

## GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR... From Pastor Jami Possinger

**F**rom the time my children were little, I can remember encouraging them to say "thank you"

when someone complimented them, gave them something or did something special for them. As most parents know – it is something we have to repeat again and again! Thinking about that reminded me that we never outgrow the need to thank people for the good things they do or say.



So this month I'd like to take a moment to thank you for your support of our congregation through the commitments cards you completed for 2018. Just to let you know... as of mid-December a total of **114** giving units filled out Estimate of Giving Cards totaling **\$242,356**. That amounts to **55.4%** of our total estimated income for 2018 which is **\$437,195**. This number exceeds the commitments made in 2017 by **\$37,346**. Additionally, **44** of these commitments were new – people who had never made a commitment to Hope before.

What does this mean for our congregation? Well... it means that although 55.4% of our giving is committed by those who completed Estimate of Giving Cards, we still need to cover the other \$194,839 of estimated income with giving that comes from everyone else. This is both a challenge and a leap of faith that members will step up and fill this gap. It is not too late to complete and submit an Estimate of Giving Card if you have not done so yet. Every penny – every dollar – every week – brings us closer and closer to overcoming that challenge – and we have faith members will take this seriously.

While we are all experiencing the "tightening of our belts" in our own homes – and here at Hope Lutheran Church – these commitments represent your faithfulness to God's work that happens through the ministries and missions of our congregation. So, thank you for your financial support, for all the ways you volunteer your time and talents, for the myriad ways you share Jesus' love with others, for allowing the light of Christ to shine through you! We are a blessed congregation in many ways – blessed to share our blessings in the name of Jesus Christ, the light of the world.


## PASTOR BRIAN'S PREPONDERANT BUSINESS

## WELLNESS TEAM Alcoholism and Alcohol Abuse

For most adults, moderate alcohol use is probably not harmful. However, about 18 million adult Americans have an



alcohol use disorder (AUD). This means that their drinking causes distress and harm. It includes alcoholism and alcohol abuse.

Alcoholism, or alcohol dependence, is a disease that causes

- Craving a strong need to drink
- Loss of control not being able to stop drinking once you've started
- Physical dependence withdrawal symptoms
- Tolerance the need to drink more alcohol to feel the same effect

With alcohol abuse, you are not physically dependent, but you still have a serious problem. The drinking may cause problems at home, work, or school. It may cause you to put yourself in dangerous situations, or lead to legal or social problems.

Another common problem is binge drinking. It is drinking about five or more drinks in two hours for men. For women, it is about four or more drinks in two hours.

Too much alcohol is dangerous. Heavy drinking can increase the risk of certain cancers. It can cause damage to the liver brain and other organs. Drinking during pregnancy can harm your baby. Alcohol also increases the risk of death from car crashes, injuries, homicide, and suicide.
