### GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

We are in a marathon, not a sprint. I have heard that said many times over that past months. From political figures – to the head of the CDC - to local health care professionals - even the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod bishop used the term in a recent communiqué. Of course, all these people are referring to the Coronavirus pandemic and the many difficult decisions that come from trying to guess what comes next and how we will handle our lives in the meantime.

The church is no more immune to the ravaging effects of this new delta variant than the rest of our world. And so we find ourselves trying to navigate our worship and activities in the midst of this ongoing storm. It has not been an easy road to travel and we have hit many bumps along the way. Our leadership has faced many tough choices as we deliberate our options which continue to change on a regular basis. Paramount to our decisions is the health and safety of our members and any others who might use this building.

It is with this in mind that we can announce our Fall/Winter worship and Sunday School calendar. Beginning Sunday September 12 Hope will move to our regular worship schedule – with a few modifications.

- The 8 AM worship service will be held in the sanctuary. We will transmit that service into the parking lot for those who prefer not to be in-person. Masks will be required.
- Sunday School and Confirmation will meet from 9:15 a.m. 10:15 a.m. in their classrooms **beginning** Sunday September 19. Masks will be required.
- The 10:30 a.m. worship service will be held in the Hope parking lot for the time being.
- A service will also be available online on our website: hopecherryville.org.

We continue taking this cautious approach to ensure that our more vulnerable populations - including the unvaccinated and children - are safe and protected. Moving forward – we will monitor the status of our area, CDC guidelines and Pennsylvania recommendations and make adjustments to Hope's protocols as appropriate.

It is no light matter — making decisions for people other than yourself or your own family - and our leadership has taken this very seriously and acted deliberately after much discussion. I hope that when you see our council members you will thank them for their dedication to Hope. Your patience as we try to safely move into our facility has been much appreciated. Remember — we are in a marathon — not a sprint. We will get through these challenging times and look back at the wonderful things we have continued to accomplish as a congregation. God is working through us to spread light and hope to the world!

## **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS—August 2021**

- Council received the good news that Jennifer Knouss has accepted the position of Confirmation Coordinator beginning August 1, 2021.
- ◆ July finances were down in comparison to July 2020. While this might be a summer slump, the council closely tracks year to year and month to month giving and expenses. We are grateful to our members who are continuing to keep up with their commitments for 2021 and encourage everyone to be a regular giver.
- ◆ Leslie Daniel was appointed to the Mutual ministry Committee to serve a three-year renewable term.
- ◆ The Fall/Winter worship schedule will begin on Sunday, September 14. Because of the increasing numbers of Covid19 cases we are taking a cautious approach to our schedule – providing opportunities for those who wish to worship in person as well as in our parking lot. Our worship schedule will be as follows:
  - \* 8:00 a.m. worship in the sanctuary each week. We will transmit the service to the parking lot as well.
  - Beginning September 19 Sunday School and Confirmation will meet in their classrooms at 9:15 a.m.
  - 10:30 a.m. worship will be in the parking lot for the time being.
  - \* Communion will continue to be offered on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month at both services.
  - \* We will continue to offer a service on our website weekly.
- ◆ Council approved the plans submitted by the Preschool to return in September. Students will be in their classrooms this year with many precautions in place for their safety during the pandemic.
- Council approved a request from the ELCA Youth Gathering Team to hold a fundraiser at the Seemsville Restaurant on Thursday, September 16. Hope members are encouraged to dine at the restaurant and a percentage of the sales will be designated for our youth. Look for details in the newsletter and bulletins.
- Council approved a request from Amy Nichols and Thrivent to host a coffee hour in September outside in the covered drive area.
- ◆ Council wishes to remind people that masks are required in the building regardless of your vaccination status. Please help to keep our children and vulnerable members safe.




### YARD SALE

### **SHARE - A - MEAL**

At times a medical issue can make it difficult to prepare meals while dealing with recovery. Share -A-Meal can help, providing meals 2 –3 times per week for about 2–3 weeks. We can still use additional volunteers for this ministry. Volunteers will be asked to make and deliver one meal. The meal that you prepare can be anything from a soup to a pasta type meal to a casserole to a meat ,potato, and vegetable type meal. #### SUMMARY:
