





must admit that when I shared with the Council my intention of retiring from full-time ministry at the end of August of this year it sounded like a very long

Greetings from the Pastor:

time away. But August 31st is creeping up very quickly with much to do before that date arrives. Let me share a little bit about how we will move forward as a

congregation.

I have met with the Bishop regarding our transition here at Hope. The goal is for Hope to hire an interim pastor to help bridge the time from my retirement until Hope calls a new pastor. As you may or may not know, in our synod and across the church there are more pastoral vacancies than there are ordained ministers to fill them. What this means is that Hope's call process could take a while. In fact, the average turn-around time for congregations in our synod can be two to three years - depending on the availability of ordained ministers who match the needs of Hope's congregation. Sometime this summer the Bishop and his associate for our area, Rev. Samantha Drennan, will meet with the council to discuss next steps. In the meantime, the council and I are working through what needs to be done prior to my leaving.

Rest assured – Hope is in good hands. We have strong Council leadership to guide the congregation through the call process and many interested and active volunteers to work with an interim pastor

when he or she arrives. Hope's worship will continue to run smoothly under the music direction of Dave Ziegler and the leadership of Hope's team of Assisting Ministers as well as the many, many volunteers who offer their time each Sunday to greet, usher, lector, prepare the altar, serve as communion assistants, and video techs. The staff at Hope is dedicated and driven to work through the transition and keep the congregation informed. We are blessed - so do not be anxious about this change.


Finally, I will say this. With my retirement, my pastoral relationship with the members of Hope Lutheran Church will come to an end. I treasure the privilege you have given me to serve as your pastor these past 14 years, but now those responsibilities will belong to your interim pastor and then to your next regularly called pastor. While friendships established during my ministry can and will continue, it is no longer appropriate for me to do any pastoral functions within the congregation or for its members. Therefore, if you ask, I will say, "No." This answer comes from my respect for the integrity of the congregation, for the ministry of the pastors who will be serving you, for the professional ethics of the vocation I love, and for the policies of the church.

There are still two more months for us to do ministry together! So - let's have fun being the hands and feet of Jesus in our small portion of the world!!!


Relearn to Pray


