One of the most important realizations of my life came when it hit me that we tend to live our lives in chapters – for lack of a better word – and that some chapters must come to an end for other chapters to begin. We all are living several chapters at a time in different aspects of our lives, and each of those chapters helps to contribute to our overall lives. Right now, for example, I am experiencing – simultaneously – chapters in my professional life, in my friendships, in my relationships with family members, in my exercising, in my writing, in my reading – in virtually everything I do.



When I see life in this way, it helps me to deal gracefully with the changes that happen in my life. If I've grown to depend on a certain friendship, I'm able to deal gracefully with its loss when that friend moves away and we begin a new chapter – going from being friends who see each other regularly to being friends who are in touch from a distance. It was very helpful to me when I left my former congregation to come to Hope because it caused me to be able to search out a new beginning – to start a new chapter in my life.

Beginnings and endings – we all experience them. I think of them as we get ready to celebrate our graduates who will begin new chapters in their lives – and their parents whose lives will change as well. I think of beginnings as we welcome new members into the family of faith at Hope. I think of them as I perform a wedding service for a couple whose lives will be joined together. I think of them as I officiate at a funeral.

Everything has a beginning and an ending. Trying to deny this fact keeps us frustrated and afraid. Accepting this fact and living this truth can help us to face life with balance and poise. While I don't necessarily like loss or change, I find myself constantly looking around and wondering what will

end soon, not because I want things to end, but because it's important to know where the opportunities for growth will be. And I remember that the end of some things give rise to new chances – new opportunities – new life.

PASTOR BRIAN'S PREPONDERANT BUSINESS



On Pentecost Sunday, eighteen of our youth confirmed their Christian faith and became adult members of Hope Lutheran Church. Confirmation is an important time in a young person's life and I know our students were excited and proud that morning. Over the past two years, they've been a wonderful group to work with and I'm proud of them. They've been learning about the Bible, the Lutheran tradition, what it means to be a person of faith, and building relationships with each other, their teachers and mentors, and above all with God. And while Confirmation might seem like an end, the thing they'll soon realize is that Confirmation is much more like a beginning. It's a beginning to relating to God in new ways.

Confirmation doesn't mean you've "graduated" from church. And Confirmation doesn't mean you now have all the answers. Confirmation doesn't mean you've reached a point where it's time to stop learning about God and the Christian life. What Confirmation does mean is you are saying you're happy you're baptized. Confirmation means you want to keep exploring the questions of life, meaning, and God. Confirmation is all about going on the further journey: one that's less structured than before, and where the Holy Spirit leads the way. Some of our students may not be back for a while. They may need to wander a bit before coming back home. They may need to venture out and explore what it means to be human in other ways before they return to the faith of their childhood. Others may find new strength in coming to church and find deeper fulfillment in youth group, worship, or teaching Sunday School. Whatever the case, I know God will be with them.

Please keep our Confirmands in your prayers wherever life leads them in the coming years. And may you renew your own sense of discovery and devotion as you continue to explore these same questions of life, God, and the meaning of it all.

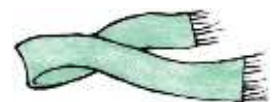
If Jesus had to print money, this is what he would print on it:

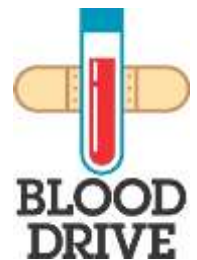

WELLNESS TEAM

June Is Cataract Awareness Month



22 million Americans are affected by cataracts, resulting in an annual estimated treatment cost of \$6.8 billion. "Friends for Sight"

wants you to be aware that you can help protect yourself from cataracts in a variety of ways.

First, remember to wear sunglasses, especially in the summer months when ultraviolet radiation is the strongest, as direct exposure to ultraviolet radiation can cause cataracts. Secondly, avoid smoking and alcohol, as both activities can increase your chance of cataract formation.

A cataract is a clouding of the eye's lens that leads to decreased vision. The lens is important because it focuses images onto the retina at the back of the eye. The image is then processed and sent to the brain. As a cataract matures, it often causes glare, as well as diminished contrast and color sensitivity.

Over time, if left untreated, cataracts lead to decreased vision. The good news is the risk of developing cataracts can be reduced.

While it is possible to reduce your risk of developing cataracts, unfortunately it is not 100 percent preventable. There are many factors that can contribute to the development of cataracts including: family history, medications, and age. For more information see the June Poster on the bulletin board.

“THIS CHANGES EVERYTHING”

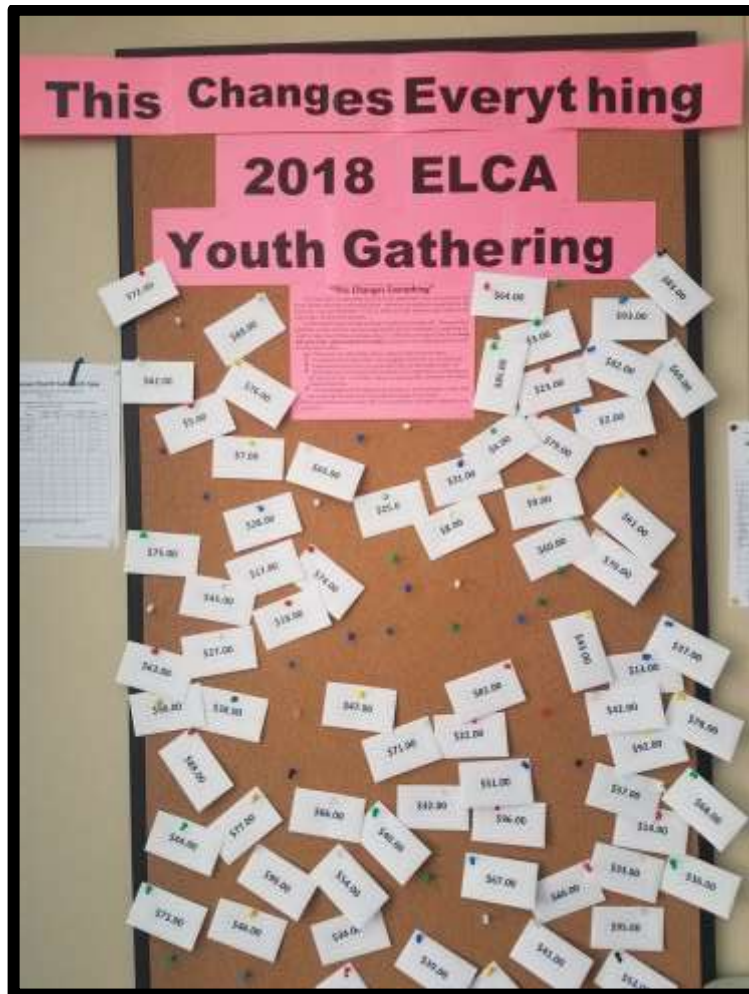
