. Alzheimer's disease is not a normal part of aging.
