GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

I am looking back – remembering what I was doing and thinking one year ago. I have to admit that it feels a bit surreal. After all, one year ago I was diligently planning our 2020 Lenten services. The theme back then was "A Fresh Look at Stories from the Old Testament" and I was excited to share stories and reflections with you. We traveled together for three weeks before the Covid19 pandemic shuttered our lives and our worship space and our mid-week Lenten services. Most of us thought it would be a matter of weeks – not months – and certainly not one year. But here we are almost a year later and, through these difficult times, we have found ways to worship together, share the gospel of Jesus Christ, build our faith and serve our community.

And now – though still in the midst of the pandemic - we are getting ready for another Lenten season and I am excited once again. Beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 17 we will be gathering each Wednesday in our parking lot at 7:00 p.m. for mid-week Lenten services. We will also meet in the parking lot on Maundy Thursday, April 1 at 7:00 p.m. The services will be "live" and we will be using a favorite liturgy, Holden Evening Prayer. Participants will tune into FM 106.5 as we share our lives and faith during Lent.

The theme this year is "Characteristics of Disciples." Over the seven weeks of Lent we will focus on the unique attributes of the people who follow Jesus – disciples like you and me. Each week we will explore - and experience - seven characteristics of discipleship:

Wednesday, February 17 – Ash Wednesday – Disciples Are Forgiving

Wednesday, February 24 – Disciples Are Hopeful

Wednesday, March 3 - Disciples Are Prayerful

Wednesday, March 10 – Disciples Are Filled With Gratitude

Wednesday, March 17 – Disciples Are Obedient

Wednesday, March 24 – Disciples Are Transformed

Thursday, April 1 – Maundy Thursday – Disciples Serve Others

I hope you will take time during this holy season to join me in worship, prayer and reflection – for that is what disciples do. Let us come together in faith – for that is what disciples do. Let us not let this pandemic daunt our lives – for that is what disciples do.



The next book club book is <u>Countdown 1945 The Extraordinary Story of the Atomic Bomb</u> by Chris Wallace. We will meet, via Zoom, on Tuesday, February 16 at 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. The cost of the book is \$14.50

Synopsis: April 12, 1945: After years of bloody conflict in Europe and the Pacific, America is stunned by news of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's death. In an instant, Vice President Harry Truman, who has been kept out of war planning and knows nothing of the top-secret Manhattan Project to develop the world's first atomic bomb, must assume command of a nation at war on multiple continents—and confront one of the most consequential decisions in history. *Countdown 1945* tells the gripping true story

of the turbulent days, weeks, and months to follow, leading up to August 6, 1945, when Truman gives the order to drop the bomb on Hiroshima. In *Countdown 1945*, Chris Wallace, the veteran journalist and anchor of *Fox News Sunday*, takes readers inside the minds of the iconic and elusive figures who join the quest for the bomb, each for different reasons: the legendary Albert Einstein, who eventually calls his vocal support for the atomic bomb "the one great mistake in my life"; lead researcher J. Robert "Oppie" Oppenheimer and the Soviet spies who secretly infiltrate his team; the fiercely competitive pilots of the plane selected to drop the bomb; and many more.

NEW PAVILION ROOF

In December, Reece Anderson completed his Project. After planning and ordering materials, he organized a group of fellow scouts and friends to remove the old roof and install a new roof on the pavilion.





Ryan McCutcheon researched, designed and built a Gaga ball pit (*Gaga is a form of dodgeball. Players start in a "pit" hitting and rolling a ball with their hand to eliminate other players.*) for his Eagle Project.



*Eagle Scout is the highest achievement or rank attainable in the BSA program. Requirements include earning at least 21 merit badges and an extensive service project that the Scout plans, organizes, leads, and manages. The Scout must also go through a lengthy review process. Only about four percent of Scouts achieve this rank.
