A Message from the Interim Pastor:

In the past few months, I have had numerous questions concerning the seasons or church calendar. What does it mean? Why do we have them? Does it help us?

Basically, the church calendar follows the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Order is helpful for all that we do in the church and the schedule of readings and calendar helps us remain orderly. There are what is called 'Principal Festivals' like Christmas, Sundays after Easter for example. And there are lesser festivals and commemorations like the Presentation of Our Lord, days of the apostles. We change the colors in the church based on what the season of the church calendar happens to be. The days have theological emphasis, different prayers, readings and those colors for the church paraments. Some Sunday, sit in church and familiar yourself with the church calendar as listed in the front part of the hymnal.

Another thing to remember is that our church follows the New Revised Lectionary from where we get our weekly readings.

The years are named A, B, C. We are currently in year C. Many denominations follow the Revised Lectionary. It is a three-year rotation and follows the church calendar. The readings for Advent, Lent,

etc. are specific year to year. The lectionary allows congregations a balanced readings of many parts of the Bible. The readings are readily available online or available from the church office. The Old Testament readings are selective and not all of the books are included (about 4% is included). About 41% of the New Testament is heard in worship during the 3 year cycle. That goes to say, we can always read the scripture at our homes and read more of the Bible!

The calendar includes daily readings and if you want some reading for the summer, try the following: Proverbs, Ephesians, Isaiah 56, 57, 59, Job 18, 19, 24, Jeremiah, Zechariah, Joshua, Genesis 12,13,14, 41 and Esther. This will help to fill in some of the gaps from the lectionary.

Meanwhile, summer seems like the longest part of the church calendar. After June 15 (*this year*) the lectionary includes readings for 'after Pentecost' until Reformation Sunday on October 26. Then we start again with All Saints Sunday, Christ the King Sunday until we start the church calendar again at Advent. I personally like using the lectionary which chooses our readings for specific days of the church calendar. Not only does it help to organize our worship time and themes, it gives a focus for the Sunday in the calendar.

PASTORAL CANDIDATE SELECTION

Dear Members of Hope Lutheran Church,

As you know, our congregation is in the midst of preparing to call a new Pastor. The Call Committee and the Congregational Council would like to offer each of you the opportunity to participate in this important decision in the life of the congregation.

On June 1, 2025, we ask for your attendance as the candidate for the Pastoral position will preach at both the 8 am and 10:30 am worship services. A congregational meeting will be held after each service wherein voting members of Hope Lutheran Church will vote either yes or no for this candidate. This letter will serve as legally required notification of an upcoming congregational meeting and election to choose a permanent Pastor for Hope Lutheran Church on June 1, 2025 after each service. A member of the staff of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod will be present to guide us through this process and the vote to offer the call.

The Finance Committee budgeted \$112,600.00 for the Senior Pastor position and package in 2023. We will be budgeting \$118,019.00 for the Pastor position to end 2025.

Here is the schedule of events for that process:

- + On Sunday, June 1st the candidate will lead worship and preach a trial sermon at both the 8:00 am and 10:30 am services.
- + "Meet and Greet" will be held between services. This will be an informal opportunity for you to meet the candidate. We encourage you to attend.
- + A congregation meeting will be called and, after each service, voting members will be able to cast a single ballot. Constitutionally, no absentee ballots are permitted. Following the 10:30 AM service ballots will be tabulated and election results will be announced.
- + According to the constitution C8. 02c **"Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months."**

Your attendance at worship and participation in the election process on June 1st is a privilege and we strongly encourage you to be present and have a voice as we move forward in ministry in Jesus' name. We sincerely hope that as many members as possible will attend and participate in the determination of the future of our congregation.

