A Message from the Pastor:

"BLESSED are we..."
-Matthew 5:1-11

don't know about you, but I still question each morning if I should open that app or browser on my phone, turn on the television, or open a newspaper. What will we collectively see, hear, or experience?

It's a hard world we live in and the more connected we feel to it or information that flows into us is truly what makes it feel that way. We are living in a time of collective grief. What should be prayed for today that might make some sort of difference tomorrow? I hold my daughters tight each evening as I put them to sleep knowing that they live this life too, no matter how much I try to protect them. They read my sad and worried face each day. My oldest even asks great questions that are sometimes too painful to answer. So, what do we do in this time of collective grief?

Author Kate Bowler in her book *The Lives We Actually Have* has a blessing just for it that echoes the cries from Matthew's Sermon on the Mount.

"BLESSED ARE WE WHO TRY TO SEE THINGS CLEARLY, THOUGH THE TRUTH OF IT FEELS UNIMASINABLE. BLESSED ARE WE WHO ASK AND WAIT, AND ASK ASAIN, FOR ANSWERS THAT MAY NOT COME, FOR HOPE THAT SEEMS HARD TO FIND, FOR COMFORT THAT IS NOT EASILY OFFERED."

Bowler reminds us that Jesus' life and ministry echoes our here and now and Jesus during it all gave blessings amid grief. Blessed are the poor in spirit, the mourning, the hungry, the merciful- for God has you and always will.

Jesus' blessings are not some light-hearted quips, but a deeply rooted offering of love and trust. This world can feel broken but not broken enough to leave it without a blessing. Blessed are we who have God present in our struggles and joys. Blessed are we when others reach out in care and compassion, being God's image to us. So, if you are grieving today, know you're not alone and hear this final blessing from Kate for a world struggling, but hoping together.







#### **CELEBRATE REFORMATION SUNDAY**






**ALL SAINTS SUNDAY**


