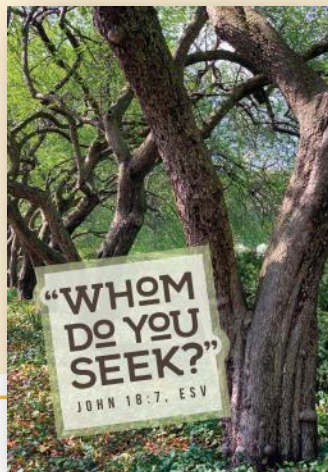

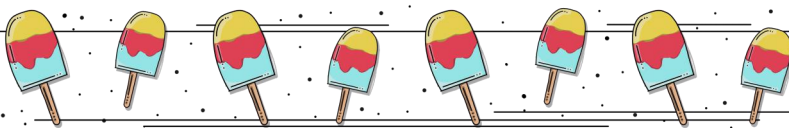
We are excited to invite all Youth Gathering participants to the last meeting on Sunday, **June 9th** from 1pm to 3pm in Kuntz Hall.

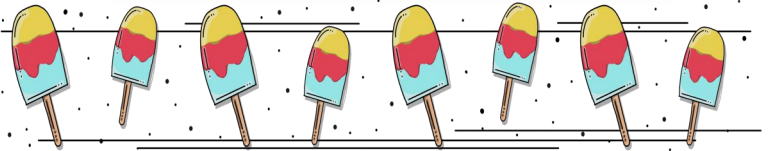

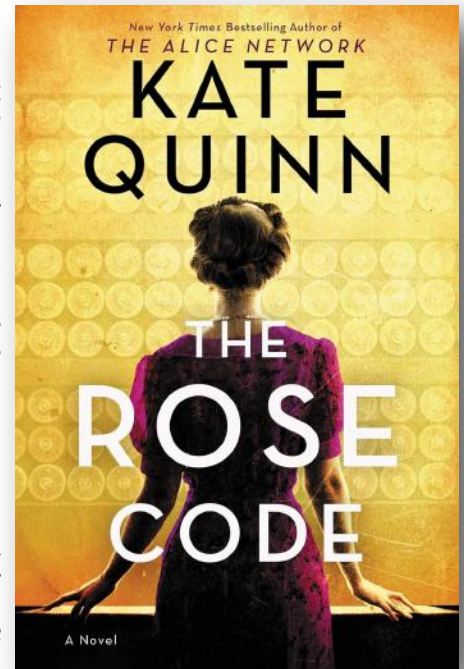

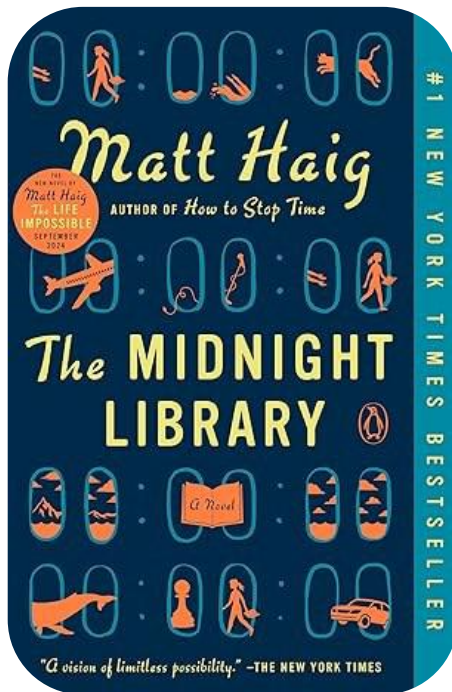
The Rose Code

1940. 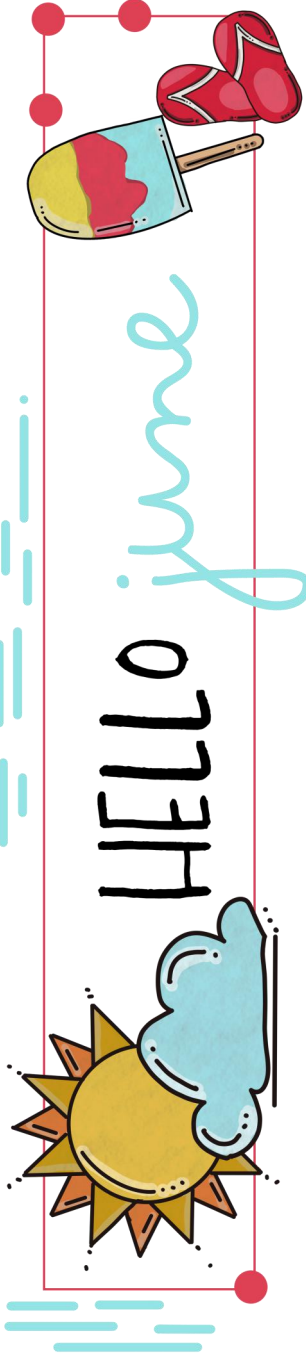

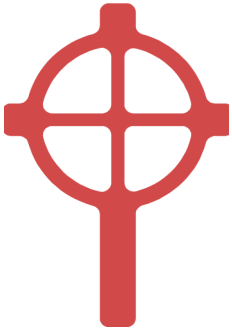

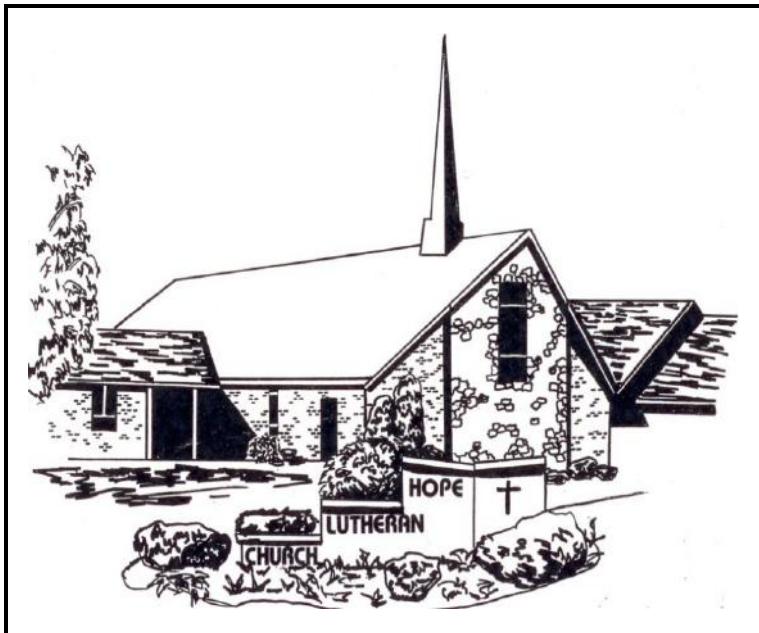