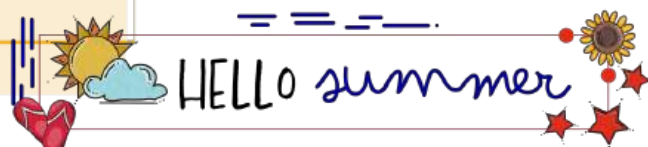

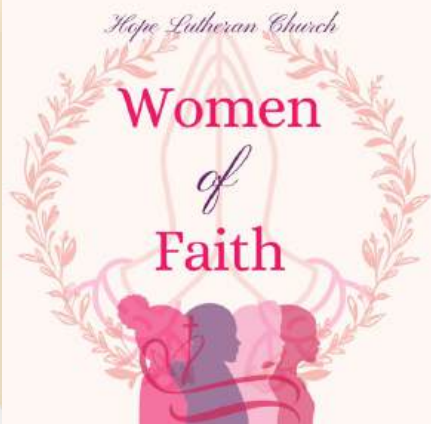

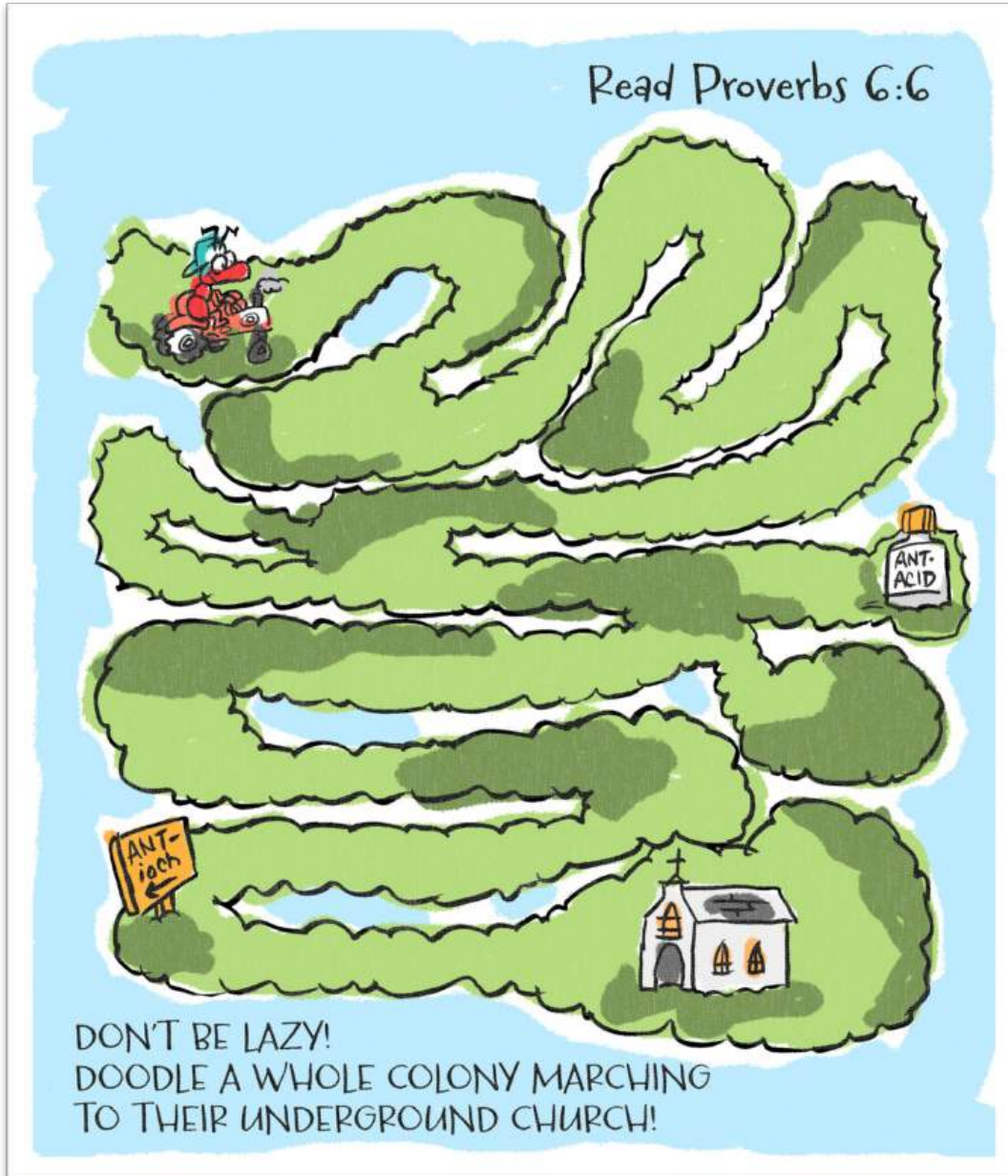

- Crayons or paint



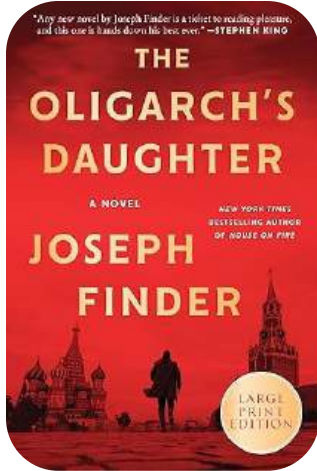
What you do:

