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GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

As February begins I am trying to get my bearings again. December and January were incredibly busy months - with the many activities of the Advent and Christmas seasons and preparations for Lent. At our meeting in January, the Congregation Council began discussing "next steps" for our ministry moving forward and some staffing changes that were approved. The reality is that there are currently 40 positions open for pastors in Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod and not enough ordained pastors to fill them. Congregations that have a pastoral opening are being told that they may wait two years or more before their vacancy is filled. With that in mind, the council began to creatively consider some other options for providing ministry here at Hope.

Let me share with you what Council has decided:

- Pastor Don Hayn has been hired to assist with our visitation ministry and to preach occasionally. When he is available, he will be working one day a week picking up hospital and STAR member visitations. Pastor Hayn is retired from fulltime ministry and is a member of Hope.
- We will be advertising for a part-time Youth Ministry Program Coordinator. This person will oversee all aspects of our youth ministry programming for youth in grade 6 through grade 12. This includes monthly POW (Pizza on Wednesday) meetings, youth group outings, youth group fundraising and planning for the 2021 ELCA Youth Gathering.
- We will also be advertising for a part-time Confirmation Coordinator who will oversee all as-

pects of our two-year confirmation program. It will involve the administration of the confirmation and mentor programs, leading retreats and communicating and coordinating events with parents.

- The position of Youth Ministry Program Coordinator and Confirmation Coordinator can be a combined part-time position depending on the applicants' interest and experience.
- We expect to invite a guest preacher once a month so worshipers have the opportunity to hear different voices preaching.
- We will be having additional people leading worship on Sunday mornings as Worship Assistants - volunteers who will be trained to chant the liturgy, offer the prayers and lead other parts of the liturgy.

My office door is always open for you to come and ask questions, share concerns and offer your insights as we move forward in our ministry and I encourage you to stop in and see me. We are blessed to be a large and active congregation in a time when many congregations are struggling for survival and some closing their doors. It takes a village of people – both staff and volunteers – to do the ministry we are called to do in the name of Jesus in our small corner of the world. These are exciting times in our life together! Let's continue to be the people God is calling us to be doing the ministry that matters to God!


WOMEN OF FAITH UPCOMING EVENTS

Lenten Daily Food Challenge

So often we think about giving something up for Lent – a discipline the church calls fasting. Fasting, or giving up something, reminds us of the life that Jesus gave for us. Many people put aside a bad habit or a food that we love for the 40 days of Lent to keep the focus on Jesus. Another way to keep that focus is to add something to our lives – a kind of spiritual practice that changes our life for 40 days. This year the Women of Faith would like to challenge you to add a spiritual discipline to your life by collecting a food item for each day of the 40 days of Lent. Start with a sturdy box or a tote and then follow the schedule below and fill it up! Drop it off at the church by Palm Sunday – April 14th - when the food items will be blessed during worship and then donated to needy families in our congregation or to the Northampton Area Food Bank.
