Well it's that time again – that time when we think about the year that is passing and look forward to a new year with all its possibilities. And it's that time of year when lots of people will make some kind of resolution for the New Year – some change in their life that, hopefully, will make it better – or more fulfilling – or healthier – or...you name it.

And here's what statistics show...80% of New Year resolutions fail by February and only 8% of people actually achieve their resolution. So I have a suggestion for us this year – just to shake things up a bit. 

## **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS DECEMBER 2018**


