GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

The other day someone said to me, "It is such a shame that our church is closed." I looked at the person and replied, "The church is not closed. We may not be worshiping in our sanctuary at the moment – but the church is not closed." In fact - things at the church are busy – it is almost hard to think we are still in the pandemic as activities inside and outside the church are keeping us occupied.

- Many of our programs are up and running Sunday School, Confirmation, Adult Christian Education Classes, Bible Study, Book Club, Committee meetings, Women of Faith.
- Worship is ongoing and we continue to morph and change as needed. We are working on upcoming All Saints Sunday to keep worship meaningful and lively at the drive-in and in the parking lot. Christmas is looming and we are actively working on the services for that joyous time in the life of the church.
 - Every week we offer a service in Hope's parking lot on Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m. and a service at Becky's Drive-In on a Monday evening. That service will be changing to Saturday nights at 6:30 p.m. in late November. We also put our recorded service on our website for members to watch from the comfort of their homes.
- The pre-school is back with a limited number of students, meeting in Kuntz Hall each day so they can spread out and stay safe.
- Although the Senior Center is not open for clients to eat lunch in the building, Northampton County is delivering meals to some of those people who usually attended.
- Meals On Wheels is picking up meals at Hope each day and delivering them to seniors in the area.

- On Sunday, October 18, we began a 5-week Stewardship series leading us up to Gratitude Sunday on November 15 called *Living Generously*.
- The Annual Meeting is set to be held in Hope's parking lot on November 8 at 10:30 a.m. We will elect new members to our congregation council and nominating committee and review and approve a 2021 budget.
- The Relaunch Team has met and has begun to look at how we will successfully get back into the facility at some point in time.
- Hope's Soup Group is planning to start their soup making and deliveries to STAR members (seniors with transportation and accessibility restrictions) in the month of November.
- The Youth Group is actively doing fundraising and holding monthly activities despite the limitations they face.
- On Sunday, October 18 we hosted a Zoom new member class and will receive 10 new members at the services on October 25.
- We continue to provide pastoral care as we are able through funerals, weddings and baptisms as well as visits and phone calls to members.

If people say the church is closed - they are very wrong. While we may not be back in our building for worship - we have never stopped being the church. Many thanks to all of our incredible and creative members who help to make "church" happen both in our facility and in the world!

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS—October 2020

- Hope's finances are holding steady thanks to the regular contributions from our members. Council is very grateful that members have kept up with their commitments and offerings so that the work of the congregation can continue.
- The Budget Team is actively working on the 2021 Budget which will be available to the congregation on Sunday, November 1. This will be a budget that has not been reviewed by council. The council will meet on November 4 to review the proposed budget and send it to the congregation at the annual meeting.
- The Annual Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, November 8 at 10:30 a.m. in the Hope parking lot. Members will tune into FM 106.5 and be able to stay in their cars for the meeting. A quorum of 50 members is required to hold this meeting. Refreshments will be served by the council. Hand-held microphones will be available for members to ask questions or make comments. The agenda will include:
 - Elections for the Congregation Council and the Nominating Committee
 - ♦ Approval of the proposed 2021 Budget
 - ♦ Any matters for the good of the congregation
- Gratitude Sunday is scheduled for Sunday, November 15. This is the Sunday we make our commitment to the ministry we do at Hope Lutheran. Estimate of Giving Cards will be available at the services on November 8 and 15. Members are encouraged to return their commitments as they enter the parking lot of Becky's Drive-In, drop them off at the church office or mail them into the church.
- Council has appointed a Relaunch Team consisting of some members of council and others who help with worship services. They have developed a survey which will be going out to congregation members to discern preferences for worship and reentering the building for worship in the future.

Summary Report of Annual Synod Assembly

Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA October 16, 18, 23 and 24, 2020



With Covid-19 still lingering, a decision was made to hold the Annual Synod Assembly as an online event rather than having hundreds of individuals gather at Kalahari Resort. This entailed a great deal of preparation to ensure that voting members would be able to cast their ballots online. The synod offered several pre-sessions for participants to practice using the technology needed to "attend" the synod assembly which then occurred over two weekends. The focus of this synod meeting was the nomination of candidates and election of a new Bishop for the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod. Other business included financial reports and presentation of the 2021 budget, various video presentations of mission projects, a mission district caucus meeting, and committee reports.

On October 16, the assembly opened with a worship service highlighted with Bishop Zeiser preaching. This was followed by the introduction of the process to be used for the election of a bishop, and the first ballot voting. To be nominated for the position of Bishop an individual must only be a rostered leader of ELCA. The first ballot produced 78 individuals who were nominated, including Pastor Jami. By the time we

reconvened on Sunday afternoon, October 18, this list had been reduced to 19 nominees. The remaining 59 individuals had withdrawn their names from consideration.

The 2nd ballot was conducted, and the 19 nominees were then reduced to 7 individuals. The 7 remaining candidates were required to submit a bio to be published on the synod website, and be recorded giving a two-minute introductory speech as well as being recorded responding to six pre -determined questions that focused on the areas of: change, vision, service, organization and welcoming that were derived from the Synod surveys that were conducted in February 2020. All voting members were given the opportunity to view the recorded sessions with the 7 candidates and were able to review the submitted bios on Friday, October 23.

On Saturday, October 24, every mission district had the opportunity to conduct a one hour zoom session to discuss the 7 candidates and their qualifications to become the next Bishop of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA. The 3rd ballot was then conducted, and the top three vote recipients were then asked to report to the Synod Office so that they could give a 3 minute statement on a posed question regarding how they have handled conflict in the past. The finalists were Reverend Chris deForest, Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Kutztown, Reverend Ryan Hersch, Pastor of Atonement Lutheran Church in Wyomissing, and Reverend Charles Grube, Pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Dallas. Following their statements, a 4th ballot was conducted, again with online voting. None of the candidates received the required 60% of the votes needed for election, so the two candidates with the most votes, Reverend deForest and Reverend Hersch, were then placed on the 5th ballot. The 5th ballot required a simple majority of the vote to be elected and the results were Reverend deForest receiving 260 votes while Reverend Hersch received 222 votes. Bishop-Elect deForest was given the opportunity to address the Synod Assembly prior to final reports and the closing of the Assembly.

As representatives of Hope Church this was a very educational experience for both of us. It gave us the opportunity to listen to others express their concerns regarding local, regional, and national issues that are currently on the forefront both within the church and around secular issues that are dividing our country. This experience allowed us to see and hear about some of the great work and missions that are being conducted by various congregations thru out our Synod. As the Synod Assembly was conducted as an online event, it limited the opportunities to ask questions or
