-Matthew 16:15

heologian Diana Butler Bass in her book <u>Freeing Jesus</u> discusses our misconceptions and preconceived notions of who Jesus is as a Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Way and Presence. So often we try to fit Jesus into a one-size-fits-all box and forget that our understanding and experiences of Jesus can change over the years. One can find themselves afraid to speak about the "Jesus Christ of experience."

She writes, "We are all different people, with different stories, differing religious traditions, from different cultures and places. But these days, Christians shy away from telling stories of Jesus. There is no denying that Christians often speak of Jesus badly-in exclusive, hurtful, and triumphal ways...yet I love sharing stories; and I love listening to others' stories. There is a way-maybe even the way-we can live together in this diverse and divided world - learning from each other's stories. Even stories of Jesus."

We are all starting a journey together, as I begin my ministry with all of you here at Hope. Similar to what Diana expresses in her book, there are a lot of ways you all see "Pastor." Being in ministry for over fifty years, you have experienced many leaders in this place and might have ideas of what a pastor should be. We can all describe a pastor's role differently and have our own stories of their impact. Jesus asks the question of the disciples, "Who do you say that I am?"

I ask this of you today – not to get a quick response, but to invite you into our joint story for the future. For we will have our own experiences together. I am sure I'll do things a little differently than those who have held this ministry before. I will ask the why behind things, I will perhaps challenge your ideas of Jesus, and I will be honest and caring along the way. Change can be hard, but as followers of Christ we all journey this life together listening to each other's stories, our experiences of the divine, and our need for community.

I am excited for what is to come as I walk alongside all of you in ministry and mission here at Hope. Don't be afraid to tell your stories of faith and Jesus, of struggle and spirit. I am here to listen, to serve, and to do life with you in this diverse and divided world.

May Jesus' expansive love and compassion guide us into the future,

6:00-7:30 PM. We'll kick off the year with a funfilled Game Night and dinner together.





### **NEXT UP IN BOOK BUDDIES**



In June 1917, General John Pershing arrived in France to establish American forces in Europe. He immediately found himself unable to communicate with troops in the field. Pershing needed telephone operators who could swiftly and accurately connect multiple calls, speak fluent French and English, remain steady under fire, and be utterly discreet, since the calls often conveyed classified information.

Switchboard Soldiers by Jennifer Chiaverini Wednesday, Sept. 24 at 1 PM Submit questions to Leslie Daniel

At the time, nearly all well-trained American telephone operators were women—but women were not permitted to enlist, or even to vote in most states. Nevertheless, the U.S. Army Signal Corps promptly began recruiting them.

More than 7,600 women responded, including Grace Banker of New Jersey, a switchboard instructor with AT&T and an alumna of Barnard College; Marie Miossec, a Frenchwoman and aspiring opera singer; and Valerie DeSmedt, a twenty-year-old Pacific Telephone operator from Los Angeles, determined to strike a blow for her native Belgium.

They were among the first women sworn into the U.S. Army under the Articles of War. The male soldiers they had replaced had needed one minute to connect each call. The switchboard soldiers could do it in ten seconds

Deployed throughout France, including near the front lines, the operators endured hardships and risked death or injury from gunfire, bombardments, and the Spanish Flu. Not all of them would survive.

The women of the U.S. Army Signal Corps served with honor and played an essential role in achieving the Allied victory. Their story has never been the focus of a novel...until now.

FALL CHOIR SEASON is upon us and the Senior and Junior choirs resume regular weekly rehearsals on Thursday, September 11<sup>th</sup>. The Senior (adult) choir rehearses at 7 PM and sings weekly at worship services. Members have their choice of service and may sing early, late or both services. Our Junior (children's) Choir rehearses at 6 PM and typically sings twice a month. Any child who can read English may join the choir.

Their singing schedule is decided by the applicability of their anthems to the Sunday lessons. Schedules are published in advance. The ability to read music is not required for either choir. Anthems are rehearsed several weeks in advance of their scheduled service providing ample time to learn by repetition. Senior Choir members should contact the **Director** Music with their intentions to join to ensure music is available. Junior Choir parents may sign up their children using the on-line form found on under Organizawebsite tions —> Youth Ministries.

### TUNED UP FOR FALL: CHOIR, ORCHESTRA, AND MUSICAL

THE CHURCH ORCHESTRA typically plays four (4) services per year: Easter, Pentecost, Reformation or All Saints, and Christmas Eve. Musicians must have a minimum of 2 years' playing experience. Participation is by date; you may play one, several or all scheduled dates. Orchestra members are surveyed in advance of each scheduled service to determine their participation. Music selections are based upon participation, instrumentation and ability and many times is customized for the ensemble. There are three to five rehearsals for each service spread over several weeks. Contact the **Director of Music** to place your email on our distribution list. We will contact you when we organize the next service. We have several instruments available for short- or long-term loan or for use when students forget instruments in school. For information on the instrumental loan program, contact the Director of Music.

We are getting all **FIRED UP!** for our **BIENNIAL CHURCH MUSICAL** with some new developments in the works for 2026. Music is taught throughout the year at our weekly rehearsals. Staging is added in January or February at Sunday rehearsals in preparation for an early June performance.

In addition to the singers and performers, the musical requires a lot of behind-thescenes help. Assistance can be in advance preparation such as costumes and scenery, rehearsal assistants, AV crew, lighting crew, tech crew or stage crew which is typically engaged 1 - 2 months before the production.
