GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

The other night Mitch was away and, after a long day, I let myself go limp in front of the TV. The blur of activity that day had exhausted me - so a complete mind and body check-out seemed in order. I soon found myself watching "Finding Nemo" – a movie I just love and never get tired of one more viewing.

If you have ever seen the movie, you will remember the part where the all-important scuba mask slips down, down, down into the dark gorge. Marlin the fish, panics and goes after it - only to swim frantically back out of the darkness. Then the crazy blue fish with a short-term memory problem frolics her way into that same blackness with nary a care. A moment later Dory comes back to encourage Marlin. "Hey, Mr. Grumpy Gills," she says, "When life gets you down, you know whatcha gotta do?" "No, I don't want to know watcha gotta do." "Just keep swimming! Just keep swimming!"

Not that I'm taking lessons from a digitized blue fish - but Dory's attitude reminded me what perseverance should look like. It's not that sitting on the couch and taking a break was a bad thing in itself - but my can't-go-any-farther attitude was. That atti-

tude indicated that I was slogging away in my own strength and had run out of energy - without looking to God for help. Wallowing in my exhaustion seemed so much easier.

But the truth is - when life gets you down and you're exhausted - God's faithfulness has the chance to shine through. The end of my rope is the beginning of God's grace made evident in my life - providing the strength to "keep swimming" even though I'm exhausted. And God gets the praise because I know that strength is no longer something in me. God's mercy and love are enough to keep me moving in the direction that God encourages me to go. My responsibilities are just one more way to bring me to my knees and let God refresh me with God's grace. After that - I can keep going - and even sing while I'm at it.

The Bible is full of reminders of God's faithfulness to believers - and the stories all end with humanity's reliance on God. In the end - it's when we are weak that God makes us strong. So... Just keep swimming! Just keep swimming!

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS-May 2022

- Council approved the suggestion from the Worship and Music Committee to move to one service during the summer. The service will be held at 9:00 a.m. Communion services will continue to be the second and fourth Sundays of the month. The summer schedule will begin on Sunday, June 12 and continue through Sunday, September 4. We will move back to two services on Sunday, September 11.
- Intinction Communion will begin again as soon as we have used most of the small cups we are currently using for communion. These cups have a use-by date, and we do not want to simply throw them away.
- ◆ The delegates to the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod Assembly which will be held on June 10-11, 2022, are Stacey Burke, Kim Roth and Mitch Possinger.
- Council approved the purchase of the new hymnal supplement, All Creation Sings. Sponsorship envelopes will be made available to the congregation as soon as possible so that members can purchase hymnals in memory/honor of/celebration of people they choose to honor. The cost of the hymnal is \$15.00.
- Council discussed concern from members about "returning to normal worship." A consideration members may not be aware of is that to return to some of our "normal" practices we need additional worship volunteers (ushers, greeters, communion assistants, altar guild members, choir members, etc.) Doug Daniel volunteered to address this during a temple talk in the next few weeks.
- Council is addressing the concern of tidying up the building with some storage boxes for collections in the narthex and cleaning out the storage room in the lower level in the near future.



- * AV Operator


And come Fall we also need:

Eva Traube Abrams, a semi-retired librarian in Florida, is shelving books one morning when her eyes lock on a photograph in a magazine lying open nearby. She freezes; it's an image of a book she hasn't seen in sixty-five years—a book she recognizes as *The Book of Lost Names*.

The accompanying article discusses the looting of libraries by the Nazis across Europe during World War II—an experience Eva remembers well—and the search to reunite people with the texts taken from them so long ago. The book in the photograph, an eighteenth-century religious text thought to have been taken from France in the waning days of the war, is one of the most fascinating cases. Now housed in Berlin's Zentral - und Landesbibliothek library, it appears to contain some sort of code, but researchers don't know where it came from—or what the code means. Only Eva holds the answer—

but will she have the strength to revisit old memories and help reunite those lost during the war?



As a graduate student in 1942, Eva was forced to flee Paris after the arrest of her father, a Polish Jew. Finding refuge in a small mountain town in the Free Zone, she begins forging identity documents for Jewish children fleeing to neutral Switzerland. But erasing people comes with a price, and along with a mysterious, handsome forger named Rémy, Eva decides she must find a way to preserve the real names of the children who are too young to remember who they really are. The records they keep in *The Book of Lost Names* will become even more vital when the resistance cell they work for is betrayed and Rémy disappears.

An engaging and evocative novel reminiscent of *The Lost Girls of Paris* and *The Alice Network, The Book of Lost Names* is a testament to the resilience of the human spirit and the power of bravery and love in the face of evil.
