Maybe it's the busiest time of the year – or the most hectic – or the costliest – or, for some, the saddest. Whatever this Advent/Christmas season is for you let me make a suggestion. Take time to take care of YOU. Don't let the hustle and bustle of the season drown out the reason we actually celebrate Christmas.

And how will you do that? By making time in your schedule to pay attention to what is the most important aspect of the season. Join me during the four weeks of Advent for a mid-week series focused on traveling to Bethlehem and - on the way - finding the faith, the promise, the peace and the Christ of Christmas. Each Wednesday beginning on November 30 we will use Holden Evening Prayer and the gospel of Luke to unpack some meaningful scripture and spiritually feed our faith. Here's the lineup:

- November 30 Mid-Week Advent 1: Let Us Go to Bethlehem and Find the Faith of Christmas
- December 7 Mid-Week Advent 2: Let Us Go to Bethlehem and Find the Promise of Christmas
- December 14 Mid-Week Advent 3: Let Us Go to Bethlehem and Find the Peace of Christmas
- December 21 Mid-Week Advent 4: Let Us Go to Bethlehem and Find the Christ of Christmas

I know it may sound like you are adding one more thing to an already crazy season – but taking time for ourselves and our faith life actually puts Advent and Christmas in perspective. Personally, I love singing the beautiful music from Holden Evening Prayer as it brings some peace into the core of my being. Spending some time hearing God's word and exploring what it means for us gives us the opportunity for God to speak in our lives. And sharing the fellowship of a short worship service brings us closer to each other.

So please join me in our mid-week Advent series. And then cap off the season by joining us for Christmas Eve services on December 24 at either 4:00 p.m., 8:30 p.m. or 11:00 p.m.. May God's blessings be with you as you prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS—November 2022

- Council reviewed the proposed 2023 budget that will be presented at the Annual Meeting on November 13, 2022.
- The Northampton Food Bank sent a note thanking the congregation for the donation of \$2495.38 which was half of the proceeds of the Fall Basket Social. The other half of the proceeds was intended for Hope's Good Samaritan Fund.
- The Christmas Eve Worship schedule will include three worship services at 4:00 p.m., 8:30 p.m. and 11:00 p.m.. There will be one service on Christmas Day at 9:00 a.m.
- Council approved the move to begin live-streaming of worship services which will begin as soon as all the pieces are in place and AV people are trained.
- The October finances for the congregation showed that expenses for the month exceeded our income and left us with a deficit of \$12,106.57 and for the year expenses exceeded our income with a deficit of \$15,006.31. Council encourages members to continue their generosity through the end of the year.
- The Sunday School Christmas program will be held during the 10:30 worship service on Sunday, December 18.
- First Holy Communion classes will begin in January. Information letters will be mailed to 5th grade students.
- There will be no Sunday School on December 25 and January 1.

THE JESSE TREE

The Jesse Tree tradition is rooted in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of David, Israel's greatest king. And Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree. Each symbol represents a story from within this family tree and a step toward the birth of Jesus.

As part of our journey through Advent each day a volunteer places a symbol on the Jesse Tree in the narthex. The symbol represents someone on Jesus's family tree. A scripture and prayer are included on the back of each symbol for a brief devotion before placing the symbol on the macramé tree. Please see the sign-up sheet on the bulletin board when you enter the sanctuary to sign-up for a day.





SUMMARY:

Expenses exceeded income in the Regular Fund for the month of October by \$12,106.57, and for the year 2022, expenses exceeded income by \$15,006.31, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$230,322.88. Last year the net income for the same period was \$37,072.90 (which included PPP Loan Forgiveness of \$36,872.23) with a balance of \$225,419.60.
