GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

This past Sunday we returned to offering communion by intinction – after two and a half years of using pre-packaged cups that contained a wafer and some grape juice. I was looking forward to doing one more thing that would take us back to what we knew as normal. What I wasn't prepared for was the emotions that I felt as I said the words to everyone who stepped up to my communion station, "the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ given and shed for you." Honestly, I was overwhelmed being able to look our members in the eye and saying those words that conveyed the grace of God.

I have been offering a hug to folks as they leave worship as another "get-back-to-normal" thing because I desperately missed getting and giving hugs during the pandemic — and I realized that many of you did as well. It is such a joy to make that kind of connection with people.

Leo Buscaglia - also known as the "The Love Dr." and "Dr. Hug" - was an American author, motivational speaker, and a professor in the Department of Special Education at the University of Southern California. While teaching at USC, he was moved by a student's suicide to contemplate human disconnectedness and the meaning of life and began a noncredit class he called Love 1A. This became the basis for his first book, titled simply Love. He went on to write another 13 best-selling books on loving and human relationships. I've read several his books and have enjoyed their insights.

He once wrote, "Too often we underestimate the power of a touch, a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, an honest compliment, or the smallest act of caring, all of which have the potential to turn a life around."

It's true - we do underestimate the power of these things. I'm not sure why. Maybe we just think that people don't really need our input in their lives - or maybe we're just used to people not encouraging us - or sharing kind words or compliments with us. As I've aged, I've learned how important a hug or smile or compliment is. And I certainly don't want to overestimate the power of things like these. After all, I'm not going to solve anyone's problems with a listening ear, or completely turn their lives around with a smile. But we should always keep in mind that the things that turn people's lives around generally are a bunch of things together - and my smile or compliment will be a part of a greater whole, a whole that gives someone hope or peace, and that would be incomplete without my contribution. So - I give the compliment or the kind word - a hug or a smile - because I truly believe that it is better to err on the side of the positive than the negative.

Which makes me wonder...how many opportunities do we have each day to make this sort of contribution to others? And...how many of those opportunities do we actually take advantage of? The truth is that our ordinary lives are filled with opportunities to bless others. The power of a single glance or an encouraging smile must never be underestimated.

Leo Buscaglia spent much of his life teaching us about the power of loving one another and that we do have power to help others - to make them feel good about life and living. And if we do have that kind of power in our hands, don't you think we should use it more?

To be eligible for Hope's college scholarship money you must:


- Be attending an accredited college/university full time

His mother long gone, his father recently deceased, and the family farm foreclosed upon by the bank, Emmett's intention is to pick up his eight-year-old brother, Billy, and head to California where they can start their lives anew. But when the warden drives away, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm have hidden themselves in the trunk of the warden's car. Together, they have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future, one that will take them all on a fateful journey in the opposite direction—to the City of New York. Spanning just ten days and told from multiple points of view, Towles's third novel will satisfy fans of his multi-layered literary styling while providing them an array of new and richly imagined settings, characters, and themes.

The congregation is also invited to attend our thank you coffee hour style reception on **July 31** immediately after the service. We thank you for your support!


VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL July 11-15

SUMMARY:

Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of May by \$111.33, and for the year 2022, income exceeded expenses by \$10,085.04, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$255,360.23. Last year the net income for the same period was \$51,559.08 (included PPP Loan Forgiveness of \$36,872.23) with a balance of \$239,938.78.
