

Good News for Seniors Over 70.5! A Tax-Free Gift With Your IRA Rollover

If you're looking for a way to reduce your taxable income from your IRA while making a meaningful contribution to Hope Lutheran Church, then the IRA charitable rollover is an excellent option to consider! By making a tax-free gift to our ministries through your IRA, you can satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution without increasing your Federal income taxes. Even though you won't get an income tax charitable deduction for the gift, you won't have to pay taxes on your IRA withdrawal either. This means that the IRA charitable rollover is a tax-reducing and tax-free way to make a gift to our church.



If you're 70.5 years of age or older, you can instruct your IRA administrator to transfer your gift directly from your Traditional or Roth IRA account to Hope Lutheran Church. We can put your gift to use right away in providing financial support to our ministries throughout the Church. By choosing to make an IRA charitable rollover gift to Hope Lutheran, you'll not only be supporting our ministry but also reducing your taxable income, making it a win-win situation for everyone involved.

However, there are several requirements that you need to keep in mind before making such a gift. Firstly, the gift must come from a Traditional IRA or Roth IRA account, and not from other retirement accounts such as 401(k) or 403(b) Plans. Additionally, the gift check must come directly from your IRA administrator to the designated charity, in this case, Hope Lutheran Church.

It is also important to note that the total IRA charitable rollover gifts in any one year cannot exceed \$100,000, and the gift can count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) if you have not already taken your RMD for the year you make your gift. Furthermore, the gift from your IRA will be excluded from your taxable income, but it will not be available as an income tax charitable deduction. PROPERTY/PARSONAGE UPDATE



Dear members of Hope Lutheran church community,

We are excited to announce that our parsonage has been leased for \$1,600 per month plus utilities. The new tenant has been qualified by the leasing company we use for the parsonage and is expected to move in within the next 30 days. We are confident that this tenant will be a great addition to our community.

As you may know, since the departure of our long-time tenant in August 2023, we have spent approximately \$11,000 on improvements to the property. This money was spent on replacing the carpet, painting the interior, cleaning the interior, completing miscellaneous repairs, pumping out the septic tank, general maintenance of the property, and fuel oil. We want to remind everyone that the money for these and future expenses comes out of our Building Fund and not the Church's operating budget/cash flow.

The **BUILDING FUND** is funded by either direct envelope contributions or fundraisers held by the church. We appreciate all of your contributions to this fund and want to assure you that your money is being used wisely to maintain our parsonage and make it a comfortable home for our tenants.

Please note that the leasing company is the intermediary between the church and the tenant. The tenants first contact with any concerns/issues is the leasing company, and the church is charged a monthly fee for this service. Thank you for your continued support and contributions to our Building Fund!

2024 YOUTH GROUP VALENTINE'S DINNER



There, Pheby is exposed not just to her Jailer's cruelty but also to his contradictions. To survive, Pheby will have to outwit him, and she soon faces the ultimate sacrifice.




