



GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

From Pastor Jami Possinger

Forgiveness. We expect it when we need it – but often find it hard to offer when we've been hurt by another person. Recently someone



came to me and asked how they were supposed to forgive a relative who caused a great rift in their family. As we sat discussing it – the person could just not see what it might look like to forgive. And that got me to thinking...

How do you explain to a child that's never been to the ocean what waves are like? You might fill a bathtub with water and splash it back and forth. That could teach the action of waves — but is that what waves on the ocean look like? You might take the child to a nearby river with a few rapids and show them how the foam collects at the bottom of a fall "like on top of a wave." But is that what a wave looks like? You might show them a 4x6 inch photograph. You might try to show them what waves sound like with a conch shell. But what about what waves look like as they come in and go out along the shore? What about their unending nature? What about the feel of the undercurrent of a wave going back to sea?

Truthfully - there is no substitute that can convey the scale and true nature of waves continually breaking on the shore - no analogies or to-scale models prepare children for their first trip to the beach. They can't grasp the greatness until they've seen it for themselves — they must experience it.

Isn't that also true when it comes to explaining what forgiveness looks like? No measure of teaching, preaching, and analogizing can make us really grasp what forgiveness means. We are creatures of experience. It takes a firsthand experience — the recognition of how God has forgiven us — before we can see how to forgive others. Jesus talked more about forgiveness and how we treat others than he talked about money.

Have **you** seen what God's forgiveness looks like in your life yet? Have you felt the powerful wave of relief that rushes over you when you are forgiven?

Is it possible that we can extend love and forgiveness if we don't understand how much Jesus has forgiven us? Maybe it's time to take your own "beach trip" and survey the vastness of God's incredible forgiveness that you have been offered. And then...step back and try to envision you offering that kind of forgiveness to one who has offended you.

PASTOR BRIAN'S PREPONDERANT BUSINESS

As Christians we believe in life after death. In our creeds we confess belief in the resurrection of the dead, and throughout our lives we hear and trust Jesus' promise of eternal life. I'm sure this isn't news to anyone.



Religions across the world have professed the same thing for thousands of years. But in modern times, as humanity has started to understand more and more about the world, belief in God or an afterlife has been criticized and heaven thought of as a fairy tale made up by those who fear death. Many of the world's top scientists believe consciousness is a product of the brain; and life, while still a mystery, will one day be explained as a purely physical But it is interesting to see the phenomenon. beginnings of a paradigm shift in the scientific community. As modern medicine gets even more successful at saving lives, we are starting to hear more and more reports of the afterlife from those who have died and been brought back to life. This phenomenon, called near-death experience (NDEs), is forcing us to rethink our understanding of the human brain and consciousness.

NDEs are experienced by people who have died and been resuscitated. Some of the most common are heart attack victims who die for several minutes before being revived by emergency responders. Others are people who were brain dead for a time, or suffered other serious health conditions. These people often report "seeing the light" or tell of outof-body experiences where they saw their body below them in the operating room. Some even report travelling through a tunnel, experiencing a life review, and having heavenly experiences where they meet deceased relatives. One of the most profound NDEs recorded is that of Dr. Eben Alexander, a neurosurgeon who was brain-dead in a coma for almost a week. Dr. Alexander was not a very religious man before, but following his experience has dedicated his life to studying the mysteries of life and death, consciousness, and the

universe. He tells of his experience in the book *Proof of Heaven*, which our centering prayer group just started reading.

Dr. Alexander ends the prologue to his book with these profound words: "My experience showed me that the death of the body and the brain is not the end of consciousness, that human experience continues beyond the grave. More important, it continues under the gaze of a God who loves and cares about each one of us and about where the universe itself and all the beings within it are ultimately going...now that I have been privileged to understand that our life does not end with the death of the body or the brain, I see it as my duty, my calling, to tell people about what I saw beyond the body and beyond this earth" (Alexander, pg. 9-10).

If you are fascinated by this subject as much as I am, I hope you check out this book or another like it. If you are afraid of the unknown, or simply curious about what happens, I hope you take the time to read about such experiences. It is a fascinating subject to study, and I imagine such knowledge will transform religion and spirituality in coming generations. Blessings to you this month as you reflect on life, death, and the mysteries of the universe!



Hope's Helping Hands members are looking forward to seeing many of you on August 18th. We thank everyone who has supported our events as we continue our ministries of helping others in need.




CHURCH SOFTBALL TEAM
