GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

From Pastor Jami Possinger

A long, long time ago – when I was in seminary – we had to take classes that had to do with Christian Education. At the time I was working in a church and was required to teach Sunday School as part of this Christian Education Class. That did not seem to be a problem at all – or so I thought. You see, I had never really taught a class before. Sure...I had participated in classes – just never led one. How hard could it be, I thought. After all, the children are only with you for an hour. So stepping into the classroom for the first time, I froze at the astonishing sight before me. Some children were jumping on tables - while others crawled under tables – most of them were screaming and yelling at the top of their lungs. Paper and bibles littered the floor. The classroom was in total chaos. My first thought was, ***“What have I gotten myself into?”***



It was a rotation model of Sunday School – meaning that each class rotated to different rooms to have music time, crafts, bible story time and science experiments – just not all on the same Sunday. The students moved from center to center, a plan that naturally invited noise. The first few weeks were a nightmarish battle for control. After losing my voice twice, my friend Linda, a veteran Home Economics teacher turned pastor, gave me some great advice. “The louder you are, the louder the children will be. If you want to get their attention, speak softly so they will have to be quiet in order to hear your voice.”

I put her advice into action the very next Sunday. As the children entered the classroom, I greeted each one with a silent smile. In my hands was a brightly wrapped box. Curious, they asked, “What is that?” I merely smiled and said nothing until all the children were seated. “I have a new plan,” I began. “Sometime during the morning, I will call your name once. If you hear my voice, you may choose one prize from our new prize box. If you don’t hear my voice, you will miss the opportunity to select a prize and I will call another student’s name.” It worked

like a charm! In a matter of weeks, my Sunday School class learned to listen for my voice above all others.

Stress in our lives comes when we allow the many voices in life to drown out the only voice that really matters - the voice of Jesus. Throughout his ministry Jesus didn’t scream the loudest to be heard – he didn’t place ads in the local publications telling everyone why he was right – he didn’t force his teachings on those who could not or would not hear. Jesus “spoke” to the people through his healings, his miracles, his walking alongside them, his listening to their hearts, his willingness to give his life. People heard Jesus because his was the voice that mattered. It still is.

The world tries very hard to drown out the voice of Jesus – through newspapers, TV, social media, peers - who try to get us to listen to those voices. Yet, we cannot listen to every voice we hear. We must be discerning. Jesus’ voice calls to us to live a way that might be a bit different but will be life-giving. It is a voice that says, “love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; AND your neighbor as yourself.” It is not always the easiest voice to hear in the constant din of our world and it is not always the easiest voice to obey. But a good question to ask ourselves always is: Whose voice do we hear?

PASTOR BRIAN'S PREPONDERANT BUSINESS



As we enter Holy Week and await the coming of Easter, I am again drawn to the mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. Of all the images in this story the most powerful one for me has always been Jesus praying in Gethsemane. His anguished prayer of deep surrender expressed in the words "Not my will but yours be done" is the epitome of love and trust. This has become my mantra during Lent, and on and off throughout the years. Surrender to God is a practice we can all take part in. It's an art. It's something Jesus lived fully, and something which we can all grow into as we walk the journey of this life.

Sometimes inviting God to direct our lives is joyful, full of energy and devotion. It's an exciting prayer that feels like you're finally doing what you're meant to do. You may not know what is to come, but you trust the mystery of the unknown and are overjoyed to know your future is in God's hands. Other times inviting God to direct you can be a little less comforting. Stepping forth into the unknown is a strange experience and we can feel overwhelmed or confused. Not knowing what is to come can be a difficult time—especially when we had plans that have suddenly changed. And then there are times like Jesus experienced. Times when he knew what was coming and did not want it. But nevertheless, Jesus asked God to give Him the strength to do God's will. Asking God for guidance in this situation isn't as much about discerning a decision of which path to follow but knowing the path and needing strength to do it. This type of surrender Jesus demonstrates is courageous, powerful, and miraculous.

Inviting God to direct our life situation starts with simply accepting this one moment as it is: fully embracing wherever we find ourselves and genuinely accepting it as reality manifesting itself in the here and now. By fully embracing our experience of the moment we are accepting life as it is and are preparing ourselves to accept what is to come. Even when you are not faced with major decisions it is a wonderful practice to daily

surrender your life to God. Inviting God's will to be done in our lives every morning and practicing surrender so that we are prepared for those significant moments like Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. I pray that we may all follow our Lord's example this month and always, as we pray with one voice: "Lord, not our will but yours be done."

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS – MARCH 2018

- ⚓ The steeple on the church has some cracks in it and is leaking into the ceiling of the sanctuary. Council approved a company to repair the cracks and repaint the steeple with a sealing paint to prevent further leaks.
- ⚓ In one of the winter snow storms, a large tree in the parsonage yard began to split and another one along the parking lot fell. Both trees were taken down.




