
with doing what's popular rather than doing what's right.

Our group typically budgets around \$1,500 per person to go on this trip. It is through the generous support of you, our church family, that we have been able to send so many young people to this life-changing

event. Our youth are the future of our church and we appreciate your commitment and generosity towards helping to grow our youth programs. We hope and pray that our loving congregation will continue to show their support for our young people in our future endeavors.


We will resume classes on January 8, 2023. Have a wonderful New Year!

#### **BOOK BUDDIES**

The next books we will read are *Verity* (\$11.25) by Colleen Hoover and *The Screwtape Letters* (\$10.00) by C.S. Lewis. We will meet January 23 at 1 and 7 and February 23 at 1 and 7.

**<u>Verity</u>**: Lowen Ashleigh is a struggling writer on the brink of financial ruin when she accepts the job offer of a lifetime. Jeremy Crawford, husband of bestselling author Verity Crawford, has hired Lowen to complete the remaining books in a successful series his injured wife is unable to finish.



Lowen arrives at the Crawford home, ready to sort through years of Verity's notes and outlines, hoping to find enough material to get her started. What Lowen doesn't expect to uncover in the chaotic office is an unfinished autobiography Verity never intended for anyone to read. Page after page of bone-chilling admissions, including Verity's recollection of what really happened the day her daughter died.

Lowen decides to keep the manuscript hidden from Jeremy, knowing its contents would devastate the already grieving father. But as Lowen's feelings for Jeremy begin to intensify, she recognizes all the ways she could benefit if he were to read his wife's words. After all, no matter how devoted Jeremy is to his injured wife, a truth this horrifying would make it

impossible for him to continue to love her.

<u>The Screwtape Letters</u> is a classic masterpiece of religious satire that entertains readers with its sly and ironic portrayal of human life and foibles from the vantage point of Screwtape, a highly placed assistant to "Our Father Below." At once wildly comic, deadly serious, and strikingly original, C.S. Lewis's The Screwtape Letters is the most engaging account of temptation—and triumph over it—ever written.

You have three ways to help address food insecurity in our community through avenues here at Hope. You will find in the narthex three places to contribute non-perishable food items.

If you choose to contribute to the **Northampton Area Food Bank** place your items in the wagon. #### SUMMARY:

Income exceeded expenses in the Regular Fund for the month of November by \$1,279.15, and for the year 2022, expenses exceeded income by \$13,727.16, giving us a current balance in the Regular Fund of \$231,973.53. Last year the net income for the same period was \$33,831.05 (which included PPP Loan Forgiveness of \$36,872.23) with a balance of \$222,177.75.
