Admittedly, I've seen articles on why people aren't coming to church - and there are some good reasons. But I'd like to share my top 10 reasons why you should be coming to church:

- 1. Our church like any church worth its salt has really good food on a regular basis.
- 2. Not all churches are after your money. We want you to have a healthy relationship with money. Sure, we need to pay the electric bill and the pastors and the music director - but money and the church is more about you than it is about the church. It's about your own relationship with money. Church can help you with that.
- 3. Our church is not anti-something. We are for people, for acceptance, for hospitality.
- 4. You've got a gift probably two or ten of them. Becoming involved in the ministry of our church will help you discover and use gifts you never even knew you had.
- church offers 5. Our paint-by-number opportunities to serve. Many people would like to help the poor, the hungry the homeless, the hurting - but they don't know how to get involved, how to make the time to be involved, or what they can do to really make a difference. Our church offers you ways to plug in to help those who need it most.
- 6. Taking a break from our hectic lives to come to church is accepting the gift of Sabbath. We don't take a Sabbath day and come to worship because we have time and have finished up everything that needs to be done. We take a Sabbath day because it is time to stop – and we are designed to stop, rest and reflect. Those don't are destined to crash and burn.
- 7. Bad stuff is going to happen in your life. It just is. Our church community cannot be everything to

- everyone in times of crisis, but when the bottom falls out of your world, it's great to have a community to lift you back up.
- 8. Bad stuff is going to happen in your life... part two. The time to build a relationship with God is not when life turns ugly, and you've run out of all other options. Attending worship regularly helps build a relationship with God and others that will give you a solid foundation when the winds blow and the storms come.
- 9. Coming to church doesn't mean you have no doubts about God or faith or religion. It means you have a place you can share with people who have their own doubts.
- 10. Jesus is really cool. Even if you don't know if you can believe in the whole Son-of-God thing even though those of us in church often do a lousy job of following him sometimes - come to church
- 11. to get to know Jesus. The more you get to know him, the more you'll understand why people call his way...The Way.

So on any given Sunday, when you feel like sleeping in or skipping church, remember these top ten reasons why you may want to change your mind and take that hour for you and God to reconnect.

As I write this message, we are preparing to leave for the National Youth Gathering next week, and when you receive this we will probably be in Houston! The National Youth

Gathering is an event like no other. When I had the privilege of going as a youth director with the church I served in Minnesota, I had the chance to see how absolutely transformative this experience can be, and I look forward to witnessing our youth have this experience as well. It is truly a mountaintop experience.

The Christian life is full of stories about mountaintop experiences. But in the Christian life it is not so much the mountaintop experiences that but our response to those matter most, experiences: what we do when we come back down the mountain. Incredible, life-changing experiences become most credible when they actually change our lives. We can and should create space for these experiences to happen: by going to gatherings, retreats, periods of solitude, or getting away in nature. These experiences nourish our faith and deepen our connection with God. And then we are called to return to the valley and serve God's children in need. It is in this coming down off the mountain that we transfer the energy of an amazing experience that transformed us and use it to transform the world around us.

I hope you have had experiences in your life where you encountered God on the mountaintop. But even if you have not, remember that God also works in little, seemingly insignificant moments to gently push us and help us grow on the journey of faith. I pray that as you reflect on transformative experiences in your life, you feel a sense of how much God has empowered you to follow the Spirit's call in your life. Please keep our youth in your prayers this month, that they might have a divinely inspired experience that they will never forget!

#### HOPE'S HELPING HANDS SHRIMP BOIL







#### **2018 SYNOD ASSEMBLY HIGHLIGHTS**

On Friday morning June 8, delegates and visitors

from congregations of the synod gathered for this year's assembly. After reports from Bishop Zeiser and the officers of the synod, the Assembly was addressed by Pastor President Gustavo Gómez Pascua



from our companion church, Iglesia Evangélica Luterana Unida, in Argentina and Uruguay. He shared some of the topics and concerns trending in his church. Many were similar to the challenges faced by congregations of the ELCA.

A highlight of the Friday afternoon session was the official reception of the Hmong Community Evangelical Lutheran Church as a congregation of our synod. In 1978, Saint Simeon's Lutheran Church in Philadelphia sponsored the first Hmong family from Laos to the Greater Philadelphia area, Mr & Mrs. Chou Koua Kue. Over the next three years, Saint Simeon would continue to sponsor over 15 Hmong families. In 1989, with the number of families reaching 34 families, the Saint Simeon's Council decided to allow and support the first Hmong service for the Hmong members. Finally, in February of 1996, the Hmong members at Saint Simeon's Lutheran Church formed and established the Hmong Community Evangelical Lutheran Church. Eventually the church migrated to St. John's Lutheran Church in Pottstown from June 2005 through June 2012. When all of its members relocated and settled within Berks & Lancaster counties, the church found a new home at Allegheny Evangelical Lutheran Church in 2012.

Mr. Nick Kiger, ELCA Associate Director for Mission Support, brought greetings on behalf of Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and the entire churchwide organization. Friday's program closed with a Festival Worship Service. Music for this and the other worship events was led by Dr. Michael Krentz. Bishop Zeiser preached on the story of Salome, mother of James and John, asking Jesus if her boys could sit at his right hand and his left. The bishop suggested that the earthly desire for grand buildings, and for social power and prestige in the community, are much like hoping to sit next to

Jesus. Jesus' response to Salome, and to the church of the 21st century is: "It will not be so among you." The bishop suggested that longing for the security that once came with grand church buildings and an honored place in the community is as misguided in our time as was longing to sit at Jesus' right or left sides in his time. This is a new way, God's way. The bishop then asked: "Is there room for a new way in our congregations?" And the answer is: "Yes." We are not doomed to fail, because we have the power and hope of the resurrection. An offering of \$2,859.92 was collected for the Young Adult in Global Ministry program.

On Saturday morning, June 9, the assembly approved the 2019 Spending Plan and the 2019 Compensation Guidelines for Pastors and Deacons. It also adopted two resolutions that were filed with the Committee of Reference and Counsel dealing with "Encouraging Congregational Statements Concerning the Closing of Congregations and the Disposition of Assets" and "Request for a Synodical Process to Determine Ministry Priorities."
