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GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR...

Every year that passes, it seems like the summer is getting shorter and September comes quicker. This year has been no different. There was a time when the summer months in the church were a bit slower – but no longer. And yet, the advent of September brings with it a feeling of newness and starting fresh.

So - what will feel new and fresh at Hope? We will move to our regular schedule of worship on September 11 and welcome the return of Sunday School and Confirmation. Sunday School is fully staffed and will start off with a carnival for the children – fun to include a bounce house, games snacks and reconnecting with friends and making new friends. Adult Sunday School will commence with AJ Szwast leading that group again this year.

Confirmation students will be back in their classrooms and our confirmation coordinator is adding back some field trips to a local synagogue, a Baptist church and a Roman Catholic church – as well as outreach events. Confirmation students will also be volunteering to serve as acolytes and crucifers during worship.

Dave Ziegler tells me that our small worship band will continue through the month of September so worship will remain lively. We will continue to celebrate communion on the second and fourth Sundays of each month. And we will be hosting new member classes in the fall for people who are interested in joining our family of faith.

As good as all this sounds a lot like normal – doesn't it? But there have been some changes in the life of Hope as we are coming out of these past few years of the Covid19 pandemic. Here is what I have noticed:

- Some of our members have not returned to inperson worship and instead are watching worship online or attending via the transmission to our parking lot. To serve those people, we will continue to offer both options.
- Many of our worship volunteers have not returned since we are back in our building. That means we are in need of people to help us fill a variety of volunteer positions. During the summer months we were able to cover these positions because we only had one service. Once we go back to two services each Sunday, we are finding ourselves short of volunteers.

How can YOU help? Take a moment and think about the people who you don't see in church on a Sunday morning. Reach out to them through a visit or phone call and let them know we miss them and hope they return to worship with us. It will take all of us to contact our many members – so do your part. If you need a phone number, just call the church office and Jen Sommers can assist you.

Prayerfully consider volunteering as a worship volunteer. Volunteers sign up for the day and service that is convenient for them through a Sign-up Genius online program. You pick the dates and times you are available to help. We are in need of:

Ushers who pass out bulletins, assist people who have questions, and count the offering after each worship service. You may have noticed that we have not been passing the offering plate due to not having a sufficient number of ushers. No experience necessary!

- The Congregation Council and Finance Committee continue to monitor the financial health of the congregation on a monthly basis. Many thanks to those who are making regular contributions to the ministry we do here at Hope.

- **Lectors** who read the lessons from the pulpit each week. Lessons are emailed to you in advance of your assigned date.

- Altar Guild members who set up for communion, set up for baptisms, place the hymn numbers on the hymn boards, straighten the pews after worship.

Historically, our instrumental ensembles have no long-term commitments. The group organizes for a specific event and rehearses 3 to 4 times before playing the service. Instrumentalists could play any or all of the scheduled services. While limited resources may impede the progress of a vocal choir, instrumental ensembles can be organized around specific instrumentation for a specific event, i.e. a flute quartet or saxophone choir or brass ensemble.

BIBLE STUDY




Bible Study is held in Kuntz Hall at 10 a.m. every Thursday. In addition Bible Study will still be offered via Zoom. Call the office for more information.

SUMMARY:

Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of July by \$4,909.67, and for the year 2022, income exceeded expenses by \$4,108.17, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$249,383.36. Last year the net income for the same period was \$43,434.18 (which included PPP Loan Forgiveness of \$36,872.23) with a balance of \$231,851.88.