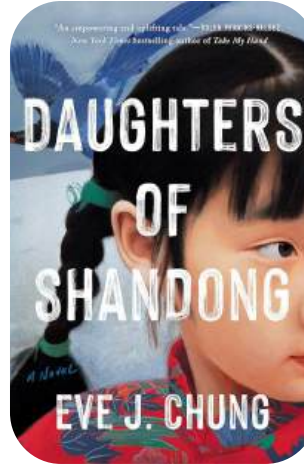

Daughters of Shandong

A propulsive, extraordinary novel about a mother and her daughters' harrowing escape to Taiwan as the Communist revolution sweeps through China, by debut author Eve J. Chung, based on her family's story

Daughters are the Ang family's curse.

In 1948, civil war ravages the Chinese countryside, but in rural Shandong, the wealthy, land-owning Angs are more concerned with their lack of an heir. Hai is the eldest of four girls and spends her days looking after her sisters. Headstrong Di, who is just a year younger, learns to hide in plain sight, and their mother—abused by the family for failing to birth a boy—finds her own small acts of rebellion in the kitchen. As the Communist army closes in on their town, the rest of the prosperous household flees, leaving behind the girls and their mother because they view them as useless mouths to feed.

Without an Ang male to punish, the land-seizing cadres choose Hai, as the eldest child, to stand trial for her family's crimes. She barely survives their brutality. Realizing the worst is yet to come, the women plan their escape. Starving and penniless but resourceful, they forge travel permits and embark on a thousand-mile journey to confront the family that abandoned them.

From the countryside to the bustling city of Qingdao, and onward to British Hong Kong and eventually Taiwan, they witness the changing tide of a nation and the plight of multitudes caught in the wake of revolution. But with the loss of their home and the life they've known also comes new freedom—to take hold of their fate, to shake free of the bonds of their gender, and to claim their own story.

Told in assured, evocative prose, with impeccably drawn characters, *Daughters of Shandong* is a hopeful, powerful story about the resilience of women in war; the enduring love between mothers, daughters, and sisters; and the sacrifices made to lift up future generations.

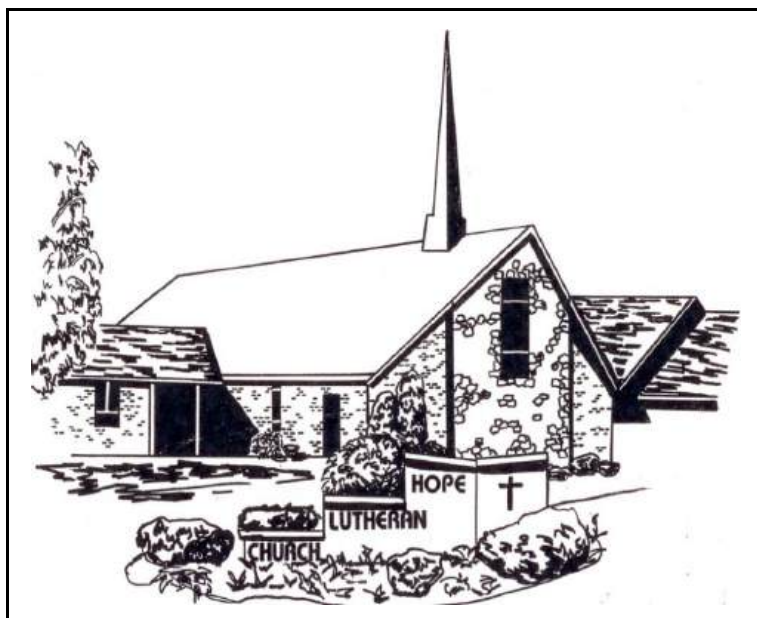
