

We are still in Lent as we begin the month of March, but quickly the 40 days of Lent will come to a close. How did your Lent go? Were you able to stick to any disciplines of Lent-fasting, prayer, repentance? I usually try to spend some time in Lent rereading the Bible, at least the New Testament during the 40 days.

40 is mentioned in the Bible over 145 times. Ezekiel, Noah, Moses, and Jesus all have the number 40 in relation to a story about him. (Those interested in numerology look for special 'secret' meanings to numbers, I do not hold to this practice). With that said, 40 seems to be a number used for testing or trial. If you remember, Jesus went into the desert with fasting, meditation and reflection. That is most likely we practice these disciplines during 40 days of Lent. So, for these 30 days left in March until Easter, I encourage you to practice the discipline of reading!

I urge you to continue or to restart your reading of the Bible. If you read roughly 4



chapters of the New Testament a day for 30 days, you will almost read all of the 39 books of the New Testament! If you didn't start reading in Lent, why not start now and continue into the days of Easter (50 days from the Resurrection to the Ascension). I know you can complete it!

Today, there are so many programs online to help as we set out to read the Bible. Printing a daily reading schedule divided by dates or a schedule with boxes to check, helps us to monitor our progress. For those with cell phones, a Bible reading can be texted or emailed daily. (*I* have printed some of these reading helps and put them in the narthex for those who desire).

In 2005, the ELCA began efforts to help Lutherans know their Bibles a little better. As a pastor, I continue to try and do my part by bringing the Bible lessons into sermons and writings, but each of us can do our part and read. For the last week in March, a great read is the passion story of Jesus. It includes the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the cleansing of the temple, anointing, Last Supper, agony, arrest, trials, crucifixion, death, burial. Matthew (Matthew 21:1-17, 26-27). That's a lot for one week but so important! Then when we share the Gospel lesson of his great resurrection, we get it! The astonishment and the glory will fill our hearts and minds!




But that's not all! After the party, the children will be participating in the Palm Sunday processional at the 10:30 AM service. They will remain with their classes






YOUTH GROUP UPDATES





A Higher Call by Adam Makos Wed, March 27 at 1 PM Submit questions to <u>Abby White</u>

December, 1943: A badly damaged American bomber struggles to fly over wartime Germany. At the controls is twenty-one-year-old Second Lieutenant Charlie Brown. Half his crew lay wounded or dead on this, their first mission. Suddenly, a Messerschmitt fighter pulls up on the bomber's tail. The pilot is German ace Franz Stigler—and he can destroy the young American crew with the squeeze of a trigger...

What happened next would defy imagination and later be called "the most incredible encounter between enemies in World War II."

The U.S. 8th Air Force would later classify what happened between them as "top secret." It was an act that Franz could never mention for fear of facing a firing squad. It was the encounter that would haunt both Charlie and Franz for forty years until, as old men, they would search the world for each other, a last mission that could change their lives forever.

Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sundrenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is overwhelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of—the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism, The Women is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.


