# Council Highlights – March 2020

- Because of the social distancing restrictions, Council met virtually for the first time through a meeting space called Microsoft Teams. It worked well and gives us the option to use this for our upcoming meeting(s) as needed.
- Council discussed the worship time at Becky's Drive In and affirmed that we should continue to use this format for as long as we are able. We are so grateful to Becky's and the Deppe family for making this available to Hope and other churches.
- Church finances are holding steady and council thanks all of our members who continue to give generously through this unprecedented time we are going through. This is good news at a time when many churches are experiencing financial hardships.
- Property Committee reported that the steeple project has been completed by Steeplejacks of America. The steeple is identical to the old one so many members may not even notice it was replaced due to leakage.
- The Christian Education team reported that we will not be holding Sunday School for the rest of this school year to follow social distancing and keeping our children safe. This decision corresponds to the decision of the Pennsylvania governor to keep children out of school for the rest of the school year.
- Due to the coronavirus outbreak, First Communion will be postponed until September. This will give the class time to regroup and finish their preparations and joyously celebrate with the congregation.
- Council is looking into the Paycheck Protection Act for which churches are eligible. Trudy Mertz, treasurer, and Bill Lewis, finance committee chairperson, will take the lead on this application process.
- Hope's Youth group will have a virtual meeting on Friday, April 17 through a meeting space called Zoom. They will be doing a group Scavenger Hunt.



#### TAX SCAMS ARE IN FULL SWING



Tax fraud, such as scams involving phone calls, phishing, identity theft and dishonest accountants, often picks up early in the tax season, according to the IRS. Phone scams, one of the most prevalent types, have cost victims more than \$72 million since October 2013, according to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration.

Here's how to protect yourself:

- Don't ever give out personal information to anyone you don't know over the phone.
- The IRS will never make initial contact with taxpayers via an unsolicited phone call or e-mail. (The agency generally only contacts people by mail.) It doesn't call about unexpected refunds, ask for personal information like credit or debit card numbers over the phone or make threatening payment demands. If suspicious, taxpayers can request that the caller send a letter.
- Beware of e-mails or other communications posing as the IRS, promising a big refund or personally threatening you. Don't open attachments or click on links in suspicious e-mails.
- If a tax refund promised by a tax preparer seems too good to be true, it probably is. Ask some questions: Why is the refund coming out this way? Why am I getting such a large refund?
- Do research on tax preparers before working with them. Visit the <u>Better Business Bureau's</u> website to run a check. Look for disciplinary actions and the license status for credentialed preparers. (For CPAs, check with your state's Board of Accountancy. For attorneys, check with the state's Bar Association. For Enrolled Agents, you can <u>contact the IRS</u> or check the <u>directory</u>.) The IRS also <u>has some tips</u> on how to choose a tax professional

### SHE NAILED IT

"She Nailed It" is an all-women nail hammering competition founded by Habitat for Humanity of the Lehigh Valley in 2012 as a way to raise funds and empower women. This one-of-a-kind event brings together teams of women from all industries and walks of life to raise vital funds for Habitat's Homeownership Program, and address the affordable housing crisis faced by women and single mothers both locally and globally. Each team is comprised of four women who will attend the event on **July 20** and compete relay-style against the clock to hammer one nail per person, per round into a 2x6 board suspended across sawhorses. **Hope's Hammering Hands** is comprised of four women from Hope Lutheran Church, who are members of the mission team, Hope's Helping Hands. Over the past few years, we have worked on the Faith Build projects sponsored by Thrivent and Lehigh Valley Habitat for Humanity.

Resources to help leaders and members stay connected and resilient during COVID-19

*"I arise early in the morning and I cry out to you, I hope for your word. W* My eyes are open in the night watches, that I may meditate upon your promise." (Psalm 119:147-148)

During this time of pandemic many are seeking resources to support daily prayer in the home. As we are physically separated from supportive Christian communities, it becomes increasingly important to mark our days and hours with prayer. As noted in *Keeping Time*, "Prayer is a gift of access for all the baptized and those seeking to live in a relationship with the God who has spoken, is speaking, and has promised to speak through Jesus, the living Word, and the Spirit, who helps us pray with sighs too deep for words as we ponder the scriptures, which still speak to us" (*Using Evangelical Lutheran Worship: Keeping Time*, p. 148).

To support prayer practices in the home, we have provided these simplified forms of Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and Night Prayer\*. In addition to these three times of day we have provided Responsive Prayer, a simple order that may be adapted to a variety of times and contexts. Each of these services are adapted from *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*. In addition, a resource of other Prayers and Blessings for Daily Use including a collection of table prayers and prayers for various situations is also available.



It is our prayer that these resources can be an aid to your daily prayer time. May the Spirit fill you with the peace of the Risen Christ in these days and always.



#### SUMMARY:
