GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

We are living and working and attending school in an incredibly tenuous time. We spent months sheltering in our homes – fearful of an unseen enemy. Our leaders tried to grasp the enormity of the situation and yet respond compassionately. Researchers and scientists worked day and night to find a vaccine that would halt the spread of this virus. A war in the Ukraine has rocked the free world and pushed us back to the realization that war – and nuclear war – is an ever-present danger. Innocent civilians are being slaughtered. Gas prices are up the economy is shaky. We are heading into a political primary season that may again divide our nation. And in the church – we are trying to return to normal – hoping our members, who have not been present for a while, will return as well.

What will come next? What will the future hold? When will we move forward from this? These are questions we are asking – these are questions the world is asking. And I don't have the answers – but I do have hope.

Vaclav Havel – the first president of the Czech Republic – wrote this: "I am not an optimist, because I am not sure that everything ends well. Nor am I a pessimist because I am not sure that everything ends badly. I just carry hope in my heart."

Hope is the feeling that life and work and faith have meaning. You either have it or you don't - regardless of the state of the world that surrounds you. Life without hope is an empty, boring, and useless life. I cannot imagine that I could strive for something if I did not carry hope in me - and I am thankful to God for this gift. It is as big as life itself.

Easter is a season of hope. When all seemed dead – when Jesus seemed to have left his disciples abandoned – when the stone was rolled in front of the tomb – hope seemed to be destroyed. But three days later when the women came and saw an empty tomb, and Jesus appeared to his disciples – hope was restored. And we learned that even in the midst of unbearable suffering and loss and fear and uncertainty – God is with us. That is hope.

Whether you believe that hope is a gift from God or simply something that is innate within us – we cannot live without it. May you and I have hope – hope that we are part of the solution – hope that there

is a cure for this pandemic and war and violence – hope that a brighter day is on the horizon. And may you and I be the hope that others need to see.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS-April 2022

 Hope is still in need of one male delegate to the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod Assembly which will be held on June 10-11, 2022. The assembly will be virtual so delegates can log in from their home computers/laptops/ tablets. Currently Stacey Burke and Kim Roth are our two female delegates.



- The Youth Group will be hosting a Dine and Donate at Seemsville Pub on May 19 and are encouraging members to dine out that evening. A percentage of the proceeds will go straight to the youth group.


BOOK BUDDIES

Lydia Quixano Pérez lives in the Mexican city of Acapulco. She runs a bookstore. She has a son, Luca, the love of her life, and a wonderful husband who is a journalist. And while there are cracks beginning to show in Acapulco because of the drug cartels, her life is, by and large, fairly comfortable.

Even though she knows they'll never sell, Lydia stocks some of her all-time favorite books in her store. And then one day, a man enters the shop to browse and comes up to the register with a few books he would like to buy - two of them her favorites. Javier is erudite. He is charming. And, unbeknownst to Lydia, he is the *jefe* of the newest drug cartel that has gruesomely taken over the city. When Lydia's husband's tell-all profile of Javier is published, none of their lives will ever be the same.



Forced to flee, Lydia and eight-year-old Luca soon find them-

selves miles and worlds away from their comfortable middle-class existence. Instantly transformed into migrants, Lydia and Luca ride *la bestia* - trains that make their way north toward the United States, which is the only place Javier's reach doesn't extend. As they join the countless people trying to reach *el norte*, Lydia soon sees that everyone is running from something. But what exactly are they running to?

American Dirt will leave readers utterly changed. It is a literary achievement filled with poignancy, drama, and humanity. It is one of the most important books for our times.

Already being hailed as "a *Grapes of Wrath* for our times" and "a new American classic", Jeanine Cummins' *American Dirt* is a rare exploration into the inner hearts of people willing to sacrifice everything for a glimmer of hope.


